The pandemic has meant that we have moved away from running youth clubs (many closed) and mentoring in schools. This has enabled us to be a much more valuable resource for schools and churches by bringing to them university professors, lecturers and notable academics who can share their subject largely science and philosophy from a Christian viewpoint. The expenditure entitled **mission** has included gifts for speakers, travel, hotel accommodation, food and meetings etc. We aim to add value to the educational institutions through weekly, monthly and annual events.

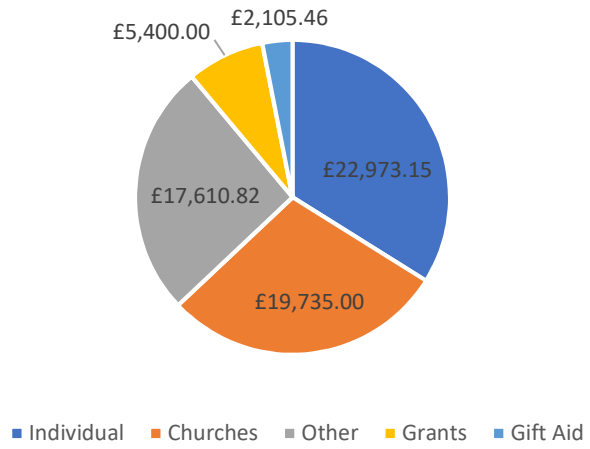
Our Director seeks to speak at as many local churches as possible and most months we offer gatherings for the local churches featuring first-rate guest speakers, largely Christian university professors speaking on how Christianity is not at odds with their subject in science, philosophy etc. Our **income** comes mainly from individuals and churches with small grants.

In all local secondary schools we deliver assemblies, lessons, lunchtime and after school programs including debates between those with a non-Christian viewpoint and Christian speakers.

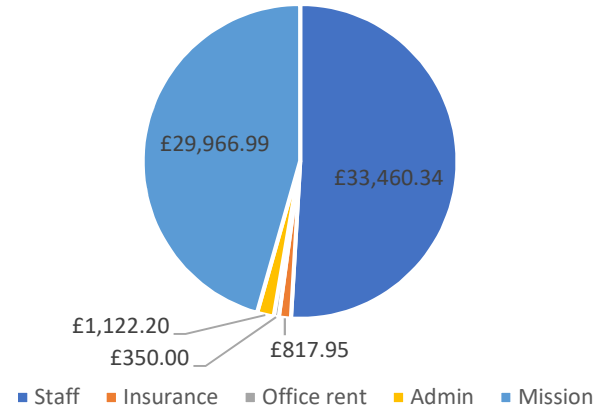

Most days of the week AVYFC are based in the many secondary schools across the area. We use our expertise to deliver high quality specialist RE and philosophy lessons. We take assemblies every month following the school's programme. Our Director is highly qualified with a strong academic background in science and theology and familiar with academic environments.

Every week we run Socratic Society across several schools which is a philosophy club where students come to share their ideas, debate, discuss and dialogue with each other. We explore their ideas and allow freedom of expression in encouraging a safe and secure environment to talk about complex and important issues.

Across the year we run larger events, including RE and philosophy days featuring notable academics coming to lecture and take questions from the students on aspects of the curriculum. We also run 3- and 5- day events exploring the big questions of life, purpose and meaning. We coordinate debates on important topics and facilitate roundtable discussions on differing perspectives to promote healthy dialogue and model positive disagreement.

We also provide one –off conferences of special focus, bringing in outstanding speakers to invest in the town on key issues and topics of interest



AVYFC has no property of its own.

In 2021 the trustees had two employees, the Director and a part time office manager.

We faced major challenges following the lockdowns, the first of which being to regather young people after months of online meetups and church. From there we aimed to run the first youth conference in for some time. Also ensuring UNITE was the can't-miss-Super-Sunday event every month for all young people, particularly those interested in a Christian life in the community, it also meant re-establishing AVYFC in its role to help schools, not just in assemblies and RE lessons but also in science and philosophy.

Unite is our large, monthly gathering of the young people in the town and area, some but not all, with church backgrounds. It was important to give young people a chance to regather after so long in lockdown and we are delighted to see the event return to a good size. Each month we have brought in guest speakers from diverse backgrounds and disciplines, including University science and philosophy, to invest in the youth. It has quickly returned to being the highlight of the month and seeing new young people join and even take part has been fantastic.

Central Cell had only been an online help as the previous plans for it were derailed by the pandemic. We have been working hard with the youth leader's network to ensure that it can help young people to be confident in what they achieve in life and faith.

We also have a bi-annual conference for the 11–18-year-olds in town, working with the youth leaders to put on a first-class weekend programme to inspire and strengthen them in their faith and wellbeing. It was held at Vineyard church in September and 50 young people came along. We look forward to it being a staple of our work for years to come.

The director has had immense pleasure gathering every week with the local church youth leaders to support each other, strategize and plan together as to how as a unit we can best serve the youth of Aylesbury Vale. Each Thursday morning, he meets with them at one of the local churches to talk, review and discuss the work across town, standing each other in helping with the challenges young people face.

It is because of these fruitful relationships and intentional efforts that Unite, RISC, and Central Cell will continue to benefit the young people for years to come.

