STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing Document

The organisation is a charitable trust established on 15th April 1995 by means of a deed of settlement. That deed was formally registered with the Charity Commission on 08th August 1995.

Trustees

The original trust deed appointed five trustees. Since that date, the trustees, using the powers they have under the deed, appointed a trustee from the membership of the community to replace one who retired. All trustees are listed on page 1. They serve for fixed terms of ten consecutive years and thereafter are subject to re-election.

Organisational Structure

The day-to-day management of the trust lies in the hands of the Executive Committee, who meet on a regular basis to carry out the requisite managerial tasks.

Risk Management

The trustees have conducted a review of the major risks to which the charity is exposed and have taken appropriate steps to mitigate those risks.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives

The trust's objectives, as laid down in the trust deed referred to above, are as follows:

- The advancement of Hindu religion in the community, in particular Shree Kutch Leva Patel Community in the UK.
- The relief of poverty, sickness & distress arising there from amongst members of the said community.
- The advancement of education amongst children and adult members of the said community.
- The provision or the assistance in the provision of facilities for recreation and other leisure time occupation of the said community who have need of such facilities by reason of their age, infirmity or disablement poverty and economic circumstances in the interest of social welfare and the object of improving their condition of life

Activities

The trust's activities included the provision of recreational facilities and the provision of a community centre to serve as a focal point for the community in the North West of England. Activities conducted in the year, participated by all age group, include Hindu cultural and festival celebrations. The building premises were also made available for hire to community members for such other social activities. The support of the volunteers in carrying out such work as necessary has been outstanding.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

General Review

The trustees are pleased to be able to report that all the activities during the year generated adequate financial resources which were then expanded as per attached statements. Further maintenance of the building property has been carried out during the year so to continue to provide adequate facilities for the activities to be conducted.

Reserves Policy

The trust has no free reserves as such and the major fund has been invested in the Community Centre. It is the trustees' intention to build up reserves in future years to allow for maintenance of its facility.

FUTURE PLANS

The trustees plan to make even greater use of the facility for the benefit of all of the members of the community. In addition, the trustees have plans to improve the current facilities, subject to funds becoming available in subsequent years. The situation will be monitored carefully and reported on each year.

STATEMENT OF TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITY


