The Trustees are pleased to present their report, together with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2024.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland published in October 2019, United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice) and with the requirements of the Charities Act 2011.

TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2024

Foundation:

The Church, which was formed in 1930, was recognized as a branch of The Mother Church, The First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston, Mass, USA on 1 June 1950. The Church is democratic and run by the Members and the Board in accordance with the Church Manual of The First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston, Mass and its own Constitution and Rules.

Principal Object:

The Church's object is to maintain and spread the Truth as set forth in the Bible and interpreted in the Christian Science textbook "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" by Mary Baker Eddy, the Discoverer and Founder of Christian Science.

Review of Financial Management:

The total general income for the year was £429,013 (2023 - £652,270), of which £404,239 was from grants to pay for the redevelopment of the church building. The expenditure was £53,797 (2023 - £105,445) and £758,570 (2023 - £286,761) was spent on the redevelopment of the church building. At 31st December 2024, the church had unrestricted general funds of £265,582 (2023- £291,977) and restricted funds of £1,037,300, (2023-£633,061).

Summary of Activities:

In planning the activities for the year, we kept in mind the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit. The Church held regular services on Sunday mornings and Testimony Meetings on Wednesday evenings. In addition, a Thanksgiving Service was held in November. Services include readings from the Bible and the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures". At the Testimony Meetings and Thanksgiving Service members of the congregation share healings, remarks and experiences resulting from their study and practice of Christian Science. All the services and Testimony Meetings are open to everyone in the local community. There is a Sunday School which meets at the same time as the morning service on a Sunday. This is open to all young people up to the age of 20 and provides an opportunity for them to learn how to apply Biblical teachings to their moral, social and health challenges in daily life. We regularly have three children attending our 'in person' Sunday School. Access to our services, meetings and Sunday School continued to be made available via Zoom to those who were not able to attend in person.

The church services, Sunday School and Reading Room have continued to take place at St Michael's Church of England Infant School, Mickleham whilst the church building has been redeveloped.

The redevelopment continued throughout 2024 with the Trustees taking possession from the builder ME&C Creative Ltd on the 13th December 2024. The church redevelopment is being financially supported by two Christian Science charities, The Christian Science Trust in Great Britain (Trust Brit), and The Westminster Fund. Invoices from the building contractor up to the value of £404,239 have been reimbursed by these charities during 2024.

There was a Reading Room adjoining the Church which was open to all members of the community until August 2023. Since vacating the church building, we continue to maintain some of the services of the Reading Room at our meetings and services in our temporary accommodation. Attendees can purchase Christian Science periodicals, books and other literature.

The church held a public lecture on the 7th April 2024 at St Michael's Church of England Infant School, Mickleham. The lecture was entitled 'Can Spiritual Perception Bring Healing?' and was given by Alex Fischer, CS a member of the Christian Science Board of Lectureship.

The Church Board members provide executive service to the Church, pastoral care for the Church family, and offer prayerful support.

Members of the Church volunteer on all the committees which contribute to the running of the Church. These tasks include operating the Reading Room for the public, acting as ushers greeting the congregation at services, conducting the services, teaching in the Sunday School and other administration roles.

We are holding a restricted fund of £118 which has a requirement that the money be used to support young people of forum age (13-25) who attend the Church in Surrey or who are interested in Christian Science and live in the church locality, to enable them to be involved in activities related to Christian Science.

Statement of the Board's Responsibilities:

The members of the Executive Board are also the Charity Trustees of the Church. The Trustees do not receive any remuneration for their services to the Charity.

Trustees are elected from the members of the church at the November Members' meeting each year to serve a maximum of 3 years consecutively in accordance with the Constitution and Rules.

The Trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records, which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time, the financial position of the Church. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Church and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Investment Policies:


Under the Trust Deed, the Church has the power to make any investments it sees fit.

Reserve Policy:

The reserves policy of the church is to maintain funds at a sufficient level to ensure that it can continue to meet its objectives in the community in which it operates for the foreseeable future.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

a) Basis of preparation

The charity constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland issued in October 2019, the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102), the Charities Act 2011 and UK Generally Accepted Accounting Practice. The charity does not include a cashflow statement on the grounds that it is applying FRS 102 Section 1A.

The financial statements are prepared on a going concern basis under the historical cost convention, modified to include certain items at fair value. The financial statements are presented in sterling which is the functional currency of the charity.

The significant accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all years presented unless otherwise stated.

b) Income recognition policies

Items of income are recognised and included in the accounts when all of the following criteria are met:

- The charity has entitlement to the funds;
- any performance conditions attached to the item(s) of income have been met or are fully within the control of the charity.
- there is sufficient certainty that receipt of the income is considered probable; and
- the amount can be measured reliably.

c) Expenditure recognition

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to make a payment to a third party, it is probable that settlement will be required and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is classified under the following activity headings:

- Costs of raising funds comprise the costs associated with the management of the charity's investments. All such costs are charged to unrestricted funds.
- Expenditure on charitable activities includes the costs undertaken to further the purposes of the charity and their associated support costs.

d) Support costs

Support costs are those functions that assist the work of the Charity but do not directly undertake charitable activities. Support costs include back office costs, finance, personnel, payroll and governance costs which support the charity's activities.

e) Tangible Fixed Assets

The freehold land and buildings were only completed in December 2024 and so have not been depreciated.

