Summary of activities for the year:

The hall underwent major structural improvements during 2022, with the removal of the pillar, new flooring, ceiling, lighting, electrics and plastering. Cosmetic & facility upgrades were also undertaken. The hall was repainted throughout, & new blinds were installed. A large screen & projector were added to the facilities to allow the community to enjoy events together. A new larger cooker was purchased. This was all made possible by grants obtained by our Chair, Glynis Washington.

Fundraising activities re-commenced in earnest following the completion of the improvements. The main fundraising activities were the Midsummer Fair £4,500 and the Pantomime £2,040.

which give me reasonable cause to believe that in a material respect the requirements

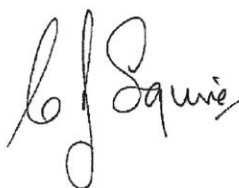

Summary of activities for the year:

Due to the Coronavirus Pandemic, the village hall had limited opportunities in terms of activities and fundraising. Other than Hall & Equipment Hire which totalled £2,234, the main fund-raising activities have been the 200 Club £1,073, Casino Night £759, & the Covid Independence Party £886.

We continued where possible with the refurbishment programme, being careful to adhere to Government guidelines and during 2021 revamped part of the rear garden space of the village hall to provide a safer area for children to play. The improvement programme will continue during 2022, with major works planned to remove the pillar in the main hall.

The village hall committee would like to thank Colin Squire for preparing the accounts of the Village Hall and the 200 Club.

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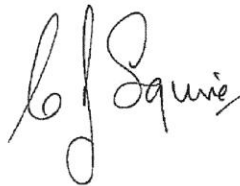
