Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

The Torrs Charitable Trust gave financial support to several charities working to improve the lives of UK children, including providing holidays with activities for children who would otherwise not have a holiday, Christian youth groups in secondary schools and addressing mental health issues in children in London. We helped fund the refurbishment of a Christian centre in London which offers accommodation and practical help to London's homeless. We supported Bibles for Children in providing The Children's Bible and The Rainbow Good News Bible to primary school children in the UK.

We continued our support to Arocha UK in its work to help Christians in the UK to care for God's creation, including expanding the Eco Church initiative and improving people's wellbeing through contact with nature.

We were pleased to support Hampshire Wildlife Trust in the purchase of land to enable the expansion of their Lymington reedbeds nature reserve on the edge of the New Forest. We also gave financial support to Butterfly Conservation to improve habitat management for declining and threatened species of butterfly, including the Pearl-bordered and High Brown Fritillary.

We supported several UK-based charities which operate abroad. We responded to Tear Fund's emergency appeal for life-saving aid to those fleeing conflict in the Democratic Republic of Congo. We also supported Tear Fund's initiative to transform communities in Uganda. Rather than providing short-term aid, the program equips local communities to identify their own needs and use local resources to develop lasting solutions. Guitar Aid is another UK charity we supported, supplying guitars to a number of African countries for church worship.



The Torrs Charitable Trust continued to support a number of UK-based charities, some of which operate abroad.

In the UK, we gave financial support to charities helping individuals and families affected by poverty, and the homeless. This included children's clubs and providing food and friendship in deprived areas. We also continued our support to Prison Fellowship, a charity which helps prepare prisoners, and their families, for their release.

Our concern for UK Biodiversity continues with support for species and habitats via Butterfly Conservation and A Rocha UK. The latter charity runs projects on rewilding church lands for the benefit of wildlife and enhancing the mental wellbeing of locals through nature.

We supported several UK-based charities which operate abroad. In September we responded to Tear Fund's emergency appeal following failed harvest in Kenya. We continued our support for Soteria Trust which provides hope for needy, poor and vulnerable children through sponsorship at Prospect School in Ibadan, Nigeria. Our latest contribution helped provide a dormitory. We also supported Life Words which operates in the UK and abroad as the working name of Scripture Gift Mission, founded in 1888. They aim to make the bible accessible throughout the world whether a daily digital verse of God's work via App/email in UK or a printed booklet to a child in Brazil.



In the UK, we gave financial support to charities involved in providing holiday camps for young people, drug awareness in schools, support to families in distress because of the financial crisis and assistance to prisoners and their families in preparation for their release. We also supported a charity which runs cafes for international students, providing food, friendship and local outings.

We supported several charities which operate abroad to reduce suffering from natural disasters. These included responding to famine in East Africa and Nepal, severe floods in Pakistan and Bangladesh, and two devastating earthquakes in Turkey in December 2022. In the dry lands of Tanzania, where drought is a major problem, we supported the building of cheap but effective sand dams which make a massive difference to the livelihood of local communities, providing water and employment.

Other charities which work abroad were also given financial assistance. Funding support was given to a hub for single mums in Uganda, helping them become self-sufficient and able to provide for their children, as well as giving pastoral care to the village and beyond. We provided some funding to enable refugees in Jordan to acquire sewing machines and gain employment to help sustain themselves and their families. We continue to support a charity which improves the lives of Latin American street children through the provision of food, friendship and hygiene kits, and eventually a place to recover in a children's home.

In conservation, we supported the work of Butterfly Conservation to reverse the decline of some of our rarer and threatened species of butterfly.



In response to Covid lockdown issues in schools, we funded music therapy sessions to alleviate stress, training for youth leaders and maintaining contact groups during isolation restrictions. We also supported drug awareness talks in schools. Also in the UK, we supported help for prisoners through visits and assistance to those preparing to be released.

Overseas, we supported a ship carrying Covid vaccines for towns and villages in West and Central Africa, plus medical relief for severe Covid infections in India. We supported those suffering floods in Bangladesh, an earthquake in the Democratic Republic of Congo and famines in Madagascar and West Africa due to crop failure. An orphanage in India and Street Children in Guatemala were supported, while refugees from Iran, Jordan, Ukraine and Iraq were helped to settle. Funding was provided to enable TV and radio messages to warn areas of impending storms, provide medical advice and general news in isolated areas.

In conservation, we encouraged churches to provide nature areas for the benefit of people and wildlife.
