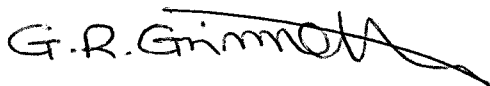
Independent examiner's statement

Literacy and numeracy resources are an important part of our contributions, and so again this year we've provided handwriting resources, maths resources, and phonics resources.

In addition, we have purchased two new smart boards, bought a scooter rack and funded the full refurbishment of the fitness trail around the school field.

We are proud to have provided these things that would not have been possible within the school budget.

Whilst there is likely to be a potential reduction in fundraising for 20/21 due to possible further restrictions these funds should still allow the PA to make purchases for the school and the children during the upcoming year. It will be necessary to review the spending approach in the future.
