CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

This report covers the period April 2024 to end of March 2025

The Friends and Patrons continued to support the Discover Bucks Museum, not only through grants to acquire items to enhance the Museum's collections, but also by providing volunteers to help the Keepers at the Halton Resource Centre and to steward various exhibitions. This included the *Off The Wall* Exhibition which provided a useful income for the Friends, and we were very grateful to Sue Gilbert for organising this on our behalf. During the year the Friends and the Patrons each contributed £6,000 in order to upgrade the Museum's IT infrastructure, and our other grants are listed elsewhere in this report. More significant grants will be needed in 2025/26 as part of the planning for the major Saxon Heritage Exhibition scheduled for 2026.

By the end of the year we were looking forward to seeing the Museum's promised Strategic Plan, which will guide our support over the next ten years. Meanwhile we hope that our new membership leaflets will help us to recruit more Friends so we can continue to support our excellent Museum in the difficult economic climate prevailing at present. We would also welcome more members to join our Committee, which only meets three times a year but keeps us in touch with all that is happening at this key tourist attraction in Aylesbury.

Main Achievements

Over the year 2024/25 the Friends and Patrons have given grants to the Museum totalling £14,788.59 (see below). The Museum received a grant of £12,000 from the Friends & Patrons for replacement hardware for their IT infrastructure and migration to the cloud has been completed. However, further funding of c. £20,000 will be needed for further IT support in respect of the Collection Management System (MODES).

Membership

At 31 March 2025 total paid up individual membership of the Friends and Patrons amounted to 129 Friends and 79 Patrons (2024 = 135 Friends and 81 Patrons). There were also two Honorary Life Patrons. In addition to the individual members there were five institutional members.

Annual Meeting

The Annual meeting was held at the Museum on Saturday 16th, November 2024. Earl Howe on behalf of the President, Viscount Younger, opened the meeting and Roy Collis, Chair of the Friends & Patrons introduced the Annual Report following which the annual accounts were formally approved. Elections took place. The Meeting was followed by a private view of the *Off the Wall* art exhibition, organised by the Sue Gilbert on behalf of the Friends.

Officers and Committee Members

The full elected Committee at 31 March 2025 comprised The Viscount Younger, President; Mr Roy Collis, Chairman; Mr John Galbraith, Honorary Treasurer; Miss Pam Russell, Honorary Secretary; Mrs Doreen Holmes, Membership Secretary; Committee member, Mr Stephen Mulcahy.

In accordance with Article 17 of the Constitution there were two ex-officio members of the Committee, The Earl Howe representing the Patron membership with Mrs Kate Eckett as Patron Secretary.

Meetings of the Committee

The Committee met three times. Much of each meeting was taken up by oral reports from the Chairman, the Patron Chairman and the Museum Director. Financial reports and discussions of possible allocations also featured in all three meetings.

Patrons

Several new Patrons were welcomed to the membership and thanked for their support.

The Annual Patrons Meeting was held at Penn House on 25th October 2024 by kind permission of Earl and Countess Howe. The Patrons were given an interesting tour of the house.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT

This report covers the period April 2024 to end March 2025

The Financial Statement for the Friends and Patrons covering the last financial year (2024-25) has been approved by Les Sheldon, the appointed Independent Reviewer, and is presented as part of the Committee's Annual Report to the Annual General Meeting.

The following are the key headlines:

Total expenditure was £29,647, of which the total paid out as grants to the Museum was £25,513.

Total income was £25,161. Membership subscriptions being £9,750, and the remainder being made of income from the *Off the Wall* exhibition, bank interest, and donations. This included £1,978 received as Gift Aid recoverable from tax.

The Committee has been able to absorb the operating deficit of £4,465 from the reserve held.

Gift Aid is very valuable to the Friends & Patrons and incurs no cost to the subscriber. The only stipulation is that the individual must be a UK taxpayer. It just calls for the completion of a simple form and we do the rest. We are very grateful to those who are already signed up, and if any member would like to avail themselves of this facility please contact the relevant Membership Secretary for the form.

Your continuing generosity is much appreciated and, as you will see, is put to good use in supporting the Museum.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

This report covers the period April 2021 to end of March 2022



The Friends and Patrons continue their support, promotion, assistance and improvement of the Buckinghamshire County Museum Trust (The Trust), a charitable company (Charity Ref – 1153345).

In June the Museum formally changed its name to the Discover Bucks Museum.¹

Covid-19 still had an impact on the Museum this year with closures and staff shortages and it also caused delays to the Discover Bucks refurbishment project. The Omicron variant also influenced both the Museum and our operations during the final third of the reporting year just as there was hope of a return to normality.

Volunteers who normally help the keepers at the Halton site were again unable to work this year as the site was closed, except to staff.

Planned outings for the Friends were again cancelled.

In the Autumn the Friends organised their 11th Off the Wall Art Fair showing contemporary Bucks makers work which included paintings, prints, ceramics and jewellery. Over 150 people came to the opening and Friends volunteered to steward during the exhibition. £5,631 was raised for the F&P from sales of £15,816.

Kate Eckett retired at the last AGM as Chair of the Friends and Patrons after eight years in the role. Her successor is yet to be announced.

Sue Shave retired at the end of April 2022 after four years as Director of the Museum.

Museum staff, Sonia Whiteman and Mick Hutton retired after long service at the Museum and we thank them for their help over the years.

¹ Information Note – “Discover Bucks” is a trading name of The Buckinghamshire County Museum Trust. The Trust does not intend to change its name or legal identity. Likewise, the Friends and Patrons has resolved not to make a name change either.

Main Achievements

Over the year 2021/22 the Friends and Patrons have given grants to the Museum totalling £59,355.00 (see below).

The Patrons contributed to the refurbishment of the Discover Bucks Galleries and supported the Picasso and Masters of Print exhibition on loan from The Higgins Museum in Bedford.

The Friends' contribution of £17,500 to the Discover Bucks Galleries was the balance of the £150,000 committed to the project from the Brill legacy. The new galleries were opened to the public on 2nd April 2022. The Friends also supported the Museum's requests for Treasure items which included a medieval silver coin hoard - 18 silver coins of Henry III, a medieval silver ring (Leckhampstead), a post-medieval gold and emerald ring (Thornton), an early medieval (8thC) silver pin head (Leckhampstead), an early medieval gold necklace bead (Charndon), a post medieval silver dress hook (Longwick-cum-Ilmer) and an early medieval pieced gold coin (Bisham).

Membership

At 31 March 2022 total paid up individual membership of the Friends and Patrons amounted to 178 Friends and 84 Patrons (2020 = 179 Friends and 93 Patrons). There were also two Honorary Life Patrons and we welcomed a new Life Patron this year. In addition to the individual members there were five institutional members. The Committee recognises the need to bolster its respective memberships.

Annual Meeting

The Annual meeting was held jointly with the Patrons at the Museum on Saturday, 27th November 2021. The President, Sir Henry Aubrey-Fletcher, opened the meeting. The Chairman, Kate Eckett, then introduced the Annual Report following which the annual accounts were formally approved. Elections took place. Mr David Fulton was appointed as Independent Examiner. The Meeting was followed by guided tours of the new Discover Bucks Galleries given by the Keepers.

Officers and Committee Members

Sir Henry Aubrey-Fletcher continued as President. The full elected committee at 31 March 2022 comprised The Earl Howe, Acting Chairman; Mr John Galbraith, Honorary Treasurer; Miss Pam Russell, Honorary Secretary; Mrs Doreen Holmes, Membership Secretary; Committee member, Mr Stephen Mulcahy.

In accordance with Article 17 of the Constitution there were two ex officio members of the Committee, The Earl Howe representing the Patron membership with Mrs Kate Eckett as Patron Secretary.

Meetings of the Committee

The Committee met twice over Zoom. Much of each meeting was taken up by oral reports from the Chairman, the Patrons' Chairman and the Museum Director. Discussions were held about the renovation of the Discover Bucks galleries and the financing of the project. Financial reports and discussions of possible allocations also featured in all two meetings.

Patrons

The Annual Patrons Meeting was held jointly with the Friends at the Museum on Saturday, 27th November 2021. The Meeting was followed by guided tours of the new Discover Bucks Galleries which were given by the Keepers.

Volunteers

Volunteers again could not help the keepers at Halton due to Covid-19 regulations and only returned mid-April 2022.

Due to staff shortages at the Museum and hygiene restrictions, volunteers helped steward the summer Dinosaur exhibition (to which 3,500 visitors came), the summer programme of activities, a Georgian Christmas event and the Off the Wall Art Fair.
