Brighton Lions Club avails itself of training facilities provided by the International Association of Lions Clubs, District 105SE, and all prospective trustees are encouraged to attend the training sessions organised by District 105SE. Brighton Lions Club has been a member of the International Association of Lions Clubs for more than 70 years. The members of the club are volunteers who give their time unconditionally in support of charitable causes.

Matters are decided by a majority vote of the trustees present at a meeting, subject to there being a quorum of 3, the chairperson having a casting vote.

A quorate meeting of the trustees may exercise all its powers which include the management of the charity and the control of the trust fund.

The trustees may delegate their powers to one or more committees which may comprise one or more trustees.

The Club ensures that all activities are correctly managed and all financial risks are reviewed for each event. It is the current policy of the trustees to maintain separate reserves to finance day to day expenditure and urgent charitable contributions.

The trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the trust's aims and objectives and planning future activities, also in setting grant making policy for the year. The trustees consider the activities and achievements of the trust satisfy the public benefit requirements.

The club operates the Lions 'Message in a Bottle' scheme in the local area.

Although there was no longer a winter fuel allowance for people who did not need it to donate, the club did receive some donations and continued to operate its Project Wenceslas with a significant donation of its own. This was then used to assist local residents experiencing fuel poverty, the beneficiaries being referred to the club by agencies such as Citizens Advice and the Brighton & Hove Energy Services Co-op.

At Christmas and Easter, the club donated soft toys to children in hospital over the holiday periods and to a local organisation providing support to families in need.

The club continued to support other organisations and individuals with grants and donations. During the year under review the total expenditure in this way was £29,645.

Whilst decreasing and ageing membership has reduced the club's ability to organise fundraising events, previous careful stewardship of funds has enabled requests for assistance to be met. The club has continued to donate food for a number of foodbanks and to organise winter and summer outings for the pupils of local primary schools

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Although fundraising events were much reduced, because of previous careful stewardship of finances, the trustees were able to make grants and donations during the year amounting to £29,645 (2024 £19,490), the majority of which were to local organisations and individuals, Expenditure through Project Wenceslas to help local people in fuel poverty was in excess of £5,700.

Despite the lack of income from events, the trustees remain confident that the club has sufficient reserves and remains a going concern. Prudent management of finances will enable the club to continue to provide much needed assistance to worthy causes and local individuals in need.




TRUSTEES' REPORT

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2025

The trustees present their report and accounts for the year ended 30 June 2025.

Objectives and activities

The object of the trust is to apply its income for any purpose that is charitable according to the law of England and Wales whether for the benefit of any individual, group of people or for the benefit of any other organisation established for charitable purposes.

Although opportunities for the club to organise its own fundraising events decreased during the year, careful stewardship of funds enabled requests for assistance to be met. The club continued to support other organisations and individuals in need with grants and donations, including the operation of Project Wenceslas providing assistance to residents of Brighton and Hove in fuel poverty through local agencies, delivering soft toys to children in hospital at Christmas and Easter, organising winter and summer outings for pupils at city primary schools, operating the Lions 'Message in a Bottle' scheme in the local area and donating food to a number of foodbanks throughout the year.

Achievement and performance

The club was able to make grants and donations during the year amounting to £29,645 (2024: £19,490), the majority of which were to local organisations and individuals. Expenditure through Project Wenceslas was in excess of £5,700.

Financial review and reserves

The trustees are pleased to report a surplus of £4,713 (2024: £3,836) in the year under review, with total funds of £555,336 (2024: £550,623) at the year end.

Despite the lack of income from events, the trustees remain confident that the club has sufficient reserves and remains a going concern. Continued prudent management of finances will enable the club to provide much needed assistance to worthy causes and local individuals in need.

Plans for the future

The club fully intends to maintain its regular service activities, including Project Wenceslas. In addition, a plan is in place to aid 24 foodbanks in Brighton and Hove by making a £500 food delivery to all of them over the coming year at a rate of two per month. PSA and diabetes testing events will also be held locally in conjunction with relevant organisations.

The club will actively continue to seek new members and seek new opportunities to provide charitable assistance where needed.





The trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the trust's aims and objectives and planning future activities, also in setting grant making policy for the year. The trustees consider the activities and achievements of the trust satisfy the public benefit requirements. Along with fundraising activities, several service activities have been suspended because of the Covid 19 situation.

The club operates the Lions 'Message in a Bottle' scheme in the local area.

The club invited people who received the winter fuel allowance but did not need it themselves to donate the money to the club's Project Wenceslas. This was then used to assist local residents experiencing fuel poverty, the beneficiaries being referred to the club by agencies such as the Citizens Advice Bureau.

At Christmas and Easter, the club donated soft toys to children in hospital over the holiday periods and also to children at a women's refuge.

The club continued to support other organisations and individuals with grants and donations. During the year under review the total expenditure in this way was £30,034

This has been a difficult year for the club with no large fundraising events able to take place. However, requests for financial assistance increased as other charitable organisations such as Food Banks were called upon as a result of Covid 19. Because of previous careful stewardship of funds, the club was able to assist.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Although fund raising events were seriously curtailed, because of previous careful stewardship of finances the trustees were able to make grants and donations during the year amounting to £30,034 (2020 £37,417) of which £16,092 (2020 £23,175) was to organisations, with the remainder for the benefit of individuals. Expenditure through Project Wenceslas to help local people in fuel poverty was in excess of £8,000. Some 99% of the overall charitable expenditure was for the benefit of local organisations and individuals.

As mentioned earlier, it has been a difficult year. Being unable to hold most of our usual previous fundraising events, the trustees have utilised reserves to provide much-needed assistance to local individuals and worthy causes. The trustees however remain confident that the charity remains a going concern as reserves are not exhausted and we hope to be able soon to resume normal fundraising activities.





INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT

TO THE TRUSTEES OF BRIGHTON LIONS CLUB CHARITY TRUST FUND

I report to the charity trustees on my examination of the accounts of Brighton Lions Club Charity Trust Fund (the Charity) for the year ended 30 June 2021.

Responsibilities and basis of report
