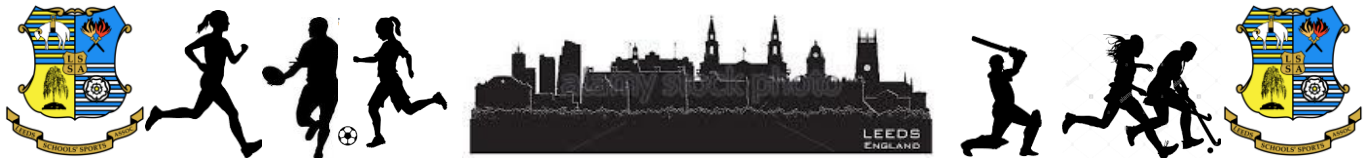

### **Meeting held via Zoom 22<sup>nd</sup> March 4pm**

#### **Chairman's welcome and introduction**

CN – Introduced the AGM for this year and listed the items to be discussed from last years meeting. Items discussed in the last meeting

- Oldfield Lane ground sale – not resolved
- Amount in Virgin account and movement which is in excess of £50K
- Reduce affiliation to half the cost because of the excess budget
- Requests from Cross Country / Morley schools / Netball / Basket Ball these payments will continue.

#### **Chairman's Annual Report**

CN – LSSA are continuing to meet their statutory duties – three meetings a year – ensuring schools and pupils receive help and funding.

CN would also like to extend his thanks for the loyalty and diligence of all the LSSA members, staff in school and all who promote sport in all sections of school. Thank you to CP for all his hard work regarding Oldfield Lane and work with all the extra links. CN would like to thank PS for organising and co-ordinating football so effective and robustly. GT for his work with district sides and high school football. Thanks to DC for all his hard work in High Schools. Thanks to JS for her commitment and hard work with Netball. CN would like to thank SB for his long service especially regarding Rugby. Thanks to PS for her great co-ordination of athletics and cross country.

Due to the good work this has ensured pupils from the widest possible areas have had some very memorable days, with congratulations to all pupils and participants.

CN would also like to extend his thanks to Leeds City Council and LUFC and all other agencies involved, it has been a privilege to work with throughout the year.

GT asked for recognition of Kieron Gaffey (CHCHS) in organising female football.

#### **Oldfield Lane update**

Unfortunately there is no result, however, this is not through lack of effort. Communications from Mr M Meadowcroft have resulted in a derisory offer to buy the ground, this was rejected at a previous extra meeting, we have no idea where the money is coming from.

LCC are still adamant that the ground is designated for building.



LUFC and their CEO Angus Kineer have been involved in a couple of meetings with LSSA and LCC development team. This has resulted in LUFC withdrawing any contact with the action group. CP is involved to try and fund a facility in the area and has been holding meetings with local clubs. LCC are to redraw plans involving a mini pitch as yet we are still awaiting and update to see what happens next.

The ground has been used illegally by an adult team, this in effect, is trespassing which will need a solicitors letter, we understand there is also an U14's local team that has been using the pitch.

Question – Has the action group been getting a fee? PS and CP met with Mr Meadowcroft who said they receive a voluntary donation.

CP has been to see the condition of the ground as the neighbours have complained of rubbish, a dangerous wall and knotweed.

CN – LSSA will pay for items to be resolved to show we are committed to the ground.

CN – would also like it to be noted that according to the email from Mr Meadowcroft the ground in the constitution states that it is only to be used by children in Leeds, however, the action group has let adults use it.

Wortley FC don't want to move ahead with any involvement in the sale of the ground or facility enhancement until more decisions are made.

### **Action**

The wall has been lowered and fenced, the knotweed has been cleared. The water supply is turned off at the moment and we are hoping to get permanently disconnected.

Rubbish – MK has been in touch with local waste company Junk and Rubbish who have removed old mattresses, tyres and general waste at a cost of £300 (this did not include the logs)

Signage - MK will arrange with Simple Signs to install 3 screw in signs to the metal gate / cut through / wall. Simple Signs to take pictures.

### **Treasurer's Report**

The income and expenditure was discussed. The withdrawal of investment from Utmost Wealth Investments is now frozen and closed this was at £49K plus £453.55.

Total Income is showing £78434.69

Expenses:

Basket Ball has been an excellent initiative which has seen Basket Ball take off in Leeds.

Cross Country is working well with a massive following.

