Para 1.20	<p><b>FOGS had a successful and productive year, delivering a wide range of fundraising events and activities to support both the infant and junior schools. Key events included the annual Fireworks Display, Summer Fête, Christmas Market, school raffles, and regular tuck shop sales. These events were well supported by the school community and contributed significantly to our fundraising efforts.</b></p> <p><b>Over the course of the year, FOGS raised more than £29,000 through these initiatives. In addition, we were grateful to receive external support in the form of a £2,000 sponsorship from a local estate agent and a £2,000 grant from our local parish council.</b></p> <p><b>Funds raised were used to support a number of projects and enhancements across the schools. These included the purchase of equipment for the sensory areas, the provision of end-of-year leavers' events for Year 2 and Year 6 pupils, and new play equipment to enrich pupils' school experience.</b></p> <p><b>We are proud of the positive impact our work has had on the school community and remain committed to supporting the educational and wellbeing needs of all pupils through future fundraising and community engagement.</b></p>
