Our most successful event of the year was Colourfest24 which exceeded expectations with a net income of over £6000. The event again allowed the showcasing of local talent combined with the fun of the colour run, sponsored by local businesses. We were lucky to have 2 beds running in the Great Knaresborough bedrace again which allowed for fundraising through sponsorship and related school events. We collaborated with Knaresborough Cricket Club for the second time for the annual fireworks night which brought a greater community feel to the event and allowed risks to be shared. In order to bring the school community closer together we also ran smaller family focussed events such as the Teddy Bear's picnic, a Wonka themed cinema night and Chocolate bingo.</p> <p>We also held school focussed fundraising such as cake sales and sponsored reading events which have continued to be very popular in bringing much needed money in to provide additional resources to support the education of the children.</p> <p>We were lucky to receive the support of a £1000 grant from Knaresborough Lions to top up our fundraising for some much needed shade in the playgrounds. We have also started the process of claiming giftaid on donations received in recent years.</p> <p>Finally, passive fundraising sources such as YourSchoolLottery, Easyfundraising ASDA cashpot for schools provided over £2000 combined.</p>
