Main achievement this past year has been the ongoing increase in bookings for the hall, new groups using hall on a regular basis, and increase in football teams.

We have also decorated some areas of the premises although our plan is to do more as and when able

We continue to inspect maintain and repair as required to maintain the standard to the highest possible.

There is a defibrillator for use which is financed and maintained by the Hall.

We have provided a storage facility for the football teams.

We maintain a certain level of financial reserve in order that we can always respond to maintenance issues as they arise. We need contingency funds, e.g. our fire doors need replacing at a cost of over £6,000 a few years back, and we were able to do this. We are aware that the car park will need work this coming year and that will be possible as we have a healthy reserve. During COVID no monies coming in and bills still needed paying so reserve was essential at that time.
