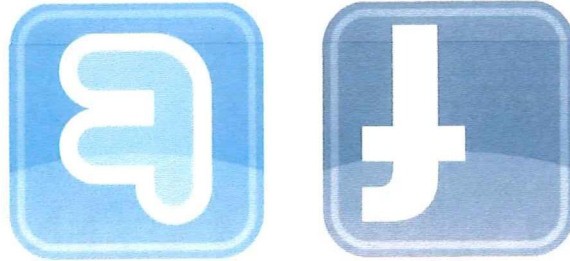

Minutes of 18th Gradbach Scout Camp Annual Meeting Held at Gradbach Scout Camp on Sunday 6th March 2022

Minutes of the Last Meeting:

The minutes of the 16th Annual General Meeting were agreed as a true and correct record.

Matters Arising:

There were no matters arising from the previous meeting other than a date error on the date of the previous meeting.

Chairman:

Mark welcomed everyone to the meeting and thanked all those present (and all those who had volunteered) for their valued contributions during the previous year. Mark apologised for not being around much in 2021 due to outside commitments, but commented on how humbling he found it to see what is continually done by the Gradbach team and District helpers. He commented on how resilient the site had been throughout COVID restrictions and that we hopefully were now looking towards a better year.

Treasurer Report:

Treasurer's Report for the Financial Year Ending 31st December 2021

John reported that 2021 was a year that continued to be adversely affected as a result of Covid restrictions, though much less so than in 2020. It was great to see the site getting back to some semblance of normality in terms of visitor numbers and Gradbach's volunteer helpers still offering their essential services to keep everything running smoothly.

The campsite started the year with total funds of £182k and ended the year with funds of £215k.

Essential maintenance and some development projects have been carried out, e.g. completion of the new camping pods at a total cost of £14k (less £11k of grant contribution), fabrication of a dedicated fuel store £5k, and the installation of three wood burning stoves at £4k. The cash flow has also been helped by the receipt £33k Covid assistance grants. The site continues to be in a financially healthy position allowing further major improvement projects to be undertaken in the coming years.

A more detailed picture of the accounts including some pretty bar and pie charts were included in the annual report.

The accounts had been audited by Gordon Simmonds and would be presented to the High Peak District Scout Council Executive Committee at its AGM for signing by that governing body.

John said that he would like to extend Gradbach's thanks to Gordon for the time he puts aside each year to do the audit. This was the last year Gordon would be auditing our accounts and John said a letter of thanks would be appreciated. Simon said he would action this if an address could be provided. A new auditor would be required for the next years accounts.

Paul Read commented that it was good to see that even without the various COVID grants that we would still have broken even due to the management of expenditure during the last year.

Warden Report :

Our 2021 season finally got going in June following the Covid shutdown. Business was slow at first but did pick up in the Autumn term with many of our local groups using the site. It was also lovely to welcome 1st Buxton & 3rd Buxton for their Summer camps in July.

A number of events were cancelled in addition to summer camps, including the 40th Border Hike and the Essex Scout marathon. The majority of groups who cancelled their bookings have since rebooked and carried forward their deposits.

Since opening in June to the end of December we completed 23 farmhouse nights, 25 cottage nights, 36 camping pod nights and 2316 camping nights.

Maintenance works were completed at the site during 2020, included the new manufacture and installation of the new fuel store, the progression of the farmhouse development to the detailed design stage and the installation of the two new camping pods on site 18, for which we were successful in securing £7500 funding. They have already proved to be a hit with local groups and visiting DofE leaders. Planned works for 2022 include the installation of a new borehole and an upgrade to our site water distribution pipework.

The Duty Warden rota, which usually runs from Easter until the end of October was again scrapped for another year but we do look forward to welcoming old and new friends to join us as duty wardens again, later this year.

I would like to thank everyone involved with the site, but in particular I would like to mention: Simon Davies, who has for the last four years been our booking secretary and dealt with the year of cancelled bookings, organising refunds and trying his level best to maintain a social media interest in the site. Thank you very much Simon.

And following last year's AGM we have welcomed Mel Babington to the role, who has taken to it, like a 'duck to water'. Thank you, Mel, for volunteering in the first place and for all you do as a first point of contact for the site.

