Verdun Oak Sculpture : We launched an initiative to create a Sculpture from the damaged remains of an Oak Tree previously stood in the heart of the village of Pembridge, having grown from an Acorn sent by the Mayor of Verdun in 1919. Herefordshire Artist Ed Elliott was enlisted to create this work. 2. Improvements were made to the Lighting in the Bell Tower, enhancing the visitor experience. 3. A new Defibrillator (paid for by donation) was located in Pembridge main Car Park. <p>Key initiative: Appreciation</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Trustees agreed to support local website and social media platform: Portrait of Pembridge with an endowment /grant (proposed to be renewed annually) of up to £1,500 on the basis that PAT will use this as our principal route and resource for communications and fundraising. This is based on the fit between our Charitable Objects and the purpose/values/activities of Portrait of Pembridge... especially those which support our goal to educate the public in the architecture, history, natural history and geography of the parish of Pembridge one of the perceived benefits of this arrangement could be access to additional 'feet on the street' to support PAT initiatives beyond the limited time and resources of the Trustees themselves.