Other tangible fixed assets are depreciated as follows:

f) Listed Investments

Listed investments are initially recognised at their transaction value and subsequently measured at fair value at the Balance Sheet date using the closing quoted market price. The Statement of Financial Activities includes the net gains and losses on revaluations and disposals throughout the year.

g) Financial Instruments

Debtors and creditors with no stated interest rate and receivable or payable within one year are recorded at transaction price. Any losses arising from impairments are recognised in expenditure.

h) Taxation

As the Church is a registered charity the results of its normal activities are not liable for tax.

The total general income for the year was £652,270 (2022 - £17,748), of which £350,000 was made from the sale of some land owned by the church and £283,128 from grants to pay for the redevelopment of the church building. The expenditure was £105,445 (2022 - £100,165) and £296,761 was spent on the redevelopment of the church building. At 31st December 2023, the church had unrestricted general funds of £291,977 (2022- £368,306) and restricted funds of £633,061, (2022-£118). The restricted funds will be used in connection with the re development of the church.

Services include readings from the Bible and the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures". At the Testimony Meetings and Thanksgiving Service members of the congregation share healings, remarks and experiences resulting from their study and practice of Christian Science. All the services and Testimony Meetings are open to everyone in the local community. There is a Sunday School which meets at the same time as the morning service on a Sunday. This is open to all young people up to the age of 20 and provides an opportunity for them to learn how to apply Biblical teachings to their moral, social and health challenges in daily life. We regularly have three children attending our 'in person' Sunday School. Access to our services, meetings and Sunday School continued to be made available via Zoom to those who were not able to attend in person.

This year saw the sale of half of the church land on 2 August 2023. The church building was vacated, placing some items into storage and disposing of others. The church services, Sunday School and Reading Room have moved temporarily to St Michael's Infant School, Mickleham, Surrey. The redevelopment of the church building started shortly after the sale of the land.

The church redevelopment is being financially supported by two Christian Science charities, The Christian Science Trust in Great Britain (Trust Brit), and The Westminster Fund. Invoices from the building contractor up to the value of £282,943 have been reimbursed by these charities during 2023. Further funding has been approved for 2024 and this will be used along with the land sale proceeds and some church funds to complete the building re-development.

There was a Reading Room adjoining the Church which was open to all members of the community until August 2023. Since vacating the church building, we continue to maintain some of the services of the

Reading Room at our meetings and services. Attendees can purchase Christian Science periodicals, books and other literature.

The Church did not hold a lecture during 2023. The requirement for Christian Science churches to hold an annual lecture is that one is held during the specified lecture year which is June to May. The last lecture being held in October 2022 and the next one is planned for April 2024.

The Church Board members provide executive service to the Church, pastoral care for the Church family, and offer prayerful support.

Members of the Church volunteer on all the committees which contribute to the running of the Church. These tasks include operating the Reading Room for the public, acting as ushers greeting the congregation at services, conducting the services, teaching in the Sunday School and other administration roles.

We are holding a restricted fund of £118 which has a requirement that the money be used to support young people of forum age (13 – 25) who attend the Church in Surrey or who are interested in Christian Science and live in the church locality, to enable them to be involved in activities related to Christian Science.

Statement of the Board's Responsibilities:

The members of the Executive Board are also the Charity Trustees of the Church. The Trustees do not receive any remuneration for their services to the Charity.

Trustees are elected from the members of the church at the November Members' meeting each year to serve a maximum of 3 years consecutively in accordance with the Constitution and Rules.

The Trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records, which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time, the financial position of the Church. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Church and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Investment Policies:


Under the Trust Deed, the Church has the power to make any investments it sees fit.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

a) Basis of preparation

The charity constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland issued in October 2019, the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102), the Charities Act 2011 and UK Generally Accepted Accounting Practice. The charity does not include a cashflow statement on the grounds that it is applying FRS 102 Section 1A.

The financial statements are prepared on a going concern basis under the historical cost convention, modified to include certain items at fair value. The financial statements are presented in sterling which is the functional currency of the charity.

The significant accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all years presented unless otherwise stated.

b) Income recognition policies

Items of income are recognised and included in the accounts when all of the following criteria are met:

- The charity has entitlement to the funds;
- any performance conditions attached to the item(s) of income have been met or are fully within the control of the charity.
- there is sufficient certainty that receipt of the income is considered probable; and
- the amount can be measured reliably.

c) Expenditure recognition

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to make a payment to a third party, it is probable that settlement will be required and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is classified under the following activity headings:

- Costs of raising funds comprise the costs associated with the management of the charity's investments. All such costs are charged to unrestricted funds.
- Expenditure on charitable activities includes the costs undertaken to further the purposes of the charity and their associated support costs.

d) Support costs

Support costs are those functions that assist the work of the Charity but do not directly undertake charitable activities. Support costs include back office costs, finance, personnel, payroll and governance costs which support the charity's activities.

e) Tangible Fixed Assets

The freehold property occupied by the charity for its own use is accounted for using the revaluation method and is stated at its revalued amount less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation is calculated on a straight line basis over 100 years based on the closing revalued amount.