# Read the whole Bible in 90 days

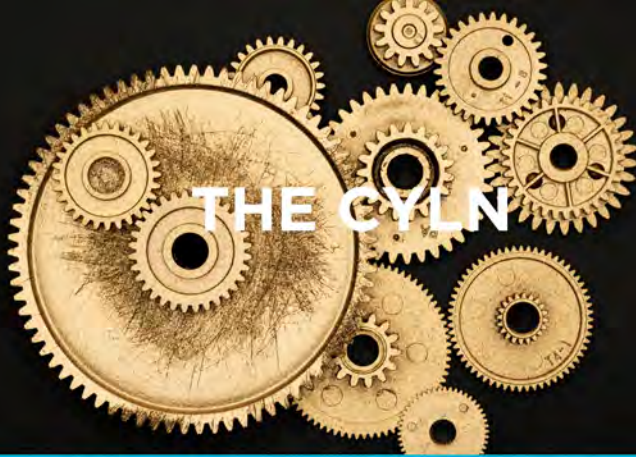

## Central Cell Online

Last year, you may remember we had a plan to bring together the youth ministry across Aylesbury into one location each week, by launching Central Cell. It took us a little while to realise that this wasn't going to happen, we so got the CYLN together and we thought of a new plan.

We wanted to make sure youth leaders could still work closely together. We wanted to hold on to the concept of a weekly, town-wide youth ministry gathering. We wanted to make it lockdown proof and we wanted it to be accessible to anyone who might want to join us. After a few meetings with Connect leaders and youth leaders, the result was Central Cell Online (see what we did there...?).

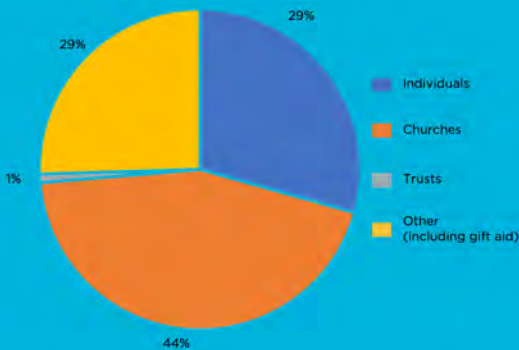
We're still convinced that the best way to grow as a Christian and to add to the Church is to have a community of people who can meet regularly and hammer out the implications of what it means to follow Jesus. So on October 20th, we did a pilot of Central Cell Online from the book of Ephesians. We live streamed onto YouTube and invited 8 local churches to tune in with their youth groups.

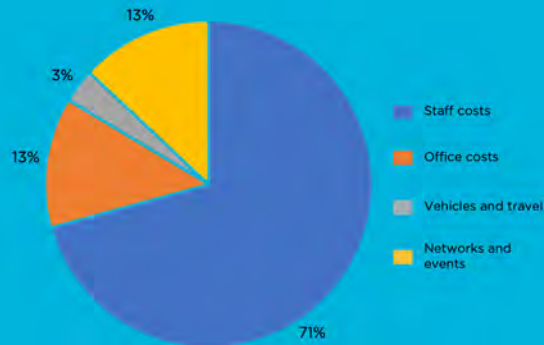

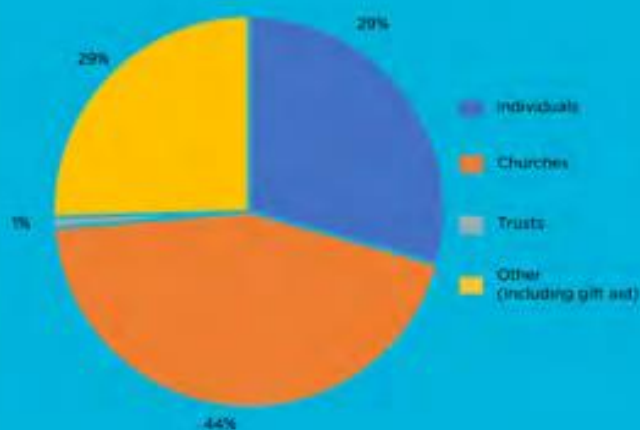

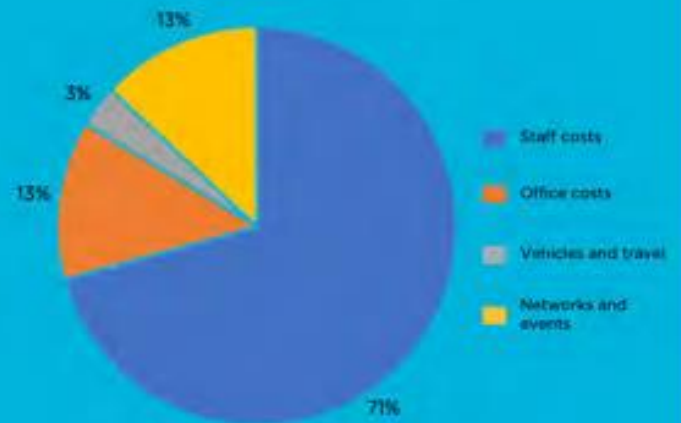
