Objectives and Activities

The object of the charity shall be to provide for the inhabitants of Doddington and the neighbourhood in the interests of social welfare facilities for recreation and leisure-time occupation, for the purpose of relaxation and with the object of improving the conditions of life for the said inhabitants, on land known as 'Clapham Common Recreation Field' and on any adjacent land that the committee may manage in the future.

The Recreation Committee are committed to enabling as many people as possible to have use of the Pavilion and Recreation Field. The Committee continue to provide facilities on the field for; football, both senior and youth football, currently there are three pitches at the ground, one full size and two junior pitches. A croquet lawn which is kept in condition by Fenland Mallets Croquet Club.

The hall is in regular use by; GirlGuiding Doddington (Guides, Brownies, Rainbows) have their weekly meetings in the Pavilion and the Committee are keen to accommodate any improvements and alterations. Fitness classes are held weekly. Doddington WI hold their monthly meetings in the hall, their membership being around 45 ladies. The Recreation Committee host prize Bingo monthly.

Achievements and Performance

Pavilion Housekeeping and Improvement

No further improvements have been made this year; however, the Pavilion continues to be maintained to a high standard.

Field Maintenance

The old rotting pergola has been taken down and removed, ensuring that the outside space is safe and tidy. The new grass cutting machinery has made the work of our voluntary grounds people considerably easier and more efficient. We hope this will attract new volunteers to help maintain the ground.

Playground

The recent ROSPA report has highlighted that the playing surface requires maintenance and that the swing is to be kept under regular observation for signs of deterioration. Repairs have been made to the small spinning apparatus.

Sports

Doddington Utd have had an excellent start to their first season, achieving promotion. March Town Athletic Football Club continue to use the field for youth football.

A thriving croquet group has formed and meets weekly for practice, regularly boasting 15+ attendees.

Hire and Lettings

Isle of Ely Federation Women's Institute have made regular use of the Pavilion for Federation meetings and for six day sessions patchwork course. The clean, warm, comfortable surroundings are frequently praised.

Key village events use the Recreation Ground as their venue; Doddington Carnival and Doddington Village Summer Show, attracting crowds from the village and surrounding area. The Guides, Brownies and Rainbows have their meetings on Tuesday and Wednesday evenings. Doddington WI hold their monthly meetings in the hall and have made further bookings for craft activities.

Financial Review

Total receipts on unrestricted funds were £18,697.79. A total of £22,993.00 was received from The Football Federation grant to purchase grass cutting equipment. The net income for the year was £2771.10.

It is the Recreation Committee's policy to maintain a balance on unrestricted funds, which is £5000 in the reserve bank accounts to cover emergency situations that may arise from time to time. The balance of £25,331.55 is held on unrestricted funds, after designations, at the year-end exceeded its target.

Structure, Governance and Management

The charity is governed by a constitution which states that a trust is made up of committee members who are elected at an annual AGM. The committee are responsible for making decisions on all matters of general concern and importance to the running and upkeep of the Pavilion and Ground.

The constitution states that there should be at least three custodian trustees at any one time and these shall be elected by the current trustees. The custodian trustees will endeavor to ensure that the ground is used for the purpose of sport and recreation only.

The Committee continue to provide facilities on the field for; football, both senior and youth football, currently there are three pitches at the ground, one full size and two junior pitches. An excellent cricket square, regularly maintained to a high standard. A croquet lawn which is kept in condition by Fenland Mallets Croquet Club.

The hall is in regular use by; GirlGuiding Doddington (Guides, Brownies, Rainbows) have their weekly meetings in the Pavilion and the Committee are keen to accommodate any improvements and alterations. Fitness classes are held weekly. Doddington WI hold their monthly meetings in the hall, their membership being around 45 ladies.

Achievements and Performance

Pavilion Housekeeping and Improvement

The replacement floor has been met with approval from regular hirers and one-off bookings, also enabling the hall to be kept clean easier. The replacement fold up chairs that are stored on a trolley have made it simple to remove them from the hall, creating more space for activities.

Field Maintenance

A successful bid was made to AMEY for replacement fencing around the perimeter of the carpark. The carpark and playground now have a new low maintenance fence which should last for many years.

Another successful bid was made to the FA for new grass cutting machinery. The new machinery should ensure the cutting of the field is an easier job going forwards. The machinery is yet to be received.

Playground

The playground has been cleaned and new signage displayed. The recent ROSPA report has highlighted that the playing surface requires maintenance and that the swing is to be kept under regular observation for signs of deterioration.

Sports

Doddington Utd have reformed after a one year break. March Town Athletic Football Club continue to use the field for youth football.

In the light of a significant reduction of cricket being played at the ground this season and Mel Pooley retiring from the square maintenance, it has been agreed that the cricket square can be played over by football.

Hire and Lettings

Isle of Ely Federation Women's Institute have made regular use of the Pavilion for Federation meetings and for six day sessions patchwork course. The clean, warm, comfortable surroundings are frequently praised.

Two weddings are booked for the summer of 2022, as well as the return of Doddington Carnival and new for this year, Doddington Village Summer Show.

The Guides, Brownies and Rainbows have their meetings on Tuesday and Wednesday evenings. Doddington WI hold their monthly meetings in the hall and have made further bookings for craft activities.

Financial Review

Total receipts on unrestricted funds were £9066.93. A total of £24844.93 was received from grants to purchase replacement exterior fencing and new recycled plastic picnic benches. £10667 of this was a COVID related grant from Fenland District Council. The net income for the year was £7765.24. This includes the grant from FDC and the contribution towards the new fencing.

It is the Recreation Committee's policy to maintain a balance on unrestricted funds, which is £5000 in the reserve bank accounts to cover emergency situations that may arise from time to time. The balance of £27485.24 is held on unrestricted funds, after designations, at the year-end exceeded its target.

Structure, Governance and Management

The charity is governed by a constitution which states that a trust is made up of committee members who are elected at an annual AGM. The committee are responsible for making decisions on all matters of general concern and importance to the running and upkeep of the Pavilion and Ground.

The constitution states that there should be at least three custodian trustees at any one time and these shall be elected by the current trustees. The custodian trustees will endeavor to ensure that the ground is used for the purpose of sport and recreation only.

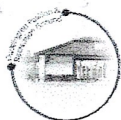
