Summary of the main activities undertaken for the public benefit in relation to these objects (include within this section the statutory declaration that trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit)

The PTA had a strong and encouraging year, marking a return to form after the challenges of the Covid-19 pandemic and the ongoing impact of the cost-of-living crisis, which had affected the previous three years. Throughout the year, the PTA ran a full programme of events designed to engage and benefit parents, children, and staff, in line with our charitable objectives.

In the autumn term, the Christmas Fair was a highlight, raising £4,700 while providing a joyful and festive occasion for the whole school community. Additionally, the children's Christmas card designs raised over £500, celebrating creativity while contributing to PTA funds.

The spring term featured the ever-popular PTA Quiz Night, which raised over £1,500, and a children's disco, which brought joy to pupils and raised £84. The disco ticket prices were intentionally kept low to ensure accessibility and inclusivity for all families. A new event, Musical Bingo Night, was introduced this year in place of the historical Comedy Night, raising £183 and receiving positive feedback.

In the summer term, the Summer Fair, held after Sports Day, was expanded to become a larger community celebration, raising over £1,500. A major success of the year was the sponsored "Wild Run," which raised £9,900 to support the development of a new outdoor learning building. This was a significant achievement and reflected the outstanding efforts of our pupils in securing sponsorship.

The PTA also strengthened its links with the wider community by attending the Blackheath and Shamley Green village fairs. The Sharks Football Club continued its valued role within the school, raising £700 through Saturday morning sessions. However, it faces an uncertain future due to a shortage of volunteers.

New initiatives launched this year include Sunday Evening Yoga and Mothers' Meetings, which fostered parent relationships and raised over £1,000. Another notable addition was the inaugural Dad's Camping Weekend for Reception and Year 1 families, raising over £600 and providing a memorable bonding experience.

Additional income was generated through ongoing parent donations, workplace giving schemes, and the "Give as You Live" initiative, collectively raising £1,000. We were also fortunate to receive a generous donation of £1,200 from NISA, kindly facilitated by Shamley Green Stores.

The Trustees confirm that they have complied with their duty under section 17(5) of the Charities Act 2011 to have due regard to the guidance published by the Charity Commission concerning the operation of the public benefit requirement.

We are enormously grateful for the invaluable contribution made by our dedicated volunteers. A significant number of parents and carers give their time throughout the year to help organise and run events, serve on the PTA committee, act as class representatives, and support in many other ways. We also appreciate the continued support of the school staff, whose involvement is essential to the success of our activities.

In addition, we extend our sincere thanks to the local businesses and parents who generously donate raffle and auction prizes, advertise in our materials, and contribute via their community giving programmes. These donations significantly enhance our fundraising efforts and reflect the strong and valued relationship we have with the wider community.

As outlined above, this year has been a highly successful one for the PTA, both in terms of fundraising outcomes and in revitalising volunteer engagement and school community spirit. Our programme of events and activities not only raised significant funds but also helped rebuild connections within the school community after a challenging few years.

A major focus of the year has been fundraising for the new Outdoor Learning Building. The majority of the funds raised this year, along with surplus funds brought forward from previous years, have been earmarked for this project, which has now received planning permission. This marks a significant milestone, and we look forward to seeing the long-term benefit this facility will bring to the school.

In addition to large-scale fundraising efforts, the PTA continued to support a number of much-loved annual traditions. We funded the Easter Egg Hunt and contributed to the cost of Year 6 hoodies and yearbooks, although additional donations were sought to help offset rising costs. We also funded several enrichment activities for pupils across the school, including Earthsong workshops, Bollywood Dance sessions, and Internet Safety talks. These experiences help to broaden the curriculum and contribute to pupils' personal development and cultural awareness.

Overall, the PTA has made strong progress this year in supporting the school, its pupils, and families, and we are proud of the positive impact our work continues to have across the school community.



- C) Provide and assist in the provision of facilities for education at the school (not normally provided by LEA)

In deciding which activities to run in the year, the trustees of the PTA (committee) considered the guidance issued by the charity commission on public benefit. The trustees wanted to balance the need to have events that would raise funds for the charity and enable us to meet our objectives stated above.

The school year 2022-23 was the first one when events and socialising fully returned to normal after Covid. Unfortunately, in 2022-23 the cost-of-living issues and inflation have had a marked effect, both on people's disposable income and on the supplier costs involved with events. It is a tough environment in which to be fundraising at the moment.

Given the external factors affecting families we decided for the second year in a row to place a high priority on our first stated objective as a charity, which is to "Develop more extended relationships between staff, parents and others associated with the school". We have kept our events as inclusive and affordable as possible, and as a result some events were run at smaller margins than historically (or a small loss).

We ran our usual calendar of events with the exception of comedy night in the first term, which was not well attended last year.

The Christmas fair as always was a great event with lots of in-house and external stalls, entertainments and refreshments, and festive activities to enjoy. We raised over £5000 profit. The usual children-designed Christmas cards added a further £355 to our festive fund-raising efforts.

Through the spring and summer term we continued our usual calendar of events – the school disco, quiz and sports day BBQ all went ahead, as did Shamley Green and Womersley village fetes. Combined they raised nearly £2000. It is worth noting that although we do not make large sums at the fetes (this year we made a small loss after investing in some new kit), the fete committees often make a generous donation direct to the school as a thank you. So this remains an important community event to be part of, which benefits the school.

