# Captain's Report – Jack Groves

## Seniors'

Since the start of the year, there's been a huge increase in engagement within our senior section. This is partly due to the incredible work our club coaches have done to grow the younger sections of the club. As a result, we now have an amazing number of parents wishing to coach and train within the club themselves. This increase in participation (along with lots of support from Lee and many other coaches) has led to huge involvement in competitions this year. It's been many years since we've had a senior section compete at Nationals, and it turns out we're the best in the country on the sand — with no training!

## Competitions

We moved straight from our incredible Senior Nationals into the youth category. The conditions were nothing like what we were used to training in, but this just forced us to adapt and figure out how to compete in shallow water, with no waves to help us. It was great to see athletes in both the senior and youth categories trying out new races involving surf skis.

We then moved on to hosting the Senior Nationals, formerly known as the Open Nationals (which is a much better name!). Although the stormy weather was definitely not on our side, the conditions were perfect for racing - if you live in Cornwall! This was the largest open team we've ever had, and we even had some international teammates to race alongside. We had a young team overall, so although medals weren't a priority, invaluable racing experience was gained.

Once again, like last year, we wouldn't have been able to host this incredible competition without the commitment of our members. They worked so hard to fuel masses of hungry competitors with both delicious food and outstanding energy - although little Lee did nearly blow away with the tent!

## World Ocean Series

For the first time in SLSGB history, the World Ocean Series arrived on our shores. This series is the most competitive in surf lifesaving, with many international athletes travelling around the world to compete - and it's the only series to offer prize money for winners. It was great for so many of our nippers to have the opportunity to parade with the Oceanman finalists before their race. I'm sure they were all inspired to see where training hard and being dedicated can take you. This was the first of hopefully many more to come, and my favourite of all the competitions I've done so far.

## Surf Ski

It's been amazing to see more involvement from club members in my favourite section of the sport - surf ski. We've now managed to get the ski trailer down to the harbour, meaning summer training is now possible. As we move into the winter season, we're training in the protected environment of the Gannel. # Competitions Manager's Report – Sam Carter

2025 has been a phenomenal year for Newquay Surf Life Saving Club. It's been well over 10 years since Newquay has hosted any such competition like the ones we have been involved with, especially this year.

Fistral has prestige, it is world renowned, and the relationships we have forged with SLSGB, Surf Life Saving Cornwall, Boardmasters and the Boardmasters Foundation, Shaw and Partners and the World Ocean Series, our community in Newquay and the brilliant working relationship we have with Jenny, Vickie and the team at Fistral have just seen us go from strength to strength.

Our biggest supporters, as always are our fantastic members, past and present, from the youngest to the oldest and everyone in between, parents, coaches, managers, our committee, without all of whom these events would never be the success that they are, we could not achieve all of this without you.

I hope we may yet have another opportunity to showcase our beach again in 2026. Fistral certainly knows how to put on a show. Hosting has now gone out to "Expressions of Interest" which we will of course submit. Although hosting the weeklong nationals would be too much strain for Fistral to take in the peak of summer I hope we may have a chance for another Seniors Nationals.

## Competitions

### Cornish Stillwater's

The Cornish Stillwaters were held In Penzance this year and throughout the board was possibly for every category the largest team we have ever had representing the club.

Nippers' 3rd overall. This is the highest I have seen Newquay place in a very long-time, well-done Nippers! Youth 5th overall. An incredibly small but very strong team! Well done to our youth, especially the new transition 13s, it is quite daunting stepping up to the youth category. A huge well done to our youth that went on to repeat it all again in the Seniors afternoon session.

Seniors' 1st overall (Our, youth, seniors and masters swam back-to-back races in dual categories, so a huge well done to them) and our Masters team came 2nd overall.

### Cornish Ocean

The Cornish Ocean events were plagued as per usual with some challenges. Nippers had a brilliant time baking on Carlyon Bay however the sea was more akin to Jellyfish Soup. Newquay Nippers came 4th overall which is an unbelievable achievement.

Our youth team battled in some hideous conditions at Portreath, some ocean events were that sketchy at times after each and every event (and at times during) they said we might have to "call it" and halt the racing, this did not deter any of our team, each and every one set out to take part in their race, unfazed by what was ahead. Our small team of 12 youth came 7th overall. Rowan and Eli stepped up in really challenging conditions to take part in the U15 Oceanman, 19 entered and only 8 on the starting line. Well done boys.

Masters, there is a re-occurring theme here... Masters was moved from Crantock to Portreath due to the conditions, this made it tricky for some of our Masters having to drop out at the last minute due to venue change. That being said, and the team nearly cut by half, this did not stop them, they raced in every condition thrown at them, I don't think they had snow, but it wasn't far off and came in 8th overall in the county leaderboard. Despite many events being dropped we still scored plenty of bling and points, well done to all our medallist's but special nod to our Seniors Manager Lee who took home Silver in both Flags and Sprints. Considering the beach events are probably our least trained discipline, Newquay seem to smash these at every event.

