### Summary of the objects of the Charity

The Charity provides scouting for children and young people in the Ilkley area.

The Charity aims to advance the mental, physical and spiritual welfare of young people by promoting a scheme of awards and their personal development.

We welcome all young people in our area, regardless of personal background, faith, gender or personal circumstances.

### Summary of the main activities undertaken for the public benefit in relation to these objects

The main activities in the year were running the building and grounds of the scout group and providing weekly meetings and activities for three groups (Beavers, Cubs and Scouts) with an overall membership of approximately sixty (60) children.

The activities of the groups were heavily impacted during the year by the Covid-19 pandemic. Group meetings were suspended for the duration of government imposed restrictions on public movement, which also prevented the planning and completion of further outdoor activities, such as camps.

Certain of the groups were able to attend virtual meetings on a more limited basis while physical meetings were suspended. However, we were very pleased to welcome children back when normal activities resumed following the lifting of government restrictions.

Statement of Trustees' financial responsibilities.

(1) The Trustees are required under the constitution of the Charity to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of the affairs of the Charity and of its results for the period. In preparing those financial statements, the Trustees are required to:

- Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent.
- Prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to assume the Charity will continue in business.

(2) The Trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Charity and hence for taking responsible steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

## **PART 2: Financial Summary**

### Brief statement of the Charity's policy on reserves

Cash at bank at end of the accounting period 2020/2021, on 31 August 2021, was £41,186 in unrestricted funds.

The main financial risk to the Charity is loss of funding from reduced subscriptions. The funds are held to cover operational costs and to meet any unforeseen expenditure that may occur.

### Details of any funds materially in deficit

Not applicable

### Further financial review details

The Charity's cash at bank position has been significantly strengthened during 2020/2021 from a series of grants from the local authority (Bradford Metropolitan District Council) in connection with the curtailment of activities caused by the Covid-19 pandemic.

This series of local authority grants has more than off-set the expected loss of subscription income caused by the Covid-19 pandemic, thereby increasing the Charity's cash at bank amount from the amount held at the end of the previous financial year (2019/2020).

In addition to cash held at bank, the Charity has no fixed assets, but does maintain certain current assets in the form of camping and other outdoor leisure equipment.

The Charity does not hold any freehold property interests, but has a leasehold interest in the land and buildings at its main operating address (The Boathouse, Beanlands Parade, Ilkley, LS29 8EW).

### Accounts, F/Y ending 31 August 2021

A copy of the Charity's 2020/2021 accounts appears as Annex One to this Trustees Annual Report.

The Charity's accounts are prepared using cash accounting methodology.

The accounts were duly scrutinized by Nigel Cressey, who is a qualified accountant known to the Trustees, and were approved by the Annual General Meeting of the Charity on 1 June 2022.

## Commentary on 2020-21 Accounts - FINAL

### Income

- *Increased income from subscriptions when compared to previous year. However, subscription revenue still restricted by ongoing Covid-19 pandemic and resultant UK government restrictions (subscription revenue up from £620 to £1,320).*
- *Reduction in subscription revenue more than off-set by further grants from public authorities relating to the Covid-19 pandemic (totalling £23,276 in FY 20/21).*
- *Other revenue raising activities also largely suspended due to effect of ongoing Covid-19 pandemic, but still increased from previous year (up to £352 from £89).*
- *£1,254 claimed via Gift Aid, covering income and donations during period from 2017-2019.*

### Expenditure

- *Significant further (temporary) reduction in district levy payment (to £1,080 from £1,578).*
- *Significant further (temporary) reduction in utility payments (approximately 33% reduction).*
- *Further reduction in activity related expenditures, even when compared to previous FY19/20 which had also been affected by ongoing Covid-19 pandemic. Again, no separate camp fees for same reason.*
- *Broadly consistent expenditure on maintenance and equipment connected to group property (down to £658 from £736).*

### Conclusion

- *A second successive year dominated by the Covid-19 pandemic.*
- *Income over expenditure of £23,397 (increased from £5,971 in previous year).*
- *Increase in aggregate bank balances to £41,186 at year end (up from £17,789 at the end of the previous year).*
- *Further increased income during FY20/21 has taken the charity beyond a further £25,000 threshold, thereby requiring the submission of an extended annual return to the Charities Commission.*
- *Accounts scrutinised by independent accountant (Mr Nigel Cressey) on 22 January 2022.*


Dear David