Netball has been fully paid up for the next two years

Morley Schools have been excellent at running events

Athletics the hire of South Leeds is very pricey – Leeds Beckett is a lot cheaper, however, availability may be a problem.

Underspend was showing £28227.89

PS challenged this as the right hand column should be showing approx £19K

GT will re do and send across the amendments it should be £19606.00 this is to be clarified.

### **Election of Officers and Trustees – Chair, Vice Chair, Treasurer and Secretary.**

PS – No nominations for counter rolls and there is nobody to validate or propose and election which is a bit disappointing. Do we propose that elective officers continue in their rolls or pass it to a future meeting.

SB – Re election on block.



PS – Acts as secretary, however, he is paying MK to do that role. As Treasurer GT does this for free, however, would it be better for someone to be paid to do this role and GT to audit as Treasurer. MK does chase payments etc and it may be that we pay for help and LSSA oversee.  
 CN – There are significant amounts of money over the year should we be asking someone legally to audit accounts.  
 GT – Charity commission, Kevin Sweetman does audit.  
 CP – should we employ a Finance Officer?  
 PS – GT would become the auditor  
 CP – Audit movement of money

### **Action**

CN – This is a matter for further discussion. Need to give it further consideration.  
 Need formal arrangement.  
 This would need to be ratified at a future meeting.

### **LSSA membership affiliation 23-24**

PS - Affiliation was reduced to half price High Schools £200, Primary Schools £60 which will bring in a reduced amount of approx £14K for this academic year. This year we will be in deficit but we knew that would happen. Do we go back to the full amount for next 23/24 academic year?  
 Going forward Affiliation fee needs to be a varied fee not just £200 and £60 as it causes confusion in some schools.  
 MK – explained about chasing for P/O numbers.  
 PS – We will be sending out June/ July if your one of the Group of Trust school's you can not enter until we have a P/O number.  
 SB – Rugby entries come through Leeds Rhinos  
 CP – Some Leeds Rhinos is a different funding stream so we need to ensure schools do not get confused.

### **Action**

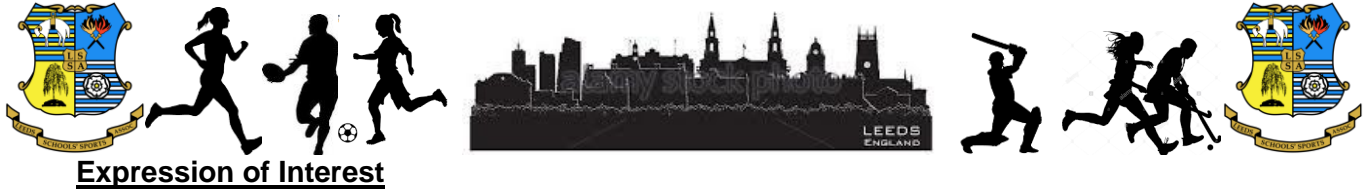
PS – to share standard format entry form asking for P/O number. Schools need to have shared a PO number before entering any event/sport.  
 Agreed – Affiliation fee for 23/24 will be High Schools £400, Primary School £200

### **Request for funding**

PS – First request from Pat S – 17 athletes in the Cross Country Championship on 18/03/2023 she has requested £30 per member at a cost of £510.  
 PS – Second request from JS for the Netball association £495 for venue hire of Gateway school. Each player is paying £150 each.  
 PS – GT are you ok to pay these  
 CP- Agreed to St Barts Cup Competition funding  
 CP – we need to decide on what we are funding around squads. Better for whole amount to be requested.

### **Action**

Working Party to propose for all city teams to receive £50 per squad member and it is upto the association to decide what this is used for.  
 Vote – all in favour from 23/24  
 Leads of city squads to send a funding request form to PS each year.

CP – would like to propose a new audio system for cross country, however, this would be a joint proposal as it would only be used 5 times a year in cc. Do we think this would be a good communication idea?

## **Association Reports**

PS – Primary school football everything is running ok the website is very useful and we are moving forward to champion of champions and cup competitions. All is going well.

GT – High school football we promised Heads of Schools that all leagues would be finished a couple of weeks before Easter. Due to the weather and strikes this has not been possible and it needs to be extended. This is a one off and will be back to normal next year.

Cups are ok most have reached the semi final stage.

District sides are doing well

U11 A team – 3<sup>rd</sup> in Yorkshire

B team – 8<sup>th</sup> in league

U12 – reached national competitions in semi final

U13 – top of the league at the min

U14 – Beat in the second round

SB – High School numbers have increased. Five trophies for five different schools. Girls team have qualified for the Yorkshire Finals. Leeds Rhinos Foundation introduced staff CPD for tag rugby, however there were only three applicants.