Final Cornish Beach event of the season was Cornish Open which yet again was held on Portreath, we had the smallest team with just 3, Jess, Enzo and Jas. Jas took home 3rd in the individual women's Ski and the three of them took Silver in the Taplin Relay. Huge well done to all of you.

In 2026 I really hope we can look beyond the perception that the Open (or Seniors as it is now called) is only for the best in the county. Newquay has so many individuals with different strengths, that make the winning combination in team events!

### Nationals Stillwater's

Cardiff was once again the home of all Nationals Pool Competitions. Starting with our Nippers. As a club Newquay came 4<sup>th</sup> overall (2<sup>nd</sup> Cornish Club) which is a very impressive result. This is once again the highest Newquay have placed in a very long time. Our Nipper coaching team and managers work tirelessly to make sure every one of our Nippers is competition ready. And more importantly they work hard at making sure that all our nippers from the oldest to the youngest have fun learning their skills along the way.

### Youth/Seniors/Masters Stillwaters

In a change from previous years the whole event was combined instead of over separate days. This seemed to work well overall, but did mean it was tricky to work out where you placed as an individual. It didn't feel like you were competing against someone of your own age group, which took the competition edge off, which was slightly disappointing. It was however, a blast from start to finish. We had mixed teams in the Seniors combining our Youth and Masters to form teams. Highlight was the Pool Lifesaver Relay and the Line Throw.

As soon as Line Throw was added back in to the event line up, Newquay took up the challenge and started practicing. Ropes were being thrown, not just in the pool but in gardens all around Newquay (they were even taken on holiday) in the run up, the competition was fierce.

Chris and Kass took Gold in the Masters 40-44 Men's event with an astonishing 18 second time. I know 2026 times will be even faster the Line Throw bug has well and truly bitten!

### Nationals Ocean

What can I say, that was an experience. After years at Branksome Chine, Nationals headed to Weymouth this year, it was different, unlike anything we have trained for or are used to, but every single Master, Youth and Nipper stepped up and raced valiantly! They adapted, they changed, they thought outside of the box, and they watched, studying what worked well in the race before (or didn't for that matter).

Our Masters came 17th out of 24 clubs, Youth 12th out of 26 clubs and then our Newquay Nippers came 7th overall (only 1 point away from 6th) out of 30 clubs! Outstanding performances from everyone.

### Nationals Seniors

This had to have its own section. We were delighted to host SLSGB's Blue Ribbon event on our very own beach yet again, holding an event especially one as prestigious as the Seniors (Open) is a big challenge, the expectations are high, the pressure is on and there are months of preparation going on in the background.

But the real highlight of this competition being held at Fistral, is seeing our competitors, we have some of our 15's the youngest by far in the competition but eligible to race, to our Masters who take on the challenge of gaining points or medals for their team. We have competitors who may not have been able to make training more than a handful of times because of busy schedules, family, work, etc, but they all step up to compete under the Newquay Cap once again. We even had one competitor, who hasn't taken part in a SLSGB beach event in over 8 years, step in last minute to take part in the Beach Relay, thanks Rosie Mac (you were a lifesaver... literally), but without you there was no team. Newquay placed 7<sup>th</sup> out of 20 clubs Nationally.

This is what makes our sport so unique, I don't know any other sports like it that have the camaraderie and togetherness, whether it's on the beach or in the pool, competition or just training, it is a sport that draws people together like no other.

### Other Highlights

In addition to the normal SLSGB calendar we had two more events. Newquay was approached to host the British leg of the Shaw and Partners World Ocean Series. Four Newquay members, Jack, Owen, Elliot and Jess stepped up to race, against some of the Worlds best. They also teamed up with other Cornish clubs to make teams for the final 4 Man mixed Taplin.

This was yet another spectacle to behold, not just because we hosted the Event, but the club presence and support from our members. Seeing our Nippers cheering all the competitors on, a sea of black t-shirts and red, yellow and blue caps, faces beaming. It really was something special. Yet again our Newquay team stepped up to the mark with café team, set up team, logistics team, you name it.... We had a team for it! Thank you to all that supported us.

As always there were lots of fun friendlies to take part in too. Max Hocking was held this year on Holywell, which was an extremely popular event, we also had the Harbour Sports Day and Joe Way Paddle for Life. Twilights for the Youth and Seniors. These fun/informal events are invaluable to those that may have not competed, before and gives a taste of what to expect at the Ocean Competitions.

Rock up and Race at Gylly proved hugely popular on a Friday night. Another great opportunity to train in what are typically calmer conditions down on the south coast, with a competitive edge.

We have had a brilliant competition season, lots of medals, PB's, teamwork and friendships made. Thank you to all the coaches, the support team, tube rescuers and lifeguards, the committee, and parents and carers for making the competition wheel keep turning. It really does take a team to make these events happen.

