# 1<sup>st</sup> Endon Scout group Annual General Meeting

## 1. Introduction and welcome

Chair welcomed members of the Group Scout Association, parents, carers and guests.

## 2. Apologies for absence

Chair noted that apologies were received from Ryan and Rachel for their absence.

## 3. Governance topics

Chair explained that this part of the meeting was to make sure that the Scout Group foundations were in good order.

### 3a. Approve the minutes of the Annual General Meeting held on 12<sup>th</sup> March 2024.

Chair explained that the Group Trustee Board had reviewed the minutes of last year's AGM held on 12<sup>th</sup> March 2024. It was proposed that the minutes were taken as read and it was agreed that they were a true record of that meeting.

### 3b. Adopt the model constitution from Policy, Organisation and Rules (POR)

Chair stated that in line with the recommendation from The Scout Association, the Group Trustee Board proposed that the model constitution for a Scout Group from Chapter 5c of Policy, Organisation and Rules was adopted. It was made clear that a copy of this was available for review from Chris.

### 3c. Note the Group's financial year

Chair stated that the charity's financial year was 1 April to 31 March.

### 3d. Agree the number of members that may be appointed to the Trustee Board

Chair stated that following good practice recommendations from the Charity Governance Code, Policy Organisation and Rules which stated that Trustee Boards

should have a minimum of 5, and no more than 12, Trustees in total, should be adopted. That included *ex officio* and co-opted Trustees.

The Group Scout Group agreed that up to 12 people were appointed.

### 3e. Agree the quorum for future meetings of the Group Scout Council

Chair explained that the Group Scout Trustees must agree its quorum - the minimum number of Group Scout trustees' members that must be present at Group Scout Trustees meetings. The outgoing Trustee Board recommended the quorum should be set at 5 people for future meetings of the Group Scout Trustees.

It was asked if the Group Scout trustees approved that recommendation.