Thanks to our committee, chaired by Mark Babington, to our Treasurer John Pritchard, secretary Simon Tony & Nick who expertly look after everything 'technical'. My thanks also go to the Grabdach Committee who continue to play a valuable role in helping guide the site through recent challenging times.

2022 looks like it will be a very busy year as groups catch up with events and we have already held a successful 'Chilly Challenge' camp. I am still of the opinion that it might take a year or so to get fully back to our 2019 levels of activity and income levels and hopefully at the third time of asking, we can hold the 40th Border Hike event in September.

As of June 2021 the Gradbach / HPDS Constitutions had been revised whereby the remainder of the Gradbach Scout Camp Committee was elected as 'Council Members' to facilitate charity commission requirements. As such each of the HPDS groups would not have an elected member on the Gradbach Scout Camp Committee. If desired they would however be welcome at our meetings and it was agreed that the Gradbach Secretary would still send them copies of our minutes for information. Outside of that they would have the opportunity to be updated / involved in the Gradbach goings on at HPDS District Executive Meetings.

John P would require contact details of the Council Members in order to be able to update the charity commissions details.

District Commissioner:

None as the position was currently vacant.

Any Other Business:

Allison said that she had someone in mind who may be willing to take on the role of auditing the Gradbach accounts and would report back at the next meeting.
Mark presented Rushworth 'the younger' Anthony with his 25 and 30 year service certificates and badge.

Treasurer's Report 2022

Report for the Year Ending 31st December 2022

2022 represented the site's first operating year where to a large extent things have been back to 'normal' activities post the effects of COVID.

The site had a very healthy total income of £86k, with customer income being split circa half indoor accommodation and half camping. Significant amounts of repairs and maintenance, along with general site improvements have taken place during the year. A major milestone has been the commissioning of a new borehole water supply costing £37k, which has solved the site's long-term bugbear of not having an adequate potable water source.

Other areas of maintenance expenditure included, cottage ceiling repairs, partial new cottage windows, site water pipework renewal, water system service, site vehicle services, and general regulatory and HSE compliance.

The campsite started the year with total funds of £215k and ended the year with funds of £214k.