A very big thank you also to Sarah, Leanne, Yase, Sue and Julia, our club officials without whom these events just simply wouldn't be able to go ahead. The days on the beach are incredibly long, more often

than not WET, and I don't think anyone can appreciate just how hard our officials work, your support is invaluable. I need to also mention Emma and Karina, anyone who knows me knows social media is not my strong point, you have captured our competitions, our events, our training, and our members achievements, thank you so much for all the behind-the-scenes work.

Newquay has really stood out this year, not just regionally but nationally also, for our level of support on the beach and poolside, whether water safety support, marshalling, line judging, flag placing, first aid, manikin dragging, nipper board lugging, timekeeping, you name it there was a Newquay t-shirt or rash vest there! 🇬🇧❤️🇬🇧🇬🇧

# Youth Manager's Report – Kass Gibson

This past year has been a significant one for the Youth section. At the end of the pool season, Rich stepped down as Section Manager after five years of dedicated service. Following Beach Nationals, Russ retired from coaching the youth after 15 years. On behalf of the Youth, coaches, and parents, I thank them both for their longstanding commitment to not only the Youth section but to the club as a whole.

The loss of such deep experience and expertise was somewhat daunting, but with a growing section and young people eager to develop their lifesaving and competition skills, Nick and I had to get cracking. One of the key challenges in a Youth section is balancing the range of interests among our members. We have members focused on high-performance competition, and others with little interest in competition but focused on long-term ambitions in lifeguarding. We are constantly working to ensure all these aims are met, and we'll be putting on more sessions in the future to do just that, as well as offering SLS qualifications through the Graduate Lifeguard Programme.

At the heart of our approach has been ensuring that our Youth shape the way the division is run: setting the tone, values, and expectations. To that end, we've developed a [Youth Mission](#), which sets out our core values and purpose. This includes everyone in the section, not just the Youth themselves, but also the coaches, parents, and supporters, taking ownership of their development, behaviour, and contribution. Everyone has a place, whether focused on competition, lifeguarding, or both. And we train to perform at our best, measuring success by personal improvement.

As part of this we've developed a Youth leadership structure. Together, we identified the need to better coordinate Youth activities and create clear ways for Youth to contribute to section policies and processes. This includes organising events such as end-of-season parties and welcome sessions for new members, managing kit, and providing feedback to the Club Captain for the committee. To achieve this, the Youth favoured a captain system, and we're pleased to announce that Jess Carter was unanimously elected as our first Captain in this new era. Jess will play a key role in shaping what this role looks like for the future and helping us implement the Graduate Lifeguard Programme.

We're also incredibly proud to have launched "Ski School", bringing ski paddling into the Youth section for the first time in living memory. Sessions have taken place on the Gannel, introducing paddling in flat water for beginners and offering dedicated training for our more experienced Youth. This wouldn't have been possible without the support of Lee, who worked tirelessly not only to get the skis in great condition but also on a working trailer and stored accessibly in the harbour; Scott, for his coaching input; and the Tyler family, who kindly let us store the skis and trailer on their driveway for the winter. We look forward to seeing the Youth develop their skills and to reporting on some strong ski relay and Taplin performances next season.

On that note, we've also had some excellent performances by the Youth in Cornish, National, *and* International events. As a coaching team we are incredibly proud seeing any of our Youth enter competitions, we were especially proud to see our older Youth in action at both the National Open and the World Series events at Fistril. We're all excited by the prospects of our current athletes, as well as the new, competition-hungry Youth joining us next season.

We have a range of exciting plans for the section and look forward to sharing our progress next year. In the meantime, both Nick and I want to thank all the Youth for their energy and enthusiasm, the coaches, parents, and supporters who make it all possible, and finally, a very special thank you to Sam Carter. Simply put, we wouldn't have made any of this progress without Sam, and Sam will be central to realising our future plans too.

# Competitions Manager's Comments



2024 has been our biggest competitive season since Covid for both Still Water and Ocean Competitions.

Fifty-seven Nippers, 14 Youth and 15 Open and Masters represented the Club at County Level in the Still Water Events. A lot of the results were incomplete or missing (particularly for the Nippers) so totals have never been agreed.

We had a whopping 51 Nippers attend the Nationals Still Water Event at Cardiff International Pool. We came an amazing 7th place overall out of 29 teams, and 4th Cornish team. A small but mighty Youth team put in a strong performance and came 13th overall in the country and 5th Cornish team!

The competitions were held very late in the Spring so with no time at all we were straight back to the beach. There were lots of fun events for all sections of the Club to participate in from Max Hocking fun day for Nippers to the Twilights for the Youth and Seniors. These fun/informal events are invaluable to those that may have not competed before and gives a taste of what to expect at the Ocean Competitions. Just like last year, the summer competition season was challenging but at least our Nippers got properly wet this year at their Cornish Ocean Competition. Holywell dealt our brave and bold Nippers some seriously challenging conditions (and some rather large waves) on the Saturday, and they smashed it! Newquay Nippers placed 8th out of all Cornish teams.

