**Summary of the main activities undertaken for the public benefit in relation to these objects (include within this section the statutory declaration that trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit)**

During this year the trustees have raised funds to give grants to Paraclete Christian Training Centre in Kuwadzana, Zimbabwe to use in its Bible School, crèche and secondary school and also to pay bursaries for those children at the school whose families cannot afford their school fees.

Three trustees and a volunteer visited the Training Centre in January 2025. Whilst recognising the difficulties of operating in the current economic situation, the finances of the Centre are fairly healthy and the staff and pupils in good heart. The secondary school is still operating two teaching sessions each day to accommodate the number of pupils. Overseas aid from PCNI and others is still important to the Training Centre. The Bible School is going well and the trustees' presence at graduation was appreciated.

The trustees have also continued to oversee the running of The English Church in Benidorm, a spiritual home for many English-speaking visitors, whether short or long term. Revd Trevor Ramsey and his wife Maggie continue to exercise pastoral responsibility. One of the Trustees visited and assisted with a mission visit from Newtownbreda Baptist Church. Attendance by both residents and visitors continues to increase. Activities at the church have been growing, with good attendance at services and Bible studies and evangelistic activity in the neighbourhood of the church. There have been baptisms in the sea and a Christianity Explored course was well attended. The Trustees continue to be grateful to the Board of Skandinaviska Turistkyrkan Benidorm for continuing to rent their building to the English Church.

The trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit.

The trustees' policy on grant making is only to give grants to organisations with which they have a personal connection.

During this year the trustees have raised funds to give grants to Paraclete Christian Training Centre in Kuwadzana, Zimbabwe to use to pay salaries for those employed by the training centre in its Bible School, crèche and secondary school and also to pay bursaries for those children at the school whose families cannot afford their school fees. Occasional funds for food aid were also sent to be distributed by Centre staff or passed on to a local church.

Because of the Coronavirus pandemic, it was not possible for trustees to visit the Training Centre during the year. However, contact has been maintained with the leaders of the Centre in Zimbabwe. Whilst recognising the difficulties of operating in the current economic situation, the finances of the Centre are fairly healthy and the staff and pupils in good heart. The secondary school has expanded its pupil numbers and in October opened a new science lab, for which PCNI gave a grant. Overseas aid from PCNI and others is still vital to the viability of the Training Centre. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic the Training Centre and school had to close temporarily on occasion.

The trustees have also continued to oversee the running of The English Church in Benidorm, a spiritual home for many English-speaking visitors, whether short or long term. The Church has been meeting when Covid-19 restrictions permit but have had to be suspended from time to time. Revd Alan Robertson continued to arrange services until Revd Trevor Ramsey and his wife Maggie took over pastoral responsibility at the beginning of September. Two of the Trustees attended a Service of Induction in September. Since then, activities at the church have been growing, with good attendance at services and Bible studies and evangelistic activity in the neighbourhood of the church. A new website was launched for the English Church. The Trustees are grateful to the Board of Skandinaviska Turistkyrkan Benidorm for continuing to rent their building to the English Church.

The trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit.

The trustees' policy on grant making is only to give grants to organisations with which they have a personal connection.
