CHAIRMANS REPORT 2024 - 2025

During the 24–25 fiscal year, our charity continued operating from Dukes House in central Slough, which remained a functional base despite the building's dilapidations.

The food share operation ran smoothly overall, with the collections of surplus food coming from local sources including, Waitrose, Coop, Tesco, M&S Foodstores, Lidl, Gate Gourmet railway supplies, Costa and many others.

Our teams of multi-faith volunteer packers (a different faith each night) continued to regularly support us by sorting and packing our delivery van, driven by different volunteers each morning, to local charities, a homeless hostel, homeless day centre, two YMCA's and a few churches. We also had a small team of daytime volunteers who were collecting furniture etc and delivering to homeless guests given a room by Slough Council, Macmillan Cancer charity and The Prisoner Release Scheme.

We operated out of St Joseph's Church in Chalfont St Peter, Gerrards Cross for the preparation of soup, tea and sandwiches, which were then delivered to approximately 200 homeless guests in London every Monday throughout the year, by a rota of volunteers. We are grateful to have a loyal and invaluable team who have been preparing these food parcels from St Josephs for many years.

We were also grateful to receive Harvest Festival food donations from three local schools, St Josephs Primary, Maltmans Green and Thorpe House, which we were able to pass on to those in need.

Our fundraising event this year was a charity Dawn Walk held at Dorney Lake. The event was sponsored by British Airways and Hamptons and was attended by approx 100 early morning walkers, raising just over £25,000, for which we were very grateful.

We continued to work closely with Slough Borough Councils Rough Sleeper Team, providing support the Council cannot offer to guests who are ineligible for financial assistance, in addition to exploring additional ways to help meet the growing needs of Slough's increasing homeless population.

We accepted an invitation to participate in the British Airways Better World Sustainability Fair hosting a stall to showcase our charity to BA staff by sharing flyers and branded pens. The event generated strong engagement, with many staff choosing to use their charity allowance to support us.

At Christmas, in addition to the London Run Street party, we hosted a Christmas lunch for the local homeless at Slough Football Club. Grateful thanks went to SFC for hosting the venue, BA, Bidfoods and Costa coffee for their food donations and Lord Barbers who gave their time providing haircuts and shaves to the homeless guests.

We remain a fully volunteer-run charity with no paid staff and no external funding, relying entirely on the dedication of our incredible volunteers — without them, we simply wouldn't exist. Our significant cost is maintaining our vehicles, which are essential to delivering our services.

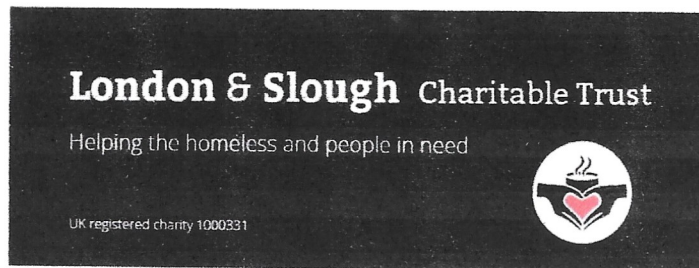

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT 2024

London & Slough Charitable Trust had its third year at Dukes House and British Land have now granted us a further three years until 2027, rent free.

Our operations from Dukes House are working well with the collections of surplus food from many sources, local Waitroses, Coop, M & S Foodstores, Lidl, Gate Gourmet railway supplies, Costa and many others.

We have many teams of Multi-faith volunteer packers (a different faith each night) who sort and pack our van for delivery, driven by different volunteers each morning, to an average of six delivery kitchens etc. We are very lucky that they are so dedicated. The Charity could not exist without any of our volunteers. Still no-one is paid.

We also rely on a small group of other volunteers who collect furniture etc and deliver to homeless guests who have been given a room by Slough Council, Macmillan Cancer charity and The Prisoner Release Scheme.