In June we had a "bonus" summer ball. Our summer ball is normally held on alternate years which means this year would not have been a ball year. However Sarah Rowden (a PTA stalwart and ex Vice-chair who was in her final year at the school) wanted to arrange a really special ball in the school grounds. Sarah's intention was not to make a big profit, rather to throw an amazing event at an inclusive price and to break even - any profit would be a bonus. We had an amazing evening with a live band, food, drinks, auction and raffle. Unfortunately at the time of writing (when I have had to draw a line under the ball transactions for the purpose of reporting) the ball is reporting a loss of just over £1300. A reasonable chunk of this deficit seems to be due to non-payment from some sponsors and attendees which is disappointing. Sarah is continuing to investigate and chase these payments, so we hope that the picture will improve.

We continue to benefit from generous donations from parents through workplace giving, although this has notably reduced this year (just over £1k). We have also had some very generous donations from local businesses (£600 from the company that runs Shamley Green stores, and £1000 from Sports Stars towards the new sheds). Amazon Smile / Give as You Live / Stikins initiatives all contributed as well (we note with disappointment that Amazon Smile has now ended).

WSG sharks football club raised over £570 this year – thanks as always to the parent volunteers involved.

We are very grateful to the huge amount of support that a large number of parents have given by offering their services for fundraisers, or volunteering to help organise them. Without this support, the fundraisers simply wouldn't have happened.

In addition, we very much appreciate the donations of adverts/raffle prizes and auction prizes that are offered up by local businesses and parents to the school. This year this included some generous donations from some local businesses via their Community Giving programmes. A great deal of income is generated from this and it is very pleasing to have such amazing support from the local community.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

As detailed above, the fundraisers and events run this year were very successful in terms of helping the children, parents, staff and wider community to get back together, rebuild connections and welcome newcomers as we started to come out of the pandemic. In terms of fundraising, this year was reasonable – we have had a tough backdrop of cost-of-living and post-pandemic issues to contend with, so we consciously chose to be less profit-focussed.

The year started with a significant cash surplus brought forward from the previous year, and we have raised over £10,000 profit during the year. We have been able to donate nearly £20k to the school this year, a record since the pandemic which is a great achievement!

It has been fantastic to pay for two “big ticket” items this year - another 60 Chromebooks, and the new sheds. In addition we have funded a range of wonderful extra-curricular workshops: Divali drumming, Hedgehogs, Earthsong and the Safety Show among them.

As usual we funded the Easter Egg hunt in the school grounds, and the Year 6 leavers’ hoodies and yearbooks. We also invested in some new kit, including a new pair of football goal posts for “beat the goalie”.

In deciding which activities to run in the year, the trustees of the PTA (committee) considered the guidance issued by the charity commission on public benefit. The trustees wanted to balance the need to have events that would raise funds for the charity and enable us to meet our objectives stated above.

After 2 difficult years of the pandemic when we were largely unable to socialise in person, finally 2021 - 22 was the year when we could start to get back to some sort of normality! After such a long period with limited events, we felt that it was particularly important to focus on fulfilling our mission to build relationships and support the school and local community. As a result some events were run at smaller margins than usual (or a small loss).

We got started with our "Welcome BBQ" to help new parents get to know the school community. Comedy night also made a welcome return in the autumn term – uptake was quite low as the pandemic was far from over, and many did not feel comfortable socialising. But it felt so important to get back to providing this opportunity to enjoy our school community – and a great night out!

We were so excited to see the return of the Christmas Fair! Always a wonderful event, we were particularly glad that it has become a largely outdoor event – we suspect that many people felt more comfortable to attend an outdoor event as the Omicron covid wave took hold. The fair was a wonderful event with lots of in-house and external stalls, entertainments and refreshments, and festive activities to enjoy.

Through the spring and summer term we continued our usual calendar of events – the school disco, quiz and sports day BBQ all went ahead, as did Shamley Green and Womersley village fetes. It is worth noting that although we do not make large sums at the fetes, the fete committees often make a generous donation direct to the school as a thank you – so this remains an important community event to be part of, and one which benefits the school.

Then in July, we finally had our Ball! Way back in summer 2020, nearly 100 of our parents and school community purchased tickets for the summer ball. Two years later, almost all of them – and lots more – finally got to attend. We had a fabulous night with a double decker bus providing lifts to the venue, food, drink and dancing and a raffle.

WSG sharks football club was able to run again this year, providing a fun and relaxed football club environment to children from the area, thanks to our parent volunteers.

We are very grateful to the huge amount of support that a large number of parents have given by offering their services for fundraisers, or volunteering to help organise them. Without this support, the fundraisers simply wouldn't have happened.

In addition, we very much appreciate the donations of adverts/raffle prizes and auction prizes that are offered up by local businesses and parents to the school. This year this included some generous donations from some local businesses via their Community Giving programmes. A great deal of income is generated from this and it is very pleasing to have such amazing support from the local community.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

As detailed above, the fundraisers and events run this year were very successful in terms of helping the children, parents, staff and wider community to get back together, rebuild connections and welcome newcomers as we started to come out of the pandemic. They were also a great success in terms of fundraising.

The year started with a significant cash surplus brought forward from the previous year, and we have raised £14,000 profit during the year.

Over half of this profit has been presented to the school. We have been able to pay for a Bollywood Drumming Workshop to help celebrate Diwali, 30 Chromebooks to enhance the children's ICT learning, the Easter Egg hunt and the usual Year 6 Leavers celebration.