The conditions for 13 of our Youth to compete in at Portreath were relatively kind compared to previous years and our Youth placed a brilliant 7th overall in the county.

Sadly, for our Seniors the Masters competition on Holywell was largely red flagged leading to no ocean events on the day. Ocean events took place later on in the season at Hayle but we had a reduced team due to some being unable to reattend.

Nationals was held for the 5th Year running in Branksome Chine in Dorset. The challenge this year was not the waves... BUT THE HEAT! The sun beat down on Branksome for the two days of the Youth Competition. It was hard to just stand in the heat, let alone compete in it but nevertheless our team of just 11 Youth came away in 14th place overall out of 26 teams! It cooled down slightly for our 37 Nippers who battled it out again on the beach and in the sea! Newquay stormed all the way to 11th place... just shy of top 10 by a tiny 20-point margin! 2025 we will hit that top 10 spot!

The final event of the Competition Calendar was the Nationals Open held on our very own beach! There is so much to say about this competition, it was the spectacle we dreamed it would be, the club united to deliver an unforgettable event and each and to every person that contributed to the success of this weekend I thank you. We had members from every section, Sandhopper, Nipper, Youth, Senior, past members, family members, all supporting to make the event such a success. Competing we had 6 of our Youth and 11 of our Seniors/Open team. Some signed up just to participate in the team events and for the opportunity to compete on our own beach! We came away joint 8th on the points table. Newquay Surf Life Saving Club all delivered such a successful event, we have been asked to host again next year!

We have had a brilliant competition season, lots of medals, PB's, team work and friendships made. Thank you to all the coaches, the support team, tube rescuers and lifeguards, the committee, and parents and carers for making the competition wheel keep turning. It really does take a team to make these events happen.

Newquay Surf Lifesaving Club has a moral and legal duty of care to safeguard all children and vulnerable adults involved in its activities, from harm.

## What is safeguarding?

Safeguarding refers to the process of protecting children and vulnerable adults to provide safe and effective care. This includes all procedures designed to prevent harm to a child/vulnerable adult.

Children includes everyone under the age of 18 years old.

## What is child protection?

Child protection is part of the safeguarding process, protecting individual children identified as suffering or likely to suffer significant harm. This includes the child protection procedures which detail how to respond to concerns about a child.

## Designated Safeguarding Officer for NSLSC.

Sonya Macintosh is our designated Safeguarding Officer for Newquay Surf Lifesaving Club; the point of contact for anyone that is concerned about a child or vulnerable adult.

*Safeguarding is ultimately everybody's responsibility, and if you believe that a child or vulnerable adult is at risk of being abused this must be reported as soon as possible to myself as the Safeguarding officer. If the situation requires immediate action, please contact the police on 999.*

Our pledge is to be the best Club we can be. All Trustees are volunteers so are not paid, we work hard to manage a growing Club by listening and responding to our members and working collaboratively with governing bodies, always with the best interests to the Club at heart.

Key offices (excluding section Managers/assistants) will be up for re-election every two years to ensure resilience in the Club but appropriate democracy and governance.

# Competitions Manager's Comments



2023 was a bumper competition season for both Still Water and Ocean Competitions.

45 Nippers, 17 Youth and 14 Open and Masters represented the club at County Level in the Still Water Events. Nippers came 7<sup>th</sup> overall in Cornwall, Youth 6<sup>th</sup> and the Open and Masters 4<sup>th</sup>!

26 Nippers and 16 Youth/Open attended the Nationals Still Water Event at Cardiff International Pool.

The National Nipper competition was held very late in the Spring so with no time at all we were straight back to the beach. There were lots of fun events for all sections of the club to participate in from Max Hocking fun day for Nippers to the Twilights for the Youth and Seniors. These fun/informal events are invaluable to those that may have not competed before and gives a taste of what to expect at the Ocean Competitions.



The summer competition season was challenging to say the least, due to some big storms the sea conditions for both the Cornish Nippers and Youth meant that lots of events were cancelled on the day. Whilst this was frustrating our 29 Nippers and 13 Youth made the very best of it.



Nationals was held for the 4<sup>th</sup> Year running in Branksome Chine in Dorset. In keeping with the Cornish Beach competitions we were not blessed with the flat seas we had usually come to expect from the South coast. This definitely gave the Cornish teams an advantage. 22 Nippers and 13 Youth battled it out again on the beach and in the sea! Newquay Youth blew us all away and with a fairly small team in comparison to other clubs we stormed all the way to 11<sup>th</sup> place... I might have mentioned it before.. we beat HOLYWELL!