We still use St Joseph's Church premises in Chalfont St Peter, Gerrards Cross, every Monday throughout the year, for the preparation of soup, tea and sandwiches, which are then delivered to our approx 200 homeless guests in London. We have a loyal team who have been preparing these food parcels for many years, for which we are very grateful.

We will be launching our 40th Anniversary this year with a Dawn Walk, which will also raise funds with the sponsorship by British Airways, Hamptons Agency, The McGovern family and others, for which we are grateful.

Our disappointment this year, has been that we have not been able to open a 10 bedroom hostel in Herschel Street, in Slough, for which the Government Levelling Up Fund had given London and Slough Charitable trust the funds to renovate, upgrade and furnish these premises and house 10 homeless guests.

This did not come about, even though we had fully furnished the property and provided an office cabin in the grounds, so we could fully take over the building at the end of March 31st 2024. Due to Slough Council inability to agree to the terms of the Government Contract, they reneged on the deal in the last few days and we had to back out and give the Government back the building funds and Slough Council to repay us our costs. What is worse is, that the building still lies empty.

Our aim was to help our guests by giving them a place to stay for a period of three to six months whilst they look for a job and move into their own private accommodation. Our objective is to assist approx. 40 guests a year through this programme.

However we still work closely with Slough Borough Council's Rough Sleeper team to provide support that the Council are unable to, due to the guests not being eligible for financial support or help. We are looking at further ways we can assist the ever increasing numbers of homeless in Slough.

We wish to thank Nuala Fox, our secretary and Trustee, for her unstinting help over the last 30 years. We would not be where we are without help and guidance.

The Trustees are regular 'hands on' helpers within the day to day running of the Charity and we continue to be grateful to our volunteers for giving up their time and their selfless and tireless work in support of our most vulnerable and marginalised people in society.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT 2023

We have changed the name of the Charity slightly from **The London and Slough Run** to “**London and Slough Charitable Trust**” because the old name was giving the misperception, that we were a charity supporting running activities.

We decided to change the name but still keep the well established logo and strapline, and launch in time for our 40th Anniversary in 2024.

London and Slough Charitable Trust had it's second year in Dukes House and has expanded its operations fulfilling the local needs of the homeless and those in need. British Land have extended the period of use until January 2025 and on the same terms - rent free.

We still use St Joseph's Church premises in Chalfont St Peter, Gerrards Cross, every Monday throughout the year, for the preparation of soup, tea and sandwiches, which are then delivered to our approx 200 homeless guests in London. We have a loyal team who have been preparing these food parcels for many years, for which we are very grateful.

Dukes House has been a blessing, because it gives us valuable space to sort the food we receive every night from the local supermarkets, and the capability to store non perishable food which we can receive in bulk.

We also receive furniture for our local community so when our homeless guests obtain a room/flat with no furniture, we can furnish the rooms. We also support the needs of the MacMillan Trust and prisoner release scheme and many other charities.

London and Slough Charitable Trust was not able to run a night shelter this year due to government guidance.

In its place, we have been working with Slough Borough Council, and together with a government grant, we have been able to obtain a local house with 10 bedrooms, communal kitchens and bathrooms. This grant is to fund the upgrade of the accommodation and we anticipate taking over the building in February 2024, on an initial three year contract. Our aim is to help our guests by giving them a place to stay for a period of three to six months whilst they look for a job and move into their own private accommodation. Our objective is to assist approx. 40 guests a

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT 2022

The London and Slough Run (LASR) had its first full year's occupancy in Dukes House, Wellington Street, Slough. The Charity partnered with British Land in July 2021 and were granted the use of Duke's House in central Slough as a large central location to move operations to. The lease is over three years and is rent free.

We still use St Joseph's Church halls in Chalfont St Peter, Gerrard's Cross for the preparation of soup, sandwiches etc every Monday for the run to London feeding up to 250 guests on Monday evenings.

The property at Dukes House has enabled LASR to expand its food share activity together with the collection and delivery of furniture and electrical goods to help those in need, specifically those who have been given a room by the Council housing dept as the first step to a new life off the streets.

