ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR TO 31/5/2022

The St. Francis Hospice for Cats, 127 Burton Road, Overseal, Swadlincote, Derbyshire. DE12 6JL is constituted by Deed of Trust and is registered with the Charity Commissioners (No 1062053).

The object of the charity is to relieve the suffering of cats that are in need of care and attention, in particular those who are elderly, infirm, chronically and terminally ill and to provide facilities for their reception and care. The charity receives no official funding and is solely funded by financial donations from its supporters.

This has been a very quiet year of operation, with enquiries and contacts for cats needing the charity's help being at a record low.

During the year under review there have been two new residents arriving in the charity's care and sadly one cat in our care was lost through needing to be euthanised, with another cat dying of natural causes. The charity now cares for 16 cats at the year end.

The charity had another quiet year in terms of achievement with this in mind the charity did manage to generate a surplus of receipts over payments for the financial year of £32,055. Receipts for the year did show an increase on the previous financial year, with legacy income continuing to be the main source of income.

Direct charitable expenditure remains in line with 2020/21 spends for both Veterinary charges and Cleaning and Cat Care, however food costs have increased substantially, this is anticipated to continue into the new financial year as food donations and food collection points have unfortunately decreased. The monthly cat care is provided by a Trustee who does receive payment for these services. A written agreement is in place in line with Charity Commission guidance regarding Trustee expenses. Decisions based on the terms and conditions for these services are made in the best interests of the charity and are agreed by a majority vote excluding the paid Trustee and connected party.

Other expenditure again continues in line with 2020/21 recorded costs, this is also expected to increase quite rapidly in the new financial year due to the energy price increase.

The cash reserves at the year-end equated to 75 months normal operating expenditure, the trustees consider this to be reasonable given current rates of inflation, particularly in relation to heating.
