The Trustees present their report with the accounts for the year ended 31 March 2022 which are set out on the annexed pages.

Objectives and Policies

The Objectives of the Charity are to:

- a) advance the Christian Faith by Ministering the Word of God
- b) relieve persons who are in conditions of need or hardship or who are aged or sick and to relieve the distress caused thereby .
- c) advance education in accordance with Christian principles

Pneuma Christian Centre Trust is committed to enabling as many people as possible to worship at our church and to become part of our worshipping community . The trustees maintain an overview of worship throughout the community and makes suggestions on how our services can involve the many groups who live within the community . Review of past activities

The church continued to support the youth ministry in activities where they could showcase their talents in music, poetry, drama etc.

As anticipated, the pandemic had an impact on our regular activities ie we were unable to visit homes in the local community or invite as many young artists to showcase their talent. We did make a huge improvement to our online / social media presence so members could who could not worship in person could be part of the service at home.

Future developments

Post Covid, we anticipate more members will attend service in person, although we believe our weekly activities will continue virtually which will be the new normal. We also anticipate some presence within the local community but on a very small scale. All these will be monitored obviously respecting volunteers' and users' views on the pandemic. We continue to make appropriate changes to accommodate members joining the service online and improving our website.

The board of trustees of 2 members, meet half yearly, administers the charity in consultation with the administrative board of the church. There are subcommittees covering the spiritual development, membership & welfare, finance & administration. The finance & administration subcommittee is charged with the management of the daily operations of the charity.

The Charity has the policy of diversifying its funding base. To this end the income of the charity is derived from general offerings from the members, mission conference donations and donations from the general public and mission partners.

Financial policies are in place to ensure the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

1 Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The Financial Statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities and Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities".

Incoming resources

Unrestricted Income comprises donations and is recognised on receipt basis. Restricted Income relates to donations specifically raised for the purchase of land & buildings and is recognised on receipt basis. However, the donors have agreed that that once the primary purpose has been satisfied, any surplus funds remaining will be used for the running of the Charity's ordinary activities.

Depreciation

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful lives based on reducing balance method.

Equipments	20%
Fixtures & Fittings	20%

Resources Expended

Charitable Activities

These comprise all expenditure directly relating to the objects of the Charity. Support costs are an integral part of the expenses incurred in carrying out those charitable activities, which the Charity was established to perform.

Governance Costs

Governance costs comprise the costs of running the charity, including strategic planning for its future development, also includes accountancy & legal fees and all costs relating to constitutional and statutory compliance.

Church Rent & Rates

The existing operating lease agreement was renewed in December 2021 on the same terms. The non-cancelable commitment falling due within 1 year amounted to £21,995; within 2-5 years amounted to £21,995. The increase in rental cost was as a result of resumption of use of the property following the covid 19 lockdown period. The charity is only liable to make rental payments for actual usage of the property.
