Structure, Governance and Management

The Farlingaye High School Foundation is a parent-supported charitable group established to raise funds to support Farlingaye High School and enhance the experience of its students.

The Foundation is managed by a board of trustees who meet on a half-termly basis to review fundraising activity, agree priorities for expenditure, and ensure that funds are used effectively and in line with the charity's objectives.

Trustees are typically drawn from the parent and school community, with new trustees identified and appointed based on their willingness to support the work of the Foundation and contribute to its ongoing development.

Objectives and Activities

The primary objective of the Foundation is to raise funds to support Farlingaye High School in providing opportunities, facilities and experiences that enhance students' education and wider development.

During the year, the Foundation has undertaken a range of fundraising activities and events, including community-focused initiatives such as the annual quiz night. Funds raised have been directed towards both long-term capital projects and immediate student-facing provision.

Achievements and Performance (Public Benefit)

During the year, the Foundation has continued to make a positive contribution to the school community through targeted financial support and enrichment opportunities, directly benefiting students across all year groups.

A significant focus has been fundraising towards the development of a new all-weather sports pitch. This represents a major long-term investment and will significantly improve access to high-quality sporting provision for students, both within the curriculum and through extra-curricular activities. In addition, £19,045 was contributed directly to PE facilities.

The Foundation has supported student development through practical initiatives, including providing first aid training for all Year 9 students (£1,475), equipping them with valuable life skills that extend beyond school.

Support has also been provided to ensure inclusivity, with £1,720 allocated towards second-hand uniform provision, helping to make school uniform accessible to all students. The Foundation supported key milestone events for students, including £17,014 towards Year 11 and Year 13 proms. These events provide an important opportunity for students to celebrate their time at school and contribute to a strong sense of community.

In addition, £1,051 was contributed towards the Upper School production, MiniFest, summer concert and other music activities, supporting students' participation in the creative arts.

The Foundation has also donated £5,002 to other charities whose work supports young people, reflecting its broader commitment to community and public benefit.

Through these activities, the Foundation has demonstrably advanced education and supported the wellbeing and development of students at Farlingaye High School.

Financial Review

During the year, the Foundation's expenditure was focused on supporting student provision and enhancing school facilities. Key areas of expenditure included:

- Contribution to PE facilities: £19,045
- Year 11 and Year 13 prom events: £17,014
- Donations to other charities: £5,002
- Second-hand uniform provision: £1,720
- First aid training: £1,475
- Music and enrichment activities: £1,051
- Quiz night expenditure: £604

The Foundation continues to operate with the aim of directing funds raised towards initiatives that have a clear and positive impact on students.
