

Hogarth's House has continued to be open free of charge year round in this period. It has been a year of planning and new partnerships many of which will come to fruition in 2025 including: A partnership with St Mary's University to deliver an exhibition in Senses and Emotion in the work of Hogarth and an accompanying academic conference and publication. An exhibition looking in detail at the Hogarth work Industry and Idleness and an exhibition on modern print making techniques.

Hogarth's House has continued to engage a team of volunteer gardeners to maintain the grounds. There has also been a new learning partnership with the Thames Explorer Trust to expand learning at the site. Seasonal public programming continues with charged for events throughout the year.



The National Lottery Heritage Fund (NLHF) funded project Hogarth's Mulberry Garden has now ended and with that change staffing at Hogarth's House has also changed. The previous Learning and Engagement Manager role which was NLHF has been discontinued in favour of the new roles of Learning Manager and of Volunteer Manager. These roles work across both Hogarth's House and Boston Manor House as all Historic House staff now do. The house also has a new Visitor Experience team lead by a Visitor Experience Senior Officer with three duty officers and five Visitor Experience Assistants. This new set up allows more flexibility to ensure the site remains open and accessible to all. The garden is maintained by a team of volunteers who are supported by the Volunteer Manager.

The Weston Studio has played host to private and public events including talks and activities making use of our printing press and drawing inspiration from Hogarth's colour palette and line of beauty which is featured throughout the site. A new Free special exhibition At Home With the Hogarth's was displayed at the house, greatly expanding the story of the Hogarth Family and their social circles for our visitors.





The project experienced many delays following the Government requirements to prevent the increased spread of COVID. This meant that the house was closed for a period of time and we delayed the recruitment of our gardener until Summer 2021.

The interpretation markers are now installed. The benches are also in their final locations. The tree props have been completed and were installed in early December once all the leaves from the mulberry tree had dropped. The installation of the props was overseen by the Head Gardener at Chiswick House and Gardens who has been supporting the maintenance of the Mulberry Tree.

The project is meeting outcomes through a diverse and blended offer for communities and networks wanting to engage with Hogarth's House. Individual evaluation of programmes have taken place to ensure it can feed into a more structured evaluation for the learning programme.

The Historic Houses Senior Manager has secured Paula Rego exhibition for the house for summer 2021 which will be the same time as an introspective of her work at the Tate.


