The trustees and a number of our contacts are directly involved with the Prayer Alert weekly email and website. It marked its 17th anniversary in 2022.

Our Director is on the Leadership Team and Exec Group of International Prayer Connect – a coalition of prayer and mission organisations and networks from around the world.

Despite the restricted travel, and sickness that affected our Director - once recovered, he was able to participate in events that drew together delegates from all the continents.

In partnership with IPC, Crosswinds contributed to a hybrid World Prayer Assembly in Jakarta, with presenters and worship teams on site, and a huge worldwide gathering online.

Crosswinds has built regional connections around the world, during this year that are contributing to the Crosswinds PrayerHub vision.

We have contributed to a number of prayer and mission resources and media / programming that has been utilised and viewed by many millions of people around the world.


