- Fundraising efforts; this year other than our Christmas fundraiser fundraising has been difficult due to the Covid pandemic
- Playgroup enjoys discovering and sharing best practice involving other childcare providers. CPD has improved with the introduction on inset days and training days.
- The impact of the pandemic helped Wildings create their ethos of outdoor learning more of a reality with now offering more woods based days and this will continue to increase in the coming years



Independent examiner's statement


We confirm that no material matters have come to our attention in connection with the examination giving us cause to believe that in any material respect:
