

WE HAVE PUT TOGETHER A SMALL GROUP OF VOLUNTEERS WHO HAVE HELPED RUN A CHRISTMAS PARTY, PANTOMIME, NEW YEARS PARTY AND WHO ARE KEEN TO HELP WITH FURTHER EVENTS IN THE FUTURE.

HALL HIRE IS REGULAR WITH MOST MORNING AND EVENING SLOTS BEING FILLED WITH HIRERS WITH ONLY A FEW AFTERNOONS AVAILABLE. WEEKENDS SAW MANY PRIVATE HIRERS HIRING FOR LOCAL CHILDRENS BIRTHDAY PARTIES AND EVENING FUNCTIONS.

THE POOL IS A LARGE DRAW FOR MEMBERS AND THE POOL WAS RUN SUCCESSFULLY, ATTENDED BY VOLUNTEERS A MINIMUM OF 4 TIMES PER DAY AND MAINTAINED AS AND WHEN NECESSARY.

THIS YEAR WE HAVE INSTALLED NEW GAS BOILERS FOR THE POOL, AND A NEW ELECTRIC BOILER FOR THE SHOWERS WE HAVE ALSO INSTALLED A SWIMMING POOL AUTO CHEMICAL DOSING SYSTEM
