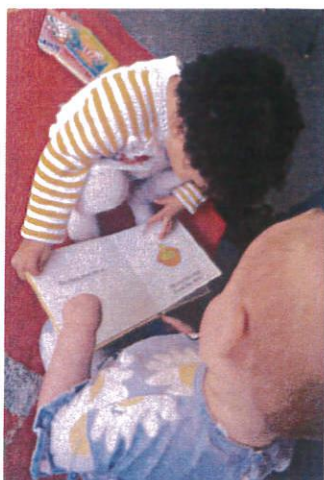

## **'Peek-a-Boo'**

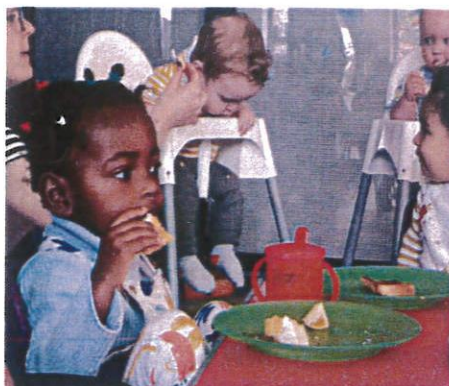
### **Mum's, carers, babies & toddlers' group**



Peek-a-boo is a toddler group that serves the children and community of Hebron Pentecostal church. Parents and minders of children from the ages of 0-4 years old are welcomed into a warm, nurturing fun environment. Parents and toddlers are given the opportunity to play, learn, sing, and eat together on a weekly basis.

Last year Peek-a-boo restarted after being closed for over a year due to the pandemic at the new time of 9.30am-11am. We met in the church cafe and was run by a fantastic team including Hannah, Akwa and James.

The typical format for a Peek-a-boo session is a free play session in which we rota activities weekly such as soft play, building blocks, craft activities, puzzles and lots more fun. We then have a snack time followed by singing and dancing which the older children in particular enjoy! In all these activities we engage the children and parents and allow a safe place for learning, fun and bonding to take place



In the picture we can see some of our children together eating healthy snack which impacts their long-term wellbeing. This also promoted the children's speech and language development as they were encouraged to talk to one another and improve their fine motor skills as they distribute and feed themselves snack with support.

A positive case study we have seen was as Child M struggled to speak outside of the home but due to her attending Peek-a-boo weekly her confidence and language developed enough for her to start to communicate with other children and adults in the setting.

It has been a lovely year; seeing the children grow and develop was such a privilege for the team and I. Some of the children graduated to school and we had a new arrival join us, we thank God for the ministry and pray he establishes the work of our hands.

### **Pastoral Care Team**

Our pastoral care team have worked hard during 2022, they meet together on a weekly basis and pray for specific needs, the team also works closely with home group leaders. Where needs have not been able to be met through home groups the pastoral team takes over. The team as given a lot of support to people during 2022 from phone calls, texts, help with transport, home visits and the giving of cards gifts along with the presentation of Bibles.

## Kids Club

Power pack kids club runs during term time on Fridays 5pm till 6.30pm, we have 16-28 wonderful children aged between the ages of 4-11.

## Our charity continues to help:

Poor and needy – through our weekly breakfast club

Children/young people – Kids club, youth group

Elderly/ seniors – Luncheon Club

Financial, emotional and spiritual support was given during the year to a number of people who were in need of help.

**Ministry:** Pastor David Corke is a free church Chaplain in H.M.P. Buckley Hall.

**Hebron Church** continues to hold status with Assemblies of God (GB).

It is our policy to maintain a balance on unrestricted funds, if possible, which equates to at least 3 months unrestricted payments, to cover emergency situations that may arise from time to time.

## **Church Fire Risk Assessment**

*main hall, minor hall, kitchen, cafe area and café kitchen.*

The identified fire hazards are *gas appliances in main Kitchen, electrical: fryer and electrical equipment in the café kitchen.*

## **The existing Fire Arrangements are deemed to be adequate because:**

Fire alarm system meets current regulations and is maintained under contract with a professional company.

The congregation is regularly reminded of the Fire Arrangements which are also announced when appropriate.

The emergency lighting is checked regularly by a professional company.

Appropriate fire-extinguishers placed around church are checked annually.

A Fire Blanket is stored in a prominent place in the kitchens.

The Property's gas appliances have been serviced and a Gas Safety Certificate issued.

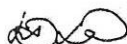
### Independent examiner's statement

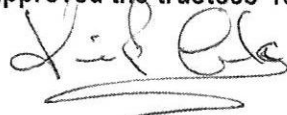