Other tangible fixed assets are depreciated as follows:

Computer equipment	33% straight line
Fixtures and fittings	15% reducing balance

f) Listed Investments

Listed investments are initially recognised at their transaction value and subsequently measured at fair value at the Balance Sheet date using the closing quoted market price. The Statement of Financial Activities includes the net gains and losses on revaluations and disposals throughout the year.

g) Financial Instruments

Debtors and creditors with no stated interest rate and receivable or payable within one year are recorded at transaction price. Any losses arising from impairments are recognised in expenditure.

h) Taxation

As the Church is a registered charity the results of its normal activities are not liable for tax.

Foundation:

The Church, which was formed in 1930, was recognised as a branch of The Mother Church, The First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston, Mass, USA on 1 June 1950. The Church is democratic and run by the members and the board in accordance with the Church Manual of The First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston, Mass and its own Constitution and Rules.

Principal Object:

The Church's object is to maintain and spread the Truth as set forth in The Bible and interpreted in the Christian Science textbook "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" by Mary Baker Eddy, the Discoverer and Founder of Christian Science.

Review of Financial Management:

The total income for the year was £52,018 (2019 - £85,073). The expenditure was £44,710 (2019 - £35,280). Giving net incoming resources of £7,308 (2019 - £49,793).

Summary of Activities:

In planning the activities for the year, we kept in mind the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit. The Church held regular services on Sunday mornings and Testimony meetings on Wednesday evenings. In addition, a Thanksgiving service was held in November. Services include readings from The Bible and the Christian Science textbook, Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures. At the Testimony meetings and Thanksgiving service members of the congregation share healings, remarks and experiences resulting from their study and practice of Christian Science. All the services and Testimony meetings are open to everyone in the local community. There is a Sunday School which meets at the same time as the morning service on a Sunday. This is open to all young people up to the age of 20 and provides an opportunity for them to learn how to apply Biblical teachings to their moral, social and health challenges in daily life. As Government restrictions came into force in March 2020 due to the pandemic, all Church services, meetings and Sunday School classes moved (and have remained) online via Zoom which could be accessed via a computer, tablet, smart phone or via telephone. Connection details were provided via notices in the windows and on our website as well as via email to those on our mailing list.

Payments continued to be paid to those musicians who were booked to regularly play or sing for the Church services throughout 2020. Some of the payments were goodwill payments, but over time a number of the musicians were able to provide recorded music for use in the online services.

There is also a Reading Room adjoining the Church which is open to all members of the community for a couple of hours, on several weekdays and on Saturdays. The Reading Room offers people a quiet space to pray and read and study the Bible and Christian Science literature. It includes a sales room and lending library. Window displays are regularly updated to provide passers-by with timely articles from Christian Science periodicals. There is also a computer which can be used to access worldwide Christian Science websites, including JSH Online. The latter is run by The Mother Church and includes access to all published articles from the Christian Science periodicals from 1883 to the present, plus additional online text and audio content. The computer is used at other times to show webcasts of meetings from The Mother Church in Boston, USA. The Reading Room was closed from March 2020 due to Government restrictions in place during the pandemic. The Librarian and some helpers were able to attend the building to continue despatching periodicals for those people wishing to purchase them and also to keep the window displays refreshed.

The Church was due to sponsor a public talk at the Dorking Halls in April to be given by Melanie Wahlberg, CS. Due to the Government's pandemic restrictions, this was cancelled, and an alternative online livestreamed talk was scheduled for early 2021.

The Church Board members provide executive service to the Church, pastoral care for the Church family and offer prayerful support.

A sum of £33,448 was received as the final amount due from the Estate of a former Member, Sheila Morgan. These monies are being held with other church funds while the Members continue to move forward with plans for the refurbishment of the Church building.

Three other donations were received during the year from other Christian Science charities or organisations. The first was a sum of £105 from the disbanding Surrey Forum with a requirement that the money be used to support young people of forum age (13-25) attending the Church in Surrey or interested in Christian Science and who live in the locality of the church, to be involved in activities relating to Christian Science. This sum has not yet been used. The second was a gift of £5,000 from The Westminster Fund which was offered to Christian Science churches within the UK to provide extra support during and beyond the pandemic. The third was a sum of £103 given by Trust Brit to specifically reimburse the cost of an annual subscription for Zoom.

A planning application has been made during the year which has required a number of amendments and is still in progress. The Architect and Project Manager have been working with the Church Members throughout this process.

A bank account was opened with the Charity Bank during this year to spread the Church funds across multiple banks.

Statement of the Board's Responsibilities:

The members of the Executive Board are also the Charity Trustees of the Church. The Trustees do not receive any remuneration for their services to the Charity except that Jane Highfield is paid in her capacity as a keyboard player for the church. A Trustees' conflict-of-interest declaration has been completed to record this.

The Trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records, which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time, the financial position of the Church. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Church and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Under the Trust Deed, the Church has the power to make any investments it sees fit