The Nipper team ran, swam, surfed, rescued, captured flags and relayed until they were exhausted and our fierce Nippers brought home a whopping 298 points taking the team to 14<sup>th</sup> overall in the country!

In the midst of what was already a very busy summer our Youth Captain Owen was selected to represent Great Britain Youth Team in the European Championships in Poland. The GB team came 5<sup>th</sup> overall in Europe.

4 of our Youth/Open team were chosen to represent Cornwall in the Celtic Cup and Newquay's Jas Mann was selected to be the Cornish Captain!

The final event of the Competition Calendar was the Nationals Open held on Portreath. 6 of our Youth and Open members took part. One of the team highlights was the "6 man taplin" where all our competitors took part in the relay. Our small team of 6 came away 12<sup>th</sup> out of 25 teams nationally! Phenomenal achievement.



We have had a brilliant competition season, lots of Medals, PB's, team work and friendships made. Thank you to all the coaches, the support team, tube rescuer's and lifeguards, the committee, and parents and carers for making the competition wheel keep turning. Between them, the Nippers won 4 golds and a bronze medal, and importantly had loads of fun and achieved some huge personal bests. We came 7<sup>th</sup> in Cornwall as a club which is a great result. After some 50m pool practice at Mount Kelly in Tavistock, many of these Nippers went on to attend the Nationals in Cardiff, a 50m pool must look enormous to some of the youngest Nippers, so to get in and swim is an achievement in itself. Again, we had a successful comp with a gold, 2 silver and 2 bronze medals. It was great to see our older Nippers supporting the younger ones on the Saturday and some of our youth members helping on the Sunday. We also had a huge amount of parental support with parents volunteering to time keep and carrying boards around.

After the pool season we held our awards night at Trevarrian, alongside playing Bingo and an incredible raffle from Sam S. This was a very well attended event with lots of happy smiling kids and parents. Lots of prizes were awarded including Nipper of the year to Nahla, and competitors of the year to Bella and Rowan. We thanked our outgoing captains, Jago, Amelia, Tia, Jas, and Rowan and welcomed Toby and Felix as the new Nipper captains.



I ran a Level 1 coach training course pre-beach season and welcomed 5 new coaches to the Nipper section. This meant we had a great start to the summer beach season with amazing weather early on (which of course was all over by the time school holidays started!). Unfortunately, we couldn't run tuck shop this year, which the Nippers definitely missed, but now we have a new boiler installed thanks to parents Nick, Eddie, and Jon we are hopeful tuck shop will be back next Summer.

Competition season started with Max Hocking which was well attended and even had better weather than most previous years I can remember! It's always a great first experience of competition for the new members and both new and old love the epic obstacle course! Again, we had a really big turnout for the Cornish beach comp at Holywell with 42 members signing up. Unfortunately, this time the weather wasn't kind with huge seas meaning the cancellation of most of the sea events, but we still had Nippers winning a gold and bronze medal. The Nippers made the best of weekend, sticking with the difficult conditions and changing programme, and had a great time bonding and wrestling on the sand!

We took 21 Nippers to Branksome Chine for the beach Nationals. The weekend started with a group trip to the water park which was as much fun for the adults as it was for the children! One of the Branksome coaches said they would normally have cancelled training in those conditions, but I think it may actually have suited us and the other north coast Cornish clubs and we finished 14<sup>th</sup> club in the country and came home with a silver and a bronze medal.

We have also spent time working towards the Nipper Pathway awards and have had children completing their Bronze and Silver Awards so far. These awards pathways provide a structure to training and are great for the Nippers to work towards, the logbooks have been especially well received by some of our newer Nippers and those less keen

on the competition side of the sport. Hopefully the certificates and badges will arrive soon, and I can start giving them out.

# Safeguarding



Newquay Surf Lifesaving Club has a moral and legal duty of care to safeguard all children and vulnerable adults involved in its activities, from harm.

## What is safeguarding?

Safeguarding refers to the process of protecting children and vulnerable adults to provide safe and effective care. This includes all procedures designed to prevent harm to a child/vulnerable adult.

Children includes everyone under the age of 18 years old.

## What is child protection?

Child protection is part of the safeguarding process, protecting individual children identified as suffering or likely to suffer significant harm. This includes the child protection procedures which detail how to respond to concerns about a child.

## Designated Safeguarding Officer for NSLSC.

Sonya Macintosh is our designated Safeguarding Officer for Newquay Surf Lifesaving Club; the point of contact for anyone that is concerned about a child or vulnerable adult.

*Safeguarding is ultimately everybody's responsibility, and if you believe that a child or vulnerable adult is at risk of being abused this must be reported as soon as possible to myself as the Safeguarding officer. If the situation requires immediate action, please contact the police on 999.*

Our pledge is to be the best Club we can be. All Trustees are volunteers so are not paid, we work hard to manage a growing Club by listening and responding to our members and working collaboratively with governing bodies, always with the best interests to the Club at heart.

