The trustees present their accounts and report for the year ended 31 December 2020

Objectives and Activities of the Charity

The objectives of the Charity as set out in the Declaration of Trust are:

- a) the advancement of the Christian Faith in the United Kingdom and abroad
- b) the relief of persons who are in conditions of need, hardship or distress or who are aged or sick, in the United Kingdom or abroad.

The principal activities of the church are Christian worship and involvement of various ministries and ministers of religion in propagating Christian tenets to members (and non-members) of the Ministry at various meetings.

To achieve these objectives, the Church was involved in Christian outreach programmes designed to increase Christian awareness and spread the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ.
