All money generated from fundraising efforts in the name of the Greek Orthodox church of Saint Nectarios are used for the betterment of the Church including the occasional donation to the Archdiocese.

With that in mind the Trustees decide to commence a program of building works to address various long overdue maintenance projects, following the commissioning of an independent Condition Survey Report (including a Schedule of Condition) of the Church Buildings at the end of 2022.

The scope of the work that has been approved by the Trustees will continue through 2024 into 2025 including Electrical works and also security driven initiatives.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

- a) The Charity continued to deliver religious services to both the Greek Orthodox Community in South-West London and indeed the wider Orthodox Community.
- b) The Charity continued to innovate in the Fundraising efforts employed including advancing the ability accept online donations and the use of established charitable platforms.
- c) The activities with the Foodbank previous included within the responsibilities of this charity were effectively segregated when the Foodbank applied for its independent Charitable status.
- d) The Clergy continued to support the community with hospital and home visits for the sick and infirm.

The cash funds available to the Charity reduced by £23,894 following a capital investment of £43,072 which includes the cost of the Surveys commissioned plus improvements to Freehold Property and also the addition of new Fixtures and Fittings
