Local businesses supported us through monetary contribution and /or raffle prizes. Other events; Race night, Bingo night, kids quiz and lasertag (provided by an outside company for the school children), Christmas gift shop, non uniform day (Break the rules day), sports day and tuck shop refreshment sales and themed treat bags. These funds have been used for the refurbishment of the school toilets, equipment for the school (sports & ICT), educational and fun visits by external providers (Christmas Pantomime and
