We have a grants member that reaches out to local businesses for support or any other means that becomes apparent throughout the year that will aid the building of funds to support the school.

A small sum is maintained in the account to ensure emergency requests can be supported but FORP engage with the school to understand the annual objectives and aim to budget and fund raise according. Moreover, the funds are utilised to support ad hoc request i.e. forest school equipment, coach hire for school trips etc.