Key offices (excluding section Managers/assistants) will be up for re-election every two years to ensure resilience in the Club but appropriate democracy and governance.

## Senior Manager's Comments

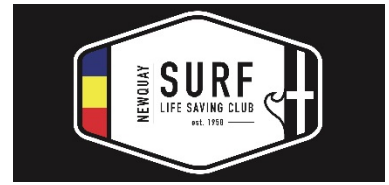
This year it's has definitely felt like a bit of normality has returned to our world and along with it surf lifesaving competitions.

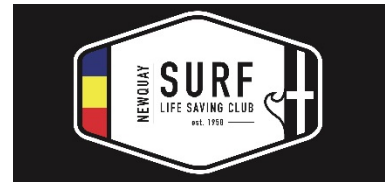
## **Youth Manager's Comments**

All our Youth have achieved so much this year, whether that's competing or showing commitment each week to train and improve their surf lifesaving skills and support other sections of the Club.

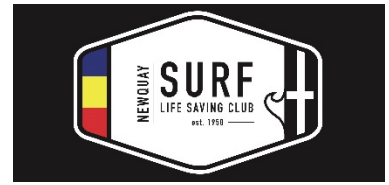
Thank you to all our amazing coaches, Competitions Manager and support team who have enabled our Youth to achieve so much. These volunteers give hours of their time whilst also working full time.

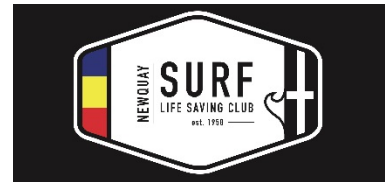

Thanks again for all that help with Sandhopper's and Newquay Surf lifesaving Club, I'm sure we are in for another top year.

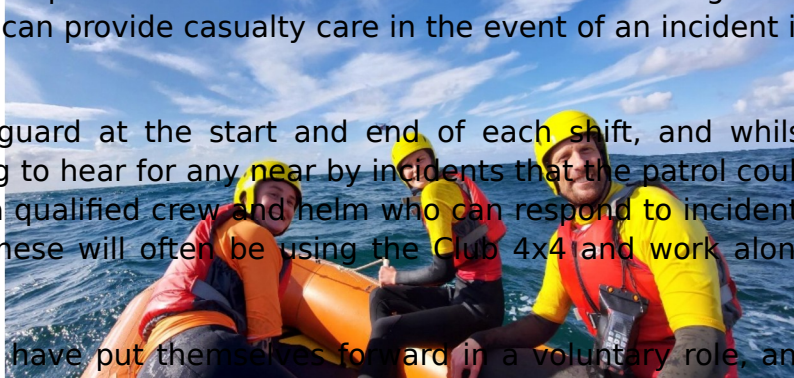

# Lifesaving Training and IRB Officer's Comments



Autumn 2021 saw the implementation of voluntary patrols at Fistral beach. The drive behind providing this cover was through the evidence of a need to provide safety cover for the public during busy weekends in Newquay. Behind this was also the vision of having a Clubhouse open once a week through the winter for members to access the Clubhouse, not only to patrol, but to train and socialise.

To make everyone aware of what the patrol involves I have summarised the key parts. A voluntary patrol is run in a similar way to how the RNLI lifeguard the beach during the summer season. There is a patrol captain who is the senior lifeguard equivalent who runs the patrol and deals with any multiagency response to an incident. Then there are the lifeguards, first responders and lifesavers, all who can provide casualty care in the event of an incident in the sea or on the shore.



The patrol will log on with the coastguard at the start and end of each shift, and whilst patrolling will have VHF radios scanning to hear for any near by incidents that the patrol could assist with. The patrol often will have a qualified crew and helm who can respond to incidents using the inshore rescue boat (IRB), these will often be using the Club 4x4 and work along side our flagged lifeguard areas.

All members who take part in a patrol have put themselves forward in a voluntary role, and they are members who have given up many hours, not just for the patrol itself but also given the time to become qualified and remain qualified through continuous profession development.

Throughout November to July the Club patrolled every Saturday with other patrols offered in busy holiday periods. The patrol from Easter through the summer then worked alongside the RNLI, offering support to their team where possible. This has built a strong working relationship between the lifesaving Club and the RNLI at Fistral beach.



Members have been part of various rescues. From multiple injuries, advisories given on where to swim and surf, to the more serious incidents such as people caught in rips and surfers taken out to sea on surf boards. The Club has also provided multiagency responses where the Club has worked along side the RNLI and Rescue 924 helicopter.

Through the relationship with 924 an opportunity was taken by the patrol team to visit the base and see a tour of the helicopter and how the asset/crew are used to provide cover for the beach.

The Club is a valuable training asset for the 924. This training will allow the patrol team to conduct training exercises using the IRB and members as casualties.

