We are pleased with how things are going with the work in the children's homes and school. Each home has been visited except for Myanmar as it was decided it was too volatile for us to visit at this time due to a new rule brought in by the military junta. The home there is continuing to run well despite the problems in the country, and we will try to visit again next year.

Both Mary France and Mervyn and Lucy France visited India to see the works and the children finding all well.

Mervyn and Lucy France also visited the work we support in Thailand and was thrilled to be able to meet some of the older young people who were previously in the home we supported but are now on their own working and doing well., next they visited Nepal to see the work there and visit various churches and schools besides the children's homes.

The school in Kenya was visited twice by Mervyn and Lucy France, there are now 80 children in the school and uniforms and shoes were bought for all of them, there is now school continues to do well and get high marks in exams, these children come from the most difficult of circumstances, living in slums, many have no fathers and what parents they have are often alcoholics so it is a privilege to be able to provide an education and a way out of the poverty they live in.

Finance has continued to come in and all costs have been covered. At this time we are expanding the school buildings in the school in Kenya and the work progresses as the finance comes in, it is one step at a time. As a group of trustees and church we are more than satisfied with all that has been done in 2024.

February saw Mervyn and Lucy go to Nepal, here the work in Chitawan, Nepal is winding down due to the government policy of closing Christian schools and homes and putting many more rules and regulations in place which really make no sense at all.

On their way home they called in Dubai where four young men work there. These boys were the first into the home many years ago and keep in touch with us.

Mervyn went to Kenya again in September spending time at our school and then speaking in a pastors' conference and a few different churches.

Thailand was also visited and by Mervyn and Lucy, here we are now helping with the cost of education for four young people who were originally looked after by Patti before she died. They are now being looked after by Bill & Susie Antolec.

We are very thankful that the support for the works that we run has been sufficient to meet all the day-to-day needs plus building a new classroom block in Kenya and any repairs that are necessary in all the countries that we work in. All in all, it has been a good year for which we are doubly thankful.

Trustees report for Kay's Farm Fellowship 2022

It has been a good year overall. We have been able to send enough finance out to keep all the homes running and provide for all the children's needs in all of our works in India, Nepal, Thailand, Burma and Kenya.

Visits were made to Thailand and Nepal with plans to visit the other places in 2023.

At present we are unable to visit Burma because of the coup that happened there and the unrest we deemed it safer to stay away so brought Ginzi, the girl who heads up the work, into Thailand for one week to let her come away from the pressure she has been under keeping the work going under difficult circumstances and also to be able to sit down with her talk things through with her. She has done a brilliant job all through the political unrest there and many people in the surrounding area have been arrested, tortured and killed so it has not been easy at all.

In Nepal it was the first time for three years that we have been able to go due to Corona lockdown as Nepal still had strict guidelines in place. There are not many children there now as the government has been trying to shut down all Christian works, some children had to go back to their villages and for those with no parents homes with relatives had to be found. Those children are still being supported with all that is needed for school, ie, school fees, uniforms, bags, books, pens, pencils and scientific supplies plus when they come for their school fees they are sent back with rice, cooking oil and other essentials. We were also able to visit some of the young people who were in the homes when first the work started, most are now married and have families of their own and it is a joy to see how well they are doing. On the way back home we stopped in Dubai for a few nights to meet up with four boys from the Nepal home, they were the first boys to come into our home. They are all married with families of their own back in Nepal but the boys live and work in Dubai so that they can earn enough to pay for the schooling of their children and it enables them to be able to build a decent home for them. The down side for them is that they can only get back to Nepal once a year for four weeks. We were able to spend quality time with them and go to their church on the Sunday where Mervyn France was able to preach at their service.

Overall we are happy with how things are going and planned visits for 2023 are India, Kenya, Nepal at the beginning of the year and India towards the end of the year plus another visit to the school in Kenya in the middle of the year and hopefully the building work will be completed on the new school buildings so that they can officially be opened.

We look forward to another year of blessing and are very thankful to all who have given freely to keep the work running.

Once again 2021 was not an easy year due to the pandemic but we are thankful that finance continued to come in and we were able to carry on supporting all the children's home as usual. Once again during the pandemic the staff were all able to clear from covid and none of the children in all the homes we clear of covid for which we were extremely thankful.

No-one has been able to travel and visit any of the countries where the children's homes are but we have been able to keep in touch with each home via the internet.

In India we have converted one of the areas in the school building into an apartment for Naomi Viswasam who runs the home there.

In Kenya we have built a new schoolroom and preparation is underway to build a second floor schoolroom.

In Nepal the home has continued to go on day to day, the children are all doing well with schooling mostly at home via the internet and we were able to provide them with additional lap tops and mobile phones to do their lessons.

Burma has extremely difficult circumstances due to the military takeover and the children are having homeschooling as the soldiers have taken over the school. They also have done well in their education despite very trying times.

In Ecuador we have begun the support and build onto the house of a couple who work with vulnerable girls. This extension has been built in memory of Mervyn France and Mary France's brother who was killed in a farm accident a few years ago.

In Thailand we are supporting 6 young people through college and university, after Patti died an American couple took the young folk into their home and keep them with them and enable them all to finish their education.

All in all despite the restrictions it has been a good year and we look forward to hopefully being able to visit the works in 2022.

The year began with Mervyn & Lucy France travelling to Kenya where they were able to purchase everything needed for the start of the David Kelsall Memorial School. The school opened with 30 pupils and all uniform was provided as the children are from a slum area and no chance of an education. Milk and a snack is provided each morning and a cooked lunch at lunch time. Shortly after opening the school had to close due to Covid but was open again before the end of the year.

Mervyn France made a visit to the home in India to check all was well and was pleased with everything.

A visit was planned to Thailand but again because of Covid this had to be cancelled and unfortunately Patti Culpepper became very ill as the cancer had spread and she died in July of 2020. Provision had been made for the young people in her care and we hope to be able to visit in 2022.

For the rest of the year we were able to keep in touch with each of the children's homes throughout the year and we are pleased to report that we have had no cases on Covid in any of the homes or school. In Burma

Finance was very good and we were never short of money to send to the works. In India we were able to make a new apartment inside the existing building for Nayomi Viswassam who runs the work, in Nepal we helped build a church and do repairs and upgrading of the building plus painting inside and out. In Burma we just continued with the monthly support.

We are very thankful for all who gave to the work and look forward to being able to travel and visit the works once restrictions are lifted and it is safe
