Treasurers report for the period 1st Sept 2023 to 31st August 2024

The charity was administered this year by a committee comprising:

Members are appointed annually by election at the AGM.

This set of accounts being submitted covers the period of 1st September 2023 to 31st August 2024. The accounts will be passed to Fraser Beecham Ltd ACCA for independent review, before being submitted to the Charities Commission.

Overall, this year shows an excess of Income over Expenditure of £24,123.55. Our income this year from fee paying parents was down around £5,000 whilst our government funding increased overall by around £31,000. Salaries also increased by around £9,000.00 in line with increase hours and numbers. These are all great news for the pre-school that has reported losses for two of the last three years in a post pandemic era.

Expenditure overall was up around £8,000.00 with the largest increases being wages (£9,000), Rent (£4,900) and Software Expenses (£1,822). A number of accounts showed a small increase or decrease,

Fundraising income decreased by around £1100.00 although linked expenditure only decreased by around £300. The cost-of-living crisis has made fundraising especially hard in recent years as many families have less disposable income. The staff should all be commended for their efforts to keep everything as 'normal' as possible for the children in their care whilst still pushing the Pre-School forward and endeavouring to make it the best setting it can be.

The object of the charity is to provide nursery education and care for children 2 years old to 5 years old. High Wych Pre-School Nursery will operate within the Bullfields Centre for the near future. Rent for the hire of the hall is payable quarterly from our Income, the main source of which is fees from parents and government NEG funding.

The Reserve Account maintains a healthy balance of £60,463.60 in line with our reserves policy. This has been implemented based on charities commission

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guidelines for redundancy and outstanding fees should the pre-school be forced to close, but also to meet the future growth needs of the pre-school in line with the expected development in Sawbridgeworth, and the increase in nursery spaces needed. We have a healthy waiting list, so thankfully any closure is unlikely, but we must have a plan in place for worst, as well as best, case scenarios.

As a registered educational establishment, the Pre-School is naturally subject to regular government and Ofsted inspections. The Pre-School was inspected in January 2020 just before the pandemic hit us with full force, and we received a GOOD Ofsted, with a note that we were OUTSTANDING with regards to Behaviours and Attitudes. High Wych Pre-School is also a member of the Pre-School Learning Alliance, which provides advice on legal issues, and through which our public liability insurance is arranged.

Independent examiner's report to the trustees of High Wych Pre-School Nursery