This has been completed twice at Fistral beach and we hope to continue to offer this training for both us and 924 in the future.



The patrol is a large, exciting part of the lifesaving Club. It is where all our many hours of training both in the water and the classroom can be put into practise, it is also where key skills such as teamwork, problem solving, leadership can all be developed and used on a frequent basis.

I hope that with all this mind that members continue to show their support for this amazing opportunity, by stepping up to take roles within the patrol system at Newquay lifesaving Club, volunteering their time and supporting the future patrols in any way possible.

If you feel that you can assist in the patrol, please contact me. The patrol is always looking for volunteers in all roles, and we are also always looking for funding for lifesaving equipment such as medical bags, boat maintenance and 4x4 improvements.

Newquay Surf Life Saving Club proactively trains members to ensure we have qualified, competent, and confident support for each category; this year saw a return to face-to-face delivery to members including new Sandhoppers parents taking Tube Rescue, Youth starting their journey towards Lifeguard status, and IRB. If you'd like to hear more or get involved please let your category lead know.

## Safeguarding Officer's Comments

Newquay Surf Lifesaving Club has a moral and legal duty of care to safeguard all children and vulnerable adults involved in its activities, from harm.

- The welfare of the child/vulnerable adult is paramount.
- Safeguarding is everyone's responsibility

### What is safeguarding?

Safeguarding refers to the process of protecting children and vulnerable adults to provide safe and effective care. This includes all procedures designed to prevent harm to a child/vulnerable adult.

Children includes everyone under the age of 18 years old.

## What is child protection?

Child protection is part of the safeguarding process, protecting individual children identified as suffering or likely to suffer significant harm. This includes the child protection procedures which detail how to respond to concerns about a child.



## Designated Safeguarding Officer for NSLSC.

I am the designated Safeguarding Officer for Newquay Surf Lifesaving Club. This means that I am the point of contact for anyone that is concerned about a child or vulnerable adult.

I have been the Club's designated safeguarding officer since July 2019. I currently work in the Public Protection arena and have done so for the past 15 years. I have a considerable amount of knowledge with regards to safeguarding issues. That said, I am always keen to improve on my knowledge and I frequently attend relevant courses in order to keep up to date with the latest safeguarding policies and procedures.

My role as safeguarding officer is to help ensure that children and vulnerable adults are safeguarded from any form of abuse. The role entails facilitating DBS checks, to review safeguarding policies and procedures, to co-ordinate any necessary focus groups along with the chair, and to act as a point of contact for any concerns with regards to safeguarding children/vulnerable adults from abuse.

Safeguarding issues are taken extremely seriously by the Club. Any safeguarding matter that gets reported is looked at swiftly and investigated by the Safeguarding focus group. This group was formed in 2018 and consists of a small group of select committee members.

The aim of the focus group is to discuss in detail any safeguarding issues that arise which involve individuals and where the information to be shared is considered to be sensitive and thus not appropriate to be discussed in depth within the larger forum of a full committee meeting. Having a small group of members with safeguarding experience means that the group can be convened promptly in order to discuss any safeguarding issues that have been raised, and to resolve them effectively in order to ensure that children and vulnerable adults are safeguarded. All safeguarding investigations are conducted with consultation from the SLSGB Safeguarding team.

*Safeguarding is ultimately everybody's responsibility, and if you believe that a child or vulnerable adult is at risk of being abused this must be reported as soon as possible to myself as the Safeguarding officer. If the situation requires immediate action, please contact the police on 999.*

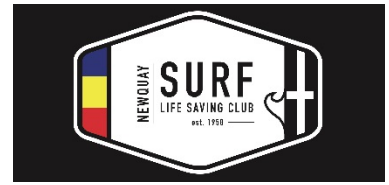

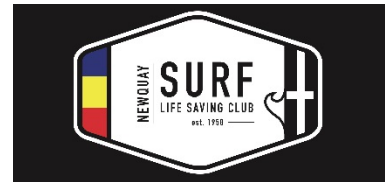

To partake in weekly training sessions for fitness, lifesaving skills and competition disciplines.

Alongside attending competitions at both a regional and National level.\*

The membership system, overseen by the Vice Chair, will be used for fees and paying/booking on events. This will be our source data for are members in the Club. This will align to the SLSGB database, overseen by the Secretary, that is added to annually to renew the memberships.

Alongside the above our Club will support social events throughout the year to encourage Club cohesion and fun but also were possible to support our wider community and raise funds for the Club.



### Safeguarding:

Our safety of our members comes first - each beach session is risk assessed by the section Manager and/or assistant Manager.

They have the delegation to decide on what takes place during a session. The management team will look for volunteers to support sessions but who supports a session/group is the decision of the section Manager. All supporting volunteers must complete the online SLSGB Safeguarding training.

The Committee will form a Safeguarding working group or Case Management Team to investigate any concerns or complaints in a confidential manner. This will be in line with SLSGB policies and guidance.