Surplus food is still collected daily from a number of local supermarkets and then packaged ready for immediate distribution to over a dozen local Charities. Development of the food share program started at the outset of the pandemic and has been very successful in growing since there are many more people in need.

LASR did not operate any Night Shelter again this year, due to the Government guidance.

Our long standing chairman of approx. 10 years, John Power, resigned due to work commitments abroad, and we are grateful for all his sterling work setting up the night shelter and steering LASR into the recognised charity it has now become. John Goudie took over temporary Chairmanship for six months, but will be moving on in the near future.





TRUSTEES REPORT 2021

The London and Slough Run (LASR) had a very busy year in 2021. The Charity partnered with British Land in July 2021 and were granted the use of Duke's House in central Slough as a large central location to move operations to. The lease is over three years and is rent free. We are very grateful to St Joseph's Gerrard's Cross for the use of their social club and Church hall during 2020/21. The property at Dukes house has enabled LASR to expand it's food share activity. Surplus food is collected daily from a number of local supermarkets and then packaged ready for immediate distribution to over a dozen local Charities. Development of the food share program started at the outset of the pandemic and has been very successful. LASR Trustee Malcolm Johnstone was awarded the High Sheriff of Berkshire's volunteer award 2021.

LASR did not operate a Night shelter in 2021 because of the difficulty with Covid restrictions and because numbers of rough sleepers were much lower than normal. This was due in large part to the success of the government's "Everyone in" scheme in 2020 which had helped to house a number of rough sleepers in Slough. Those who were in need were offered Hotel and B&B accommodation.

LASR continue to operate a weekly soup run to London Waterloo and Temple feeding up to 250 people a night. This is undertaken by a long standing and dedicated volunteer team of sandwich makers, packers and 'Runners' based at St Joseph's Gerrard's Cross and all precautions are employed to ensure a Covid secure service is in place.

LASR had leased two properties in Slough which accommodated 6 rough sleepers. LASR took care of all household bills and supply of food to those accommodated and helped with finding employment and private accommodation. The leases came to an end in November 2021 with the final two occupants being housed elsewhere with the help of SBC's outreach team.

The Trustees agreed to finance a new website for LASR as the existing hosting platform is now outdated and proving difficult to use. Our social media presence is growing and all felt it would be prudent to invest in a new website to promote the charity, share news, events, volunteer opportunities, donation links and more.

LASR partnered with Rotary Club of Windsor St George to organise a fundraising Christmas Carol Service at the chapel in Eton College, in December. This special event was to be hosted by Gloria Hunniford with Sue Holderness and The Carice Singers – unfortunately due to the exponential spread of the Omicron variant of Covid in the week to 18th Dec, the organising team felt they had no option but to cancel the event. Thankfully most of the sponsors and advertisers and some ticket holders donated their monies and as a result, LASR received £3,000. Plans are underway to secure a date in Dec 2022 to hopefully run the event again.


2021 saw the resignations of three Trustees, Brian Kearney, Neil McCathie and longstanding Trustee Philip Highy, who has worked tirelessly for the charity and provided an essential connection to Eton College, who have been a historical supporter of LASR. *After 10 years as Chairman, I have decided to step down due to work commitments. I will remain as a volunteer for LASR.* John Goudie, a long standing volunteer and Trustee has agreed to step in and manage this role for the next six months.

The foodshare and soup runs involve many local volunteers from Christ the Worker C of E Langley, St Augustine's RC Datchet, St Josephs Catholic Church, Gerrards Cross, Slough Baptist Church, Holy Family RC Langley, St Mary's C of E Datchet, St George's C of E Britwell, St Andrews Methodist Church, Our Lady of Peace RC Burnham, the Masjid Al-Jannah and Slough Central Mosques. The Trustees continue to be very grateful to all of them for their selfless and tireless work in support of the most vulnerable and marginalised people in society.


