By providing a social environment that improves the lives of Nottinghamshire's Chinese elderly by reducing loneliness and depression. By providing support for daily living, which includes ensuring our elderly have safe and healthy housing and ensuring they get a healthy meal.

Summary of the main achievements during the period

This year we have provided the following:

- Translation service;
- The office is open for enquiries on Tuesdays and occasionally on Friday;
- Elderly lunch club;
- Tai Chi Exercise Club & Heathy Sit Down Exercise;
- Occasionally healthy talks from NHS;
- English Class;
- Day trips;
- Quarterly newsletter;
- Elderly home visits;
- Cultural celebrations: Easter Celebration, Dragon boat festival, sharing rice dumpling, Mid-Autumn festival, Christmas meal and Chinese New Year etc;
- Support for Chinese elderly and infirm.

The Cost of Living project was funded by Awards for All, starting from 1 May to 2024 to the end of April 2026.

We provide for our long term members and also received new elderly from Hong Kong who hold British National Oversea status.

We have worked with Thriving Nottingham to provide Healthy Check (MOT) and Health & Wellbeing Community Champions to provide healthy sit down exercise. We also provide Tuesday Lunch club, Tai Chi and English classes.

We have kept supporting our members regarding to their individual needs.

We sourced rice dumpling to celebrate Dragon Boat Festival in May 2024.

We organised:

50 people for a day trip to Birmingham in May 2024

49 people for a day trip to Leicester/Luton in July 2024

49 people for a day trip to Skegness in August 2024

53 people for a day trip to Leeds in February 2025.

We celebrated our AGM with our members and guests at Mr Man's Chinese restaurant in September 2024. We Celebrated Christmas at May Sum restaurant in December 2024. We celebrated Chinese New Year at Mandarin Chinese restaurant in January 2025.

We have been working with NCVS to attend Tendering and Woman in Charge trainings at Trent University.

We have been working with University Research workshops at Nottingham Central Library.

We are working with Anchor Hanover Housing Association to deliver translation and interpreting to the Chinese who are living in sheltered housing accommodation.

Financial review

We have sight of resources to cover the next 18 Months at our current levels of expenditure with limited office facilities. We continue to work on funding opportunities.

We need to continue to look for sources of income to maintain income levels.

The charity's policy on reserves

Our policy is to hold 2-3 months' reserves in order to ensure the smooth running of the organisation on a day to day basis.





Summary of the main activities undertaken for the public benefit

Home visits & Housing assistance (safety, damp, heating etc), Interpreting & Translation (Cantonese and Mandarin), help with reading letters & correspondence (filling in forms and writing letters), Doctors, dentists and hospital appointments, pension issues, elderly needs and social services support.

We provide a social meeting and lunch club for the elderly to reduce loneliness and isolation.

We organise talks that raise awareness of e.g. Mental and physical health, home safety, healthy eating etc.

We organise Tai Chi exercise class and English classes. Members receive a quarterly newsletter. We organise cultural events such as the Chinese New Year and Mid-Autumn festival. We organise day trips to places of interest. E.g. London, York, Cambridge.

We have 100 official members plus other members of the public who take part in and benefit from these activities.

Public benefit statement

The Trustees confirm that they have complied with the duty in section 17 of the Charities Act 2011 to have due regard to the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit, 'Charities and Public Benefit'.

Summary of the main achievements during the period

During the last year:

- We have been doing Lunch Club and Tai Chi on Tuesdays.
- We have continued to support our members according to their individual needs.
- We held our AGM with 80 people in September.
- In September we had a Cancer Awareness Talk.
- We organised a day trip to London with 50 people to join the trip in October 2022.
- We organised Christmas with 50 people in December 2022 and Chinese New Year with 60 people at ICC in February 2023.
- We are selling party dresses to help fundraising.
- We organised a day Trip to Manchester on 14 Feb 2023 with 49 people.
- We have been working with Age UK to have two IT/Mobile classes from 10:00 am to 11:00 am and 1:00 pm - 2:00 pm from the end of January until end of March 2023.
- We have been granted £10,000 from Awards for All for Cost of Living project in March 2023.
- We received funding from the City Council for Covid-19 to employ two part-time staff for 6 months and also funding from Champion Community fund completing by December 2022.