CP – Athletics dates and entries have gone out. Cross Country is excellent with a massive following and thousands of children running. There is a difficult problem with crowd control.

### **Minutes of the Annual General Meeting**

**Wednesday 30<sup>th</sup> March 2022 at 4.00.p.m**

#### **1. Chairman's welcome and introduction.**

Chris welcomed all. Introductions not necessary as all attendees knew each other.

#### **2 Registration and apologies**

As Above.

**3. The Minutes of the 2021 A.G.M. were accepted as a true record.**

**4. Chairman's report including relevant minutes of previous meetings**  
Chris Ness gave a Chairs report (copy saved in linked folder)

Janet Sammon asked if a grant awarded to netball had been paid. Graham will issue a cheque to Janet. Janet will forward the previous request for 2021.

Action:- Graham to forward payment to Janet / Netball.

The minutes of the previous Council meeting were considered and agreed as a true record.

**It was noted that it had been agreed that the committee could meet to consider funding requests between regular meetings if**



needed.

### 3 Ground sale

Graham highlighted that the council had lost a judicial review about a claim from the action group that the Oldfield Lane site was a community asset. L.C.C. feel they will win next time this is presented. LSSA do not need to be represented at such hearings. It was clarified that the Planning Dept at L.C.C. had not progressed planning well to this point. LCC are still very confident that the sale can progress and planning permission will be granted.

### 4 Treasurer's report: including sale of an asset- investment to provide facilities- reinvestment of contingency funds

Graham presented a full set of accounts for LSSA. This was circulated to all members attending the meeting. (Copies available upon request)

Affiliation fees collected in 4 parts.

- LCC schools via internal recharge
- Private schools via invoice
- Academies via invoice
- Academies via invoice (but a purchase order needed before this can be sent)

Peter highlighted the difficulties this had caused as obtaining a PO number from these schools had proved very difficult.

Peter requested that schools from certain Academies would need to provide a PO number on entry to allow entry.

A communication for schools will be circulated by Sports associations prior to entry to any schools event.

*Dear Headteacher, PE Leader, Team Coach,*

*Your school Academy trust requires a Purchase Order number for your school to affiliate to LSSA. In order to participate in this sporting activity you must confirm your affiliation to LSSA by providing the 2022-23 purchase order number for your school.*

The Treasurer went through the various Incomes and Expenditure Accounts and answered any questions referring to these.

He confirmed a balance in the Virgin account of £56,184.64



Graham also highlighted that the £52,076 that was being moved from an investment account to the bank account. It was noted that this would mean a balance of over £100,000

The Chair thanked the Treasurer for his continued work on behalf of L.S.S.A.

The meeting accepted that the Accounts were a true record of the figures shown.

#### 5. LSSA membership affiliation (currently £400 secondary and £120 Primary)

Pete proposed that affiliations could be reduced for the next academic year 2022-23 due to the surplus that was being carried forward.

The proposal was to discount the fee to half i.e. £200 High Schools and £60 Primary. **A discussion was held and a vote was unanimous.**

It was also highlighted that associations could be encouraged to seek extra funding to support activities, one off events, CPD for staff and special requests. Funding for someone to lead this would be welcome. Charlie will look to see if Leeds Beckett maybe able to partner up and provide support in this area.

Dave would look to purchase Leeds Sports Shields for all the Sports that could be used year on year.

#### 6. Requests for funding

- A request for £1000 funding was made by Morley Schools Sports Association. This was agreed. Graham will forward a cheque to Jez Whawell @ Westerton Primary
- A request was made by Cross Country for £690.15. This was agreed. Graham will forward a cheque to Pat Schofield
- A request from Netball was made. Janet was not sure what she was able to claim for. This was discussed. This was agreed. Janet will readdress the amount she is requesting and Graham will forward payment to Janet/Netball when the amount is clarified.
- A request was made by Basketball for £523.77. This was agreed. Graham will forward the funds to Ash Richardson (Ralph Thorsby)



- It was also highlighted that schools could make requests to LSSA to support students who have been selected/qualified to represent, City, County and District teams.
- Payment to continue supporting HOPE, Netball and Cross Country admin will gain be made.
- Graham will forward the funds to association with invoice from them.

