We think it's safe to say, no one will ever forget 2020. The global pandemic, brought about huge challenges to the group, and a large amount of changes, especially to our shops. We were made to close for large parts of the year, and even after re-opening, the way we work, had to change. We are pleased to report, we met these changes well, and managed to deliver a safe working environment in our two shops, as well as, a safe shopping experience for our customers.

As the lease on the Prestatyn shop was nearing an end, it was decided to close the Prestatyn shop at the end of the year, permanently, and to also conclude the use of the unit at the same time. We would like to thank Mrs Pam Holmes, who managed Prestatyn shop for the year, and also the volunteers who have helped in the shop over many years.

Our Homing and Vetting Officer (Mr Roger Proudlove), obviously had to change the way he worked throughout the year, but continued to offer help and advice when called on, to do so.

The care and share scheme, did not change, and continued to provide our animals, with the care and attention they needed.

As in previous years, we lost a number of our animals, friends, and supporters, but they will always be remembered, and they will be forever in our hearts.

The Rhyl shop, will continue to trade in 2021, and will almost certainly face a number of working challenges. The group will make the adjustments necessary, due to the reduction in income, but be rest assured our animals will continue to receive the care and attention they require.

The committee would like to thank all our volunteers and supporters, for their continued support.

Legal and Administrative Details

Prestatyn & District Animal Welfare Group (P.A.D.A.W.G.) Charity Number: 1002778 are established for the relief of animals suffering from injury, sickness, ill treatment or neglect and in particular (but without anyway limiting the generality of the foregoing) :-

- (i) The provision of rehabilitation and veterinary services and, if necessary, the provision of facilities for the painless destruction of sick and injured animals.
- (ii) The provision of accommodation for unwanted or homeless animals until permanent homes can be found for them.
- (iii) The encouragement of and assistance in educational work to prevent animal suffering and creation of increased awareness by the public of its responsibility towards animals in society.
- (iv) The provision of assistance with the cost of spaying or neutering of animals.
- (v) The provision of care and share facilities for aged and infirm animals.

The constitution and regulations of P.A.D.A.W.G. were approved on 24th April 1991; the charity is an unincorporated association under the control of a management committee.

Responsibilities of the Management Committee





1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The accounts have been prepared on the Receipts and Payments Basis and in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards and the Statements of Recommended Practice for Smaller Charities.

Designated funds

Since the receipt of two bequests in the year ended 31 August 1996, income received by the group in the way of legacy had been designated by the trustees for the purpose of an animal sanctuary. As reported in the 2002 Trustees' report, the group has changed its policy. All general funds, including legacies received without restrictions attaching thereto, will now be used for the relief of animals suffering from injury, sickness, ill treatment or neglect.

I report on the accounts of the group for the year ended 31 December 2020, which are set out on pages 5-8.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and auditors
