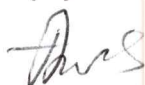

Then bank balance at the end of the financial year 2024/25 was £5,671 compared with the previous year balance of £9,954.

The Management Committee believe that the continued rise in income and interest in the facilities places us in a position where we can continue providing our services to the benefit of the community.

There was an increase in income through hire charges. This was because the previous 2 years had been lost through the pandemic, there was pent up demand. Our finances were also helped by the government grants for the loss of revenues. Our total income for the year was £42,688 as compares to £43,893 for last financial year. Our total expenditure for the year was £42,020 compared with £28,974 last year.

The bank balance at the end of the financial year 2022 (April 2022 to March 2023) was £59,322 compared with the previous year's balance of £58,654.

The Management Committee believe that the continued rise in income and interest in the facilities places us in a position where we can continue providing our services to the benefit of the community.

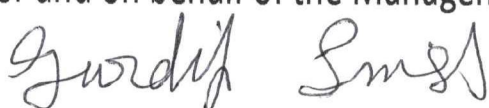

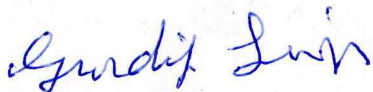

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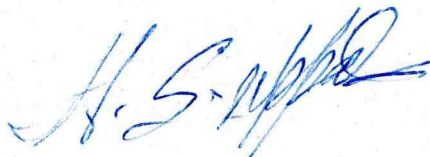