Competitions for Winter and Summer undertaken or being arranged. Dave will collate those results to find the school points totals and award winners.

## 8. Association reports

**Date: 24/03/2021**

S.), K Bowden (Development Manager at L.C.C. Active Leeds Service), A Cox (Woodkirk Academy), R Davidson (Leeds City Academy), P Schofield (Athletics)

1. Chairman's Report.

Chris Ness welcomed everyone to the first A.G.M. to be ever held via Zoom. He reported that the Association continues to hold Council Meetings every term. At these we receive affiliated reports and requests for funding from Associations. Each meeting includes financial updates including updates from the funds collected by Holy Family.

Sport this year has been severely affected due to Covid 19 & lockdowns. Children have missed out in the vast majority of age related sporting activities. Children's well being and mental health could well have been affected by this.

Current optimism points to schools to resemble status quo in the summer term, with Sport again being played.

LSSA congratulates all Associations & Staff for their commitment and dedication to sports, even though home learning is the new format. For Sporting events that have been able to go ahead, I thank all Headteachers, staff members, facilitators & coaches for making these happen.

Moving forward, we hope that when restrictions are lifted, sporting events will be able to go ahead and children can participate in sports again.

Extending my personal thanks to LSSA colleagues, including financial & secretarial roles, in keeping these areas up to date.

LSSA faces a key period in history - linked to the sale of the TV Harrison ground. We could be in a position to improve provision of venues, hosting teams etc. LSSA have spent considerable time on this goal.

The Chair praised the new system for collecting Affiliation Fees and this was proving to be a huge success. Extending thanks to Andrew Dixon of the L.E.A. for setting up the system with Holy Family. Thanks also to Peter and his staff for their help in collecting the Affiliations.

Thanks also to the staff who organised the LSSA letter headings and display work.

I think we all are hoping for a much better time with School Sport in the next year.

G Thornton proposed a vote of thanks for the work Chris Ness has done in the last 12 months and over many years as Chair. This was unanimously accepted.

## 2. Treasurers Report

Graham Thornton referred members to the Income & Expenditure report sent to members prior to the meeting.

On the Income side the recharges from the L.C.C. were one's from the previous academic year.

On Expenditure these were in the main for events and awards before Covid 19 restrictions were put in place.

D Curtis asked for a brief indication as to what the grants covered.

Re:- Netball Association - these covered the running of events, cost of medals & paying for Secretarial work.

Re:- Rugby League Association - Cost of Trophies, medals, engraving, Ref fees and hire of the South Leeds Stadium for Finals. These were played in November before the restrictions came in.

Re:- Football - Hiring of grounds, particularly for the Finals played at the South Leeds Stadium, medals, Ref Fees & the awards for players who represented the City.

Re:- St Barts Football - This is a Girls Primary Football Tournament, organised by St Bartholomew's Primary School for many years. 20+ schools enter this and we give a grant for hire of facilities and medals.

P McQuillan Strong mentioned that all grants have different aspects & rationale behind them. £750 may be awarded to large Associations for help with Secretarial work, cost of events, hire of facilities, equipment. He pointed out that kit would not be covered. He mentioned that one of our new Sports - Rowing had huge events 3 times a year and have large expenses for hiring equipment.

The Treasurer continued by mentioning that our Financial position looks to be quite healthy with a profit for the Financial Year of £25 251.81. He pointed out however that quite a few Associations had still not claimed for the previous year. Athletics been one. Obviously when these did apply this would eat into this profit.

T Nelson asked . If we are wanting to run a competition, is there a specific number of schools that will need to be included if we were to ask for funding.

Peter M S replied. Not a specific number of schools, although need to clarify which Schools take part, to make sure they are affiliated to LSSA and are in the Leeds area. Occasionally we have had requests for funding and found that some of the schools who entered were out of the Leeds area. In this case we would only fund the proportion who were in Leeds and affiliated to LSSA. We do ask for an approx number of students who are going to be involved in the event, no minimum number required, but we ask that is opened to a logical number of people. Examples of funding requests will given at the Council meeting which follows the A.G.M.

The Chair thanked the Treasurer for his continued work on the accounts this year and to others who have helped him.

The accounts were accepted by the membership.

## 3. Election of Officers.

Peter M S proposed that Chris Ness was elected Chair.

S Boothroyd – I am excited to see new faces at the meeting tonight and I am looking forward to the report by Dave Curtis on the Hope proposals for High Schools Sport, which will come in the Council meeting.
