The School is also open to the public on a regular basis throughout the year, when the Trust's local history collection of documents, photographs, artifacts and other media may be viewed and studied.

The three priorities in the collection, in priority order are:

- the building's previous use as a junior school,
- the local history of the town of New Romney and,
- the local history of Romney Marsh.

The Trust owns the Old School building and has a long-term lease on the adjoining garden.

1. The Trust continued to provide a venue for use by the local community for educational, social and entertainment purposes. The groups hiring rooms in the Old School included Art Appreciation and Spanish classes, Leisure Painters, the Sunflower Dementia Café, New Romney History Society, Romney Marsh Poetry Society, Sunday Sewing, Country Mice Needlecraft Club, the Romney Marsh Archaeology Society, Carers Support Group, and Kent & Medway Health and Social Care Partnership.
2. The Old School also hosted a number of one-off bookings and various fund-raising events, including several lantern making sessions for the annual "Light Up New Romney" event.
3. The Trust's collection of local history documents, photographs and artifacts was open to the public on two Saturday mornings each month.
4. The Trust are now the custodians and owners of the Edit Nesbit Archives. The collection was donated by the Edith Nesbit Society in February 2025, and selected items are now on public display in the Old School. E Nesbit is the author of "The Railway Children" and many other books for children and adults. She also published several books of her poems. She spent many summers in Dymchurch and in her final years bought a property in St Mary's Bay and is buried in St Mary in the Marsh.

Para 1.20	From February 2021 the Old School has been used as a Covid Vaccination Centre and this has continued through to date (Nov 2022). With the easing and subsequent removal of government covid restrictions it was possible to re-start use of the Old School by local groups. All our previous regular groups have re-started and a couple of new ones have been added. Our rooms are now pretty much fully booked. Following covid, some groups now have reduced numbers and use a smaller room, for which we charge a lower price. Overall, all our income is still sufficient for the Trust to maintain and improve the building. We are fortunate to have signed fairly long fixed price contracts for gas & electric on terms that predated the war in Ukraine.

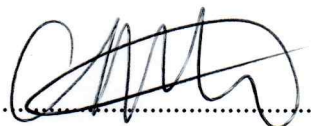
