**Trustees' Report for year ended 30<sup>th</sup> June 2025**

During the Rotary year the Rotary Club of St Helens continued its programme of community service, fundraising and charitable support across St Helens and the surrounding area. The year built upon the strong foundations established in recent years, including the Club's Centenary celebrations and the award of the King's Award for Voluntary Service in March 2024.

The Trust's income was primarily generated through established fundraising activities including the Rainford Bonfire and Fireworks event, the Santa's Sleigh programme and the Royal Birkdale Charity Golf Day. These events were well supported by members, volunteers and the wider community and enabled the Trust to provide financial assistance to local charities, voluntary organisations and Rotary international activities.

The Club continued to support Rotary's global End Polio Now campaign through awareness including the planting of crocus bulbs for World Polio Day.

Supporting young people remained an important focus. Members volunteered in three local primary schools to assist children with reading and literacy development and delivered a careers and education awareness event designed to broaden employment aspirations. Intergenerational initiatives also took place during the year, including projects linking primary schools with care homes where pupils created and shared Christmas cards with residents.

Youth leadership was further encouraged through the RotaKids programme at Holy Cross Primary School, helping children develop confidence, teamwork and community service values.

The Trust also supported community wellbeing initiatives including Unzip The Silence, a project approved by the Director of Health for St Helens Council and the Merseyside & Cheshire Clinical Commissioning Group. The project forms part of the borough's mental health and wellbeing strategy and uses QR code technology to connect individuals directly with appropriate support services.

A highlight of the year was the Community Impact event held at The Living Well where local charities and community groups presented their work and outlined how Rotary support could strengthen their impact. Following the event the Trust made several direct grants to support community initiatives across the borough.

Throughout the year the Trustees ensured that the Trust's resources were applied in accordance with Charity Commission guidance on public benefit, supporting projects that alleviate hardship, promote wellbeing, support education and strengthen community cohesion.

The Trustees are satisfied that the Rotary Club of St Helens Trust Fund remains financially sound and well positioned to continue delivering charitable benefit to the local community.

**Trustees' Report for year ended 30<sup>th</sup> June 2024**

Following on President Paul's 18 month's period in office, President Simon took over on 1 1 2023 for his 18 months term, the final 12 months, of course, being the Centenary Year of the Rotary Club of St Helens. The Centenary Year began with the 100<sup>th</sup> Charter Dinner celebrations, held at Saints RLFC on the 22<sup>nd</sup> July 2023. It was a most successful and well attended event, and the guest speaker for the evening was Nikki Scott, Vice President of Rotary International.

Soon after, it was business as usual for President Simon as he presided over several well-established events, including the Rainford Bonfire and Fireworks Night, St Helens University College Graduation and Award ceremony at St Helens Parish Church, and, not forgetting the Santa's Sleigh Christmas programme when the beautifully refurbished sleigh proudly toured the streets of St Helens. He even found time to help the Club regain the annual Bowls Trophy from Widnes Rotary Club!

On 18<sup>th</sup> December 2023 there was unexpected good news when an Early Day Motion congratulating the Rotary Club of St Helens on their Centenary Year was given by St Helens MP Connor McGinn at the House of Commons. He later spoke at a Club meeting at the Griffin Inn and presented a framed EDM certificate to President Simon.

In the background Immediate Past President Paul had been working on introducing a Rotary RotaKids Club to St Helens, and on 9<sup>th</sup> February 2024 the Holy Cross Primary School RotaKids Club was launched. There had been close collaboration between the Rotary Club of St Helens and Holy Cross Primary School for a number of years and it is hoped that the RotaKids Club will help increase the awareness of younger members of the importance of the community to St Helens.

A leading fundraiser for 'End Polio Now', the Club, once again, hosted an Indian Evening at The Blue Mango in Rainhill, this year attended by Dr Odrej Mach on behalf of the World Health Organisation. Sadly, Past DG Colin Ince was too ill to attend the event which he had initiated several years earlier. As the event attracts 'match funding' the event has raised well in excess of £25k over a number of years.

In a Centenary Year of many highlights, unquestionably the 14<sup>th</sup> March 2024 at St Helens Town Hall, when the Club was presented with the Kings Award for Voluntary Service by Lord Lieutenant of Merseyside, Mark Blundell, was the proudest. How fitting that an organisation committed to serving its community for 100 years should receive such an important honour in its Centenary Year!

Very sadly, we lost Past District Governor and Past Club President Colin Ince to higher office in the same month, and several tributes were paid to him at his funeral on 16<sup>th</sup> April, including an eloquent tribute by President Simon highlighting his legacy to our Club through his trustee roles with Rotary Shoebox and Disaster Aid UK & Ireland, together with his End Polio Now and Healthy in St Helens initiatives.

On 29<sup>th</sup> April 2024, Rotary District Conference returned to Llandudno for the first time since the Covid epidemic. Although it was a shorter conference than usual, delegates had a most enjoyable weekend.

There was still time for President Simon to preside over two of the most popular and longstanding events in the Rotary Calendar, the Rotary District 1285 Disability Sports Day at Sutton Academy Centre, and, the Rotary Charity Golf Day at Royal Birkdale.

But, for Immediate Past President Paul, and President Simon, I suspect the gloriously sunny afternoon of Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> May will last long in their memories. It was a most fitting end to a splendid Centenary Year when Paul and Simon proudly represented the Rotary Club of St Helens at a Garden Party hosted by King Charles in recognition of the recipients of his early honours' lists. What a Centenary Year!



**Trustees' Report for year ended 30<sup>th</sup> June 2023**

In the interests of expediency, the 99<sup>th</sup> Rotary Year for our Club was shared between two Presidents, Paul from 1 7 2022, and Simon from 1 1 2023. As a result, both Presidents served terms of 18 months each, with President Simon leading the Club towards its Centenary Year.

One of President Paul's most lasting initiatives has been, in conjunction with St Helens Borough Council, the creation of a Heritage Trail identifying 12 historic sites in St Helens, each recognised with a plaque and QR code spelling out key historic information. The sites include the Totally Wicked Stadium, home of St Helens (Saints) rugby league team that just happened to become World Champions in 2022/23! There are many more and President Paul explained the reason succinctly: 'The purpose of the Heritage Trail is to increase the whole community's awareness of how St Helens became a unique, pioneering and innovative industrial town taking its place on the world stage. It is hoped that the Trail will stir up a sense of identity, self-worth and hope throughout the borough, whilst also attracting more visitors to St Helens.'

Another of President Paul's endearing initiatives was to bring together pupils of two local schools with residents of two care homes in St Helens. Each pupil more or less adopted a local care home resident and decorated Christmas cards with pictures and a personal message. The initiative has been extended to parent birthdays, together with Father's Day and Mother's Day special messages.


Meanwhile, on the fundraising trail, President Paul presided over what was probably the best ever attended Rainford Bonfire and Fireworks Event, whilst, at the same time, quite possibly achieving the greatest single event fundraising total of more than £14k in the Club's history!

Although President Simon would need to spend much of his six months planning for the Centenary Year, this did not stop him from supporting all the usual events together with a number of new initiatives, including Tree Planting at Sherdley Park in conjunction with Mersey Forest, and a Youth team building event at Pennington Flash in conjunction with Salford Sailing Group. President Simon also found time to support the Rotary Club of Sandbach with their Rise Against Hunger Meal Pack. But, unquestionably, one of the highlights and milestones reached in April was at Royal Birkdale, when the Golf Charity Day passed the total of £100k in funds raised over a period of more than 20 years. President Simon was in attendance and presented Ken Stringer, the organiser for all of those 20 plus years, with a well-deserved memento in recognition.

Sadly, our Club lost a further two former Presidents to higher service during the Rotary year.

Although the 99<sup>th</sup> Rotary Year will be remembered for a number of considerable achievements, it is perhaps the recognition of the Club's role in the community that will be the most lasting legacy. In September 2022 the Club was nominated for the Pride of St Helens Community Impact Award and received the award in November at the award ceremony held at the Totally Wicked Stadium. In October 2022 the Club was nominated for the Queen's Award for Voluntary Service, but following the sad passing of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth 11 a final decision has understandably been delayed. Furthermore, in May 2023 the Club received the Mayors Award for Services to our Community. The word community reflects the important role that the Community Team, so effectively led by Trustee Alan Dickinson, has had in receiving this recognition. The ultimate recognition will, of course, be receiving the newly named King's Award for Voluntary Service, an award which would be a fitting tribute in any year, but, particularly special in the Club's Centenary Year!

**Rotary Club of St.Helens Trust Fund**  
**Trustees' Report for year ended 30<sup>th</sup> June 2022**

Following the end of Covid lockdowns, and after more than 18 months of very limited fundraising activities, the Club was back with a bang at the annual Rainford Bonfire and Fireworks event. As St Helens Rotary Club was one of only a few organisations holding such events in 2021, we recorded our best result ever with a surplus of more than £11k!

President Paul wasted no time in resurrecting established initiatives such as assisting with children's reading at a local school, supporting the local Poppy Appeal, and, of course, relaunching Santa's Sleigh, a very popular community favourite. In addition he instigated several litter picks along the historical Sankey Canal, and a number of innovative projects utilising the benefits of QR codes across the community. One of the projects involves an ongoing collaboration with St Helens Council in identifying up to twelve Heritage sites and providing quick and informative data through easily accessible QR codes at each site. Another very successful project has involved children colouring and messaging Rotary branded Christmas cards to local residents of a local care home, many of whom receive few, if any, greeting cards. A spin-off from this project has been to involve schoolchildren in completing other cards such as for Father's Day, and including within the card a QR code which links to various men's health and wellbeing sites e.g., prostate awareness. Another initiative will provide for similar messaging on Mother's Day cards.

The concept of utilising QR codes had already been established during Covid when Council volunteers and staff were faced with questions from attendees to vaccination centres about any information available on foodbanks and mental health issues; Rotary suggested producing a QR Code community poster which subsequently could be found across a variety of town centre locations such as the bus and railway stations.

Sadly, at the end of 2021 the Club lost a former President to higher service.

The first half of 2022 saw two more record-breaking fundraisers, the End Polio Now Indian Evening raising almost £2k, and, the Royal Birkdale Golf Day, raising more than £11k. Plans are in place in the second half of 2022 to hold a Dragon's Den event to help distribute funds raised during 2021/22 Rotary year.
