Aims and Objectives

The PTFA's primary objectives are organising fundraising events for the school community and helping to foster a community spirit around the school and associated parish. It carries out these objectives through a variety of events and means including:

- An annual summer fair open to the entire community, and other events such as family fireworks evening, St Patrick's Day event, Big Picnic etc.
- Encouraging donations to the school through standing orders
- Monthly after school events such as cakes sales and preloved uniform sales.

The PTFA donates all of its profits to the St Joseph's RC Primary School, Bromley, for use in improving the education of the school's children. The school provides the PTFA with a wish list of items and then we, the PTFA, raise money for those specific items, giving a more open and transparent view of what the funds raised are being used for and also resulting in bigger and more aspirational items being sought after by the school.

2021/22 Achievements

For the first time since the Covid 19 restrictions were lifted we have been able to run some of our bigger events this year including the Summer fair and the Fireworks night.

We made the decision to keep on some of the new fundraisers that we started during lock down such as the Advent and Easter raffles and Own Clothes Days.

This year we also introduced the Big Picnic event in September 2021 as the first event of the year. As well as an event to raise money it was also used as an opportunity for key stage 1 parents to get together within the school grounds for the first time.

We were also very lucky to have one of our parent governors run the London marathon in aid of the PTFA which raised £2,700.

Financial Commentary


Our profit for 2021/22 remained in line with previous years (£22,553 for 20/21 and £21,850 for 21/22)

The school governors along with the school head requested that we continue to raise funds this year towards building a new school hall. A bid for Condition Improvement Funds from the Education and Skills Funding Agency (CIF Bid) was submitted in 21/22 which unfortunately at the end of the school year was rejected. A decision will be made for 21/22 about whether to appeal this decision.


With this in mind we have continued to make smaller than usual donations to the school, including the planning application and tree consultation as part of the research for the new school hall bid and a donation to Jubilee celebrations for the whole school.

As a result our current assets for the year ended 31st August 2022 have remained higher than previous years as we ring fence these funds for the new school hall project. (£28,943 for 20/21 and £47,528 for 21/22)

We could not do this without the support of the many volunteers who help out at our events and support the school through donations of time and money.