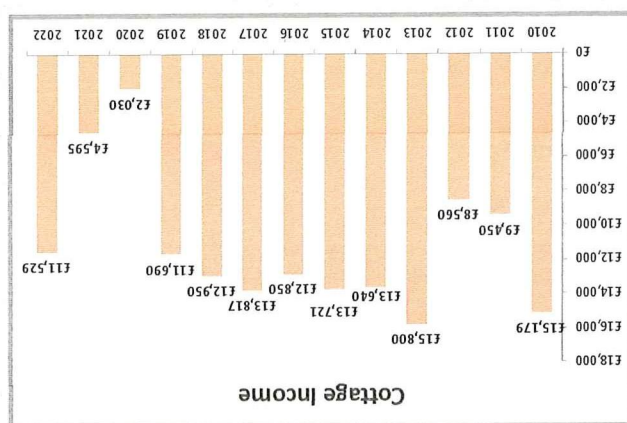
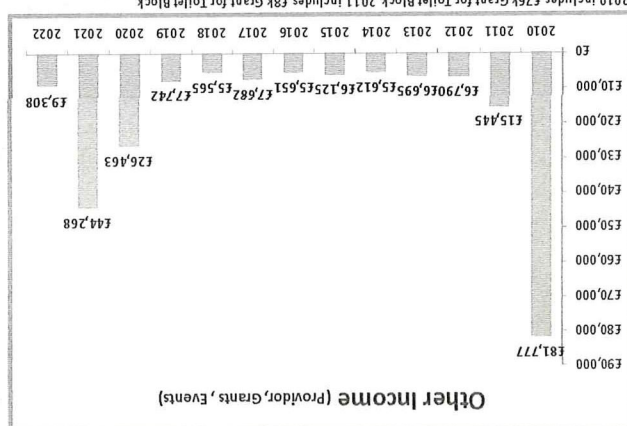
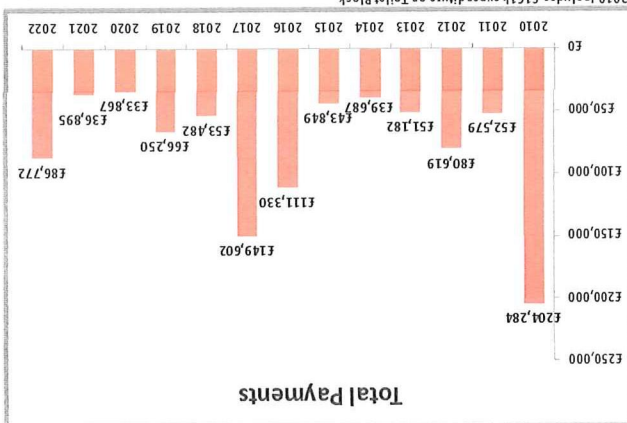
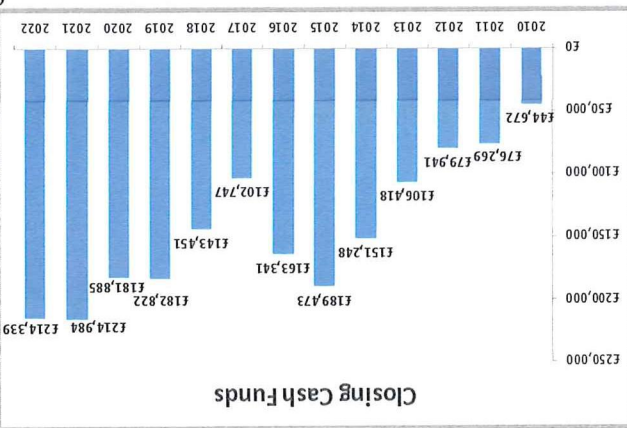
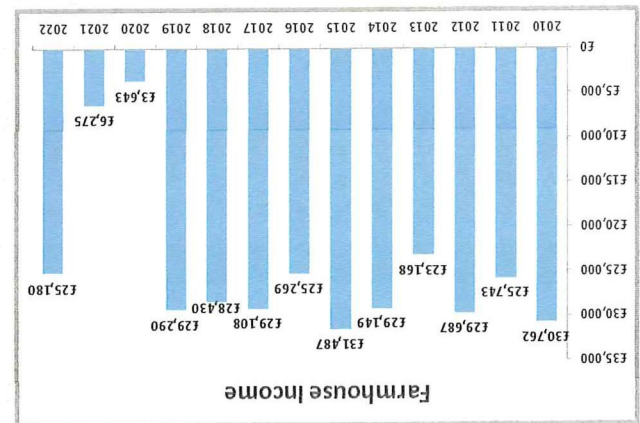
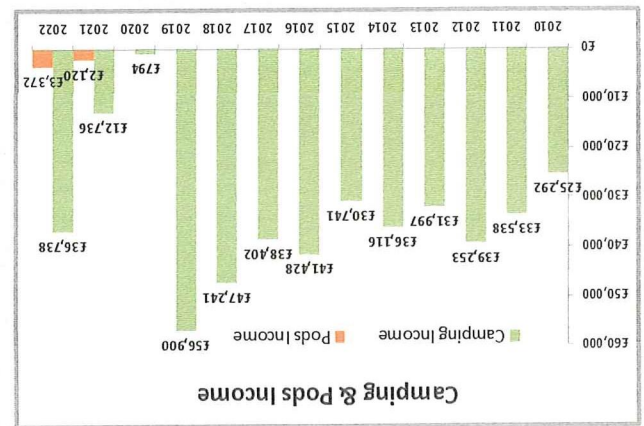
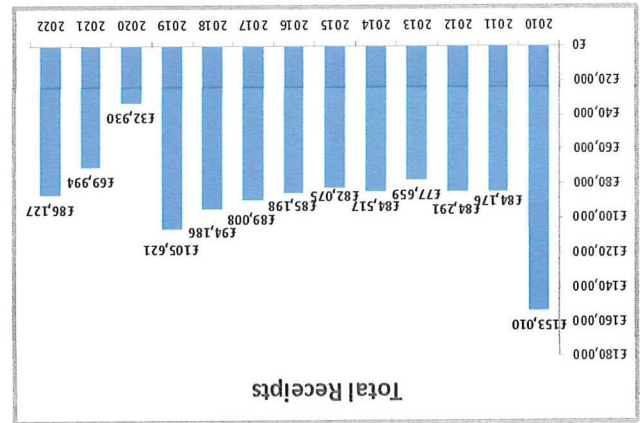
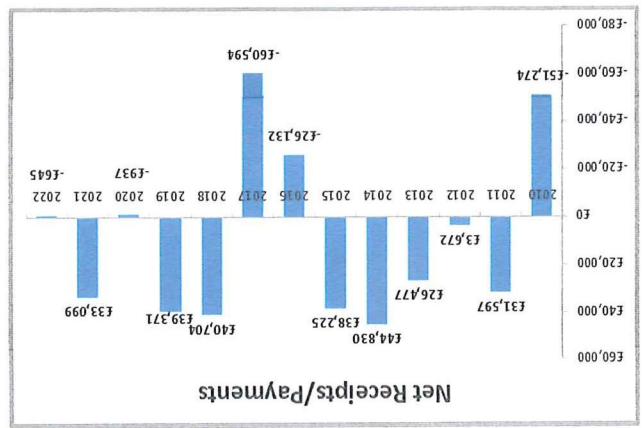

