Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Volunteers & Club Membership

Through active marketing on social media and having lots of projects and events on offer, the number of club members rose to 40.

Events & Fundraising

Despite the Covid-19 lockdown restrictions, the club was able to meet weekly via video conference and convert offline events to online ones. Events were convened online with a modest entry fee and/or donated raffle prizes.

The signature traditional fundraising event – the Christmas Sleigh appeal – was able to take place with reduced COVID restrictions in December 2020, in fact with many people staying home – receipts were higher than previous years.

Beirut Project

Apart from 2020-2021 being an exceptional year in terms of Covid-19, the club raised an exceptional amount due to the coordinating role it played in raising funds for the Karantina Hospital in Beirut, Lebanon which had been extensively damaged in the Port of Beirut explosions in August 2021. The club worked with local Rotarians from Beirut to explain, via video conferences, the nature of the damage and share details of equipment needed to re-equip the pediatric and neo-natal facilities. This appeal generated donations from individuals and other Rotary Clubs around the UK – which was assembled with other international funding as part of a Rotary matching grant.

International

- Rotary Foundation UK – towards the End Polio Now project and funding of Global Grants Programme (including international scholarships)
- Inspiration Project Brazil – Educational empowerment through enhanced teacher training, in partnership with the Rotaract Club in Curitiba, Brazil
- STEAM Project South Africa – provision of Science, Technology and Mathematics early learning educational materials for use in disadvantaged schools in the Cape Town area – in partnership with the Rotary Club of Claremont, Cape Town
- Wildlife Vets – support for the wildlife protection and conservation of wild tigers through training and information sharing

Local

- Paddock School – supply of musical instruments for use in local school for children with special educational needs
- Regenerate – local charity where we provided funding for the transport of used school uniforms for use in Kenya
- SPEAR – local organisation helping homeless people back into accommodation, work and independence
- Salvation Army – support for local branch to support vulnerable during COVID-19 lockdowns
- Listening Samaritans – support for local branch to provide assistance to those feeling lonely or suicidal, especially during COVID-19 lockdowns
- Theodora Children's Charity – support for charity which visits children in hospital to bring them joy at uncertain time.

- Royal Trinity Hospice – local hospice providing palliative care, support during COVID-19
- Holly Lodge School – building on a grant from the previous fiscal year, provision of signage for raised garden
- Glass Door – donation for “sleep out” fundraising initiative for local homeless shelter organisation




