Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Northgate High School Parent Teacher Association

I report to the trustees on my examination of the accounts of Northgate High School Parent Teacher Association ('the charity') for the year ended 31 August 2021 which comprise the summary of receipts and payments and the statement of assets and liabilities.

Responsibilities and basis of report

As the trustees of the charity you are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the requirements of the Charities Act 2011 ('the Act').

I report in respect of my examination of the charity's accounts carried out under section 145 of the Act and in carrying out my examination I have followed all the applicable Directions given by the Charity Commission under section 145(5)(b) of the Act.