Safeguarding is everyone's responsibility - please get in touch if you have a concern relating to any member of the Club.

The Committee will not tolerate any behaviour that is not in line with our values.

Our pledge is to be the best Club we can be. All Trustees are volunteers so are not paid, we work hard to manage a growing Club by listening and responding to our members and working collaboratively with governing bodies, always with the best interests to the Club at heart.

Key offices (excluding section Managers/assistants) will be up for re-election every two years to ensure resilience in the Club but appropriate democracy and governance.

# Lifesaving Training and IRB Officer's Comments

2021 has been a challenging year for the lifesaving training, patrolling and Inshore Rescue Boat (IRB) section of the Club. With Covid-19 restrictions preventing most of our team activity in the early year a lot of momentum was lost from the summer patrolling season of 2020.

However, these sections of the Club have also taken some leaps and bounds forward in terms of sustainability and progression with members now progressing into new roles as qualified trainers and assessors. At the start of the club year I had Matt Love join as the Inshore Rescue Boat Lead and Joseph Robins undertake the lead in the delivery of lifesaving training qualifications. This has been a much-needed boost for these sections and great to see new faces delivering courses at the Club. Both these members have also achieved their SLSGB Trainer Assessor awards which will be a huge benefit to the onward success of the Club's lifesaving and IRB training programs.

The operation and training of the inshore rescue boat has been a challenge with Covid-19 due to the close proximity of individuals due to sessions. Once all government restrictions had been released training began and we saw the delivery of both a crewman and driver course. The new addition of our Ruth Lee manikins were great for being able to undertake casualty training and will be a great addition to future training and scenarios. We have been fortunate to have access to the region inshore rescue boat for the last 12 months which aids our training and hopefully this will continue due to the numbers of members currently involved. The inshore rescue boat has aged and our engine which is now looking at turning 12 is feeling tired and in need of an overhaul, fortunately we have secured further sponsorship from Charles French solicitors and with fundraising last year we have the funds set aside to rebuild the engine this winter in prep for a successful 2022 season. Unfortunately, there has been no racing again this season, I hope to see the racing return in 2022 where we will be looking to defend our Nationals Title from 2019. In 2020 we were due to race at the world lifesaving championships however due to covid-19 this was cancelled, fortunately flights were refunded, however we had to dispute the competition, accommodation and world lifesaving package fees to obtain a refund through the credit card companies after this was continuously rejected by the organising

company. Although thanks to the help of Julia Sharland I am happy to confirm that all those members who enrolled and paid fees received a full refund at the start of this year.



Following our 2020 patrolling season I had been optimistic that our winter patrolling during the 2020/2021 season would be as strong and continue to grow, however this was hampered by Covid-19 and the issues of being in enclosed buildings and vehicles during the cold UK winters. We have provided several evening patrols throughout the summer.

This year has been challenging for all of these 3 sections of the club and I am looking forward to seeing how they progress into the winter months where we see a lot of our training undertaken. I feel I have managed with the help of many others to grow these sections and train other members to make them sustainable without relying on an individual member. Therefore, I feel it is now time for a new face to lead the lifesaving training, IRB and patrolling role to continue growing these sections with new ideas and plans.

My name is Lisa Meredith and I am the Designated Safeguarding Officer for Newquay Surf Life Saving Club. This means that I am the point of contact for anyone who is concerned about a child or young person.

I have been the Club's designated Safeguarding Officer since July 2019. I currently work in the Public Protection arena and have done for the past 14 years. I have a vast amount of experience with regards to Safeguarding issues. That said, I am always keen to improve on my knowledge and frequently attend relevant courses in order to keep my knowledge current and up to date in order to provide the very best service for the role.

My role as Safeguarding Officer is to help ensure that children are safeguarded from any form of abuse. My role is to facilitate DBS checks, to review safeguarding policies and procedures, to co-ordinate any safeguarding focus groups along with the Chair, and to act as a point of contact for any queries or concerns with regards to safeguarding children from abuse. Safeguarding our nippers and youths from abuse is ultimately everyone's responsibility.

The Safeguarding 'focus group' is still in place and was formed in 2018. This consists of a small number of select committee members. The purpose of the group is to discuss any individual safeguarding or membership issues. Having a small group of members with safeguarding experience means that the group can be convened quickly if

necessary and discuss cases in depth to ensure that prompt safeguarding measures are taken if required. Further details of this group can be found below.



We have had a number of new volunteers this year. I have applied for 16 DBS checks to date this year.

Yet again through the intricate planning by our dedicated coaches and the support of parent helpers, the summer beach sessions have been a great success. My son has certainly enjoyed the sessions that took place on Great Western Beach and at Porth.

Thank you to all, particularly our coaches for the intricate planning of each session, ensuring that our nippers and youths are safe at all times.