Gradbach Camp Warden Report 2022

It would be fair to say that 2022 saw us return nearly back to normal, following the Covid shutdown of 2020/21. We are not quite back at 2019 levels, our busiest year yet, but well on the way, despite the upheaval that many Scout groups and schools continue to experience.

A number of events returned in 2022 including at the third time of asking, the 40th Border Hike, Essex Scout Marathon and of course we were delighted to host our District 'Wallaboree' camp in May. Additionally many groups enjoyed a Summer camp with us in what for once was a normal Summer, without any flooding, moor fires or a worldwide pandemic! I would like to thank everyone involved with the site, in particular I would like to mention:

Thanks very much Mel. Simon Davies for looking after our social media presence and generating interest in the site. Look out for this year's April 1st post!

Thanks to our committee, chaired by Mark Babington, to our Treasurer John Pritchard, Secretary Simon Davies, to Charlotte Rushworth for taking on the running of our Provideore, Will Ingleby for running our website and to Tony Rushworth & Nick Ware who expertly look after everything 'technical'. My thanks also go to the Gradbach Committee who continue to play a valuable role in helping guide the site into the future, following recent challenging times.

2022 saw some sad news with Sue West, who had bravely battling illness for some time sadly passing away. 40th Border Hike : Gradbach 2022

On the weekend of 23rd to 25th September 2022, we finally managed to run the 40th Anniversary Border Hike and John Bradbury Trophy events at Gradbach Scout Camp, with Scouts from all over the country taking part. The hike had not run since 2019 due to Covid restriction.

Border Hike and John Bradbury teams set off in teams of four and had to navigate their way around a nine-mile route, with incidents along the way. 37 teams entered the event (which we were very pleased with for the first year back), although only 30 were able to take part, this was a larger dropout rate than before Covid.

The teams arrived at Gradbach during Friday day and evening and set up camp. On checking in at Event Control they were given a kit inspection time and a start time for the following morning. Hike control was located in the farmhouse again.

At the early morning start the Explorer teams had their kit checked and were sent them off on a 2-hour orienteering exercise. Once all the Explorers had started the Scouts then had their kit checked. The Scout teams were then given the route in Control and sent to the marquee to plan their route and have it verified. The Explorers followed the same process once they were back from the orienteering.

The teams completed 4 incidents around the hike. The incidents all went well, our thanks go to Emma Wilson and Mike Wilson for providing them. As the event was our 40th an additional Ruby challenge was provided for the teams.

All the teams finished the Hike and all got back to Gradbach by late afternoon and all were in good spirits. On return all teams were offered soup and snacks by Nick and his team.

I report to the trustees on my examination of the accounts of the Gradbach Scout Camp registered charity no: 1036642 for the year ended 31st December 2022.

Responsibilities and basis of report

As the charity trustees of the Gradbach Scout Camp you are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the requirements of the Charities Act 2011 ("the Act")

I report in respect of my examination of the Trust's accounts carried out under section 145 of the 2011 Act and in carrying out my examination I have followed all the applicable Directions given by the Charity Commission under section 145(5)(b) of the Act.

Independent examiners statement

1. Accounting records were not kept in respect of the Trust as required by section 130 of the Act: or
2. The accounts do not accord with those records.

I have no concerns and have come across no other matters in connection with the examination to which attention should be drawn in this report in order to enable a proper understanding of the accounts to be reached.
