Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 March 2025

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2025. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The objects of the charity are

- To advance the Christian Religion
- To relieve poverty, sickness and distress

The charity has continued to pursue the activities detailed in its deed of trust and in accordance with the above objects.

Barnabas (Outreach) Trust is a mission organisation that gives people of all ages and backgrounds an opportunity to experience preaching, teaching and ministry in a different cultural setting. The aim of Barnabas (Outreach) Trust is to encourage churches and individuals to support and facilitate the spread of the Christian Gospel message locally and worldwide. Barnabas (Outreach) Trust has developed a ministry for equipping and releasing individuals for evangelism and mission.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

Clive McIntyre & Simon Groves travelled to Romania in May 2024. They met with Pastors in the areas of Rosiori and Alexandria to discuss plans for a mission in June 2024.

A small team, which included Clive & Ann McIntyre, Marian Bateman & Graeme Turner, travelled in June 2024 for the 10-day Mission to Romania and visited Rosiori, Turnu, Alexandria and surrounding villages. The team shared the Gospel message and ministered to those in need.

Clive & Ann travelled to Romania again in September 2024 to spend time with Florenta & Mark Hamilton, who always accompany the mission and pre-mission trips. Florenta & Mark provide transport, interpretation and make the necessary local arrangements for the trips. Plans for future missions were discussed with local Pastors.

Sean & Joyce McIntyre travelled to Kenya in December 2024. They spent time with Pastors Mac & Faith Kioko and Barnabas East Africa Church in Mombasa and spent time in Kisumu.

Clive & Ann were unable to go to Kenya in 2024 due to lack of funds, but did travel in February 2025. Their time was spent in Mombasa with Pastors Mac & Faith Kioko and Barnabas East Africa Church. The charity continues to support and facilitate the ongoing work of this church plant and Clive & Ann were encouraged by the developing ministry of Barnabas East Africa under the guidance of Pastors Mac & Faith. The pastors introduced Clive & Ann to Sharon & Lewis who run the "Tusemezane" fellowship (Swahili for "let's talk") and so Clive & Ann also worked with them during their time there.

Unfortunately, it was not possible to include a visit to Maasailand on this Kenya mission trip. Sadly, our contact and head of the Maasai Evangelical Association, David Kereto, died at the beginning of the year following an accident in October. Clive & Ann met Joshua Kereto, David's son, at Nairobi Airport and as a result, hope to work with Joshua in the future. Joshua, along with other members of the family, are looking to continue David's legacy to help and support the Maasai community. He hopes to continue a number of projects, including those that Barnabas Outreach Trust started with David and have been involved with; Widows & Orphans and Goat project, plus help for the girls at risk of FGM, abuse and early forced marriage.

Fundraising activities and public benefit

Fundraising efforts continue to achieve development on the plot of land in Mombasa purchased by Barnabas East Africa in 2008, which includes the church building and facilities, the provision of free water to the local community and local outreach activities. A child sponsorship scheme continues to help support children from playgroup to primary and secondary school. Fundraising efforts continue to support Maasai community projects as well as local outreach activities in Romania.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Principal funding sources

Principal funding sources for the charity are currently through donations received from supporters and gift-aid reclaims as appropriate.

Investment policy and objectives

Aside from retaining any accumulated surpluses as reserves each year, most of the charity's funds are to be spent in the short term so there are no funds considered available for long term investment. Having considered the options, available the Management Committee has decided to hold any surplus amount available in a high interest deposit account.

Reserves policy

It is difficult to accumulate sufficient unrestricted funds to achieve a desirable reserves policy due to the nature of the charity which receives the majority of its funding as restricted funds for designated projects. In order to avoid financial commitments over and above available funds, the activities of the trusts are approved by the Management Committee subject of funds being available.

FUTURE PLANS

Kenya - the trust will maintain its contacts in Kenya, and a future visit is planned for January 2026. Clive & Ann hope to include a visit to Maasailand to observe progress with the various projects now being overseen by David Kereto's son, Joshua. They also plan to visit the church plant in Mombasa.

Romania - the trust will maintain its contacts in Romania and a pre-mission trip is planned for May 2025, to prepare for a proposed mission in August/September 2025.

Training - The trust will continue to provide training for mission, covering a variety of topics that prepare individuals for mission, as and when required. This will be available to those going on mission or contemplating mission work.

New Contacts - Barnabas (Outreach) Trust works towards acquiring new contacts to support the ministry and encouraging new people to go on mission.

Trustees - Barnabas (Outreach) Trust is actively seeking suitable candidates to increase the number of Trustees.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust and constitutes an unincorporated charity.

The charity is currently governed by a Deed of Declaration of Trust dated 2nd March 1997, as amended by the Deed of Amendment dated 8th May 1997.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

New Trustees are appointed by existing Trustees. The original Trustees were appointed by the original Declaration of Trust. In certain circumstances, individuals are approached to offer themselves for election as a Trustee but not accepted unless nominated and elected by the current board of Trustees. The management committee seeks to ensure that the needs of the charity are appropriately reflected through the diversity of its Trustees.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Organisational structure

At present, the committee consists of 3 trustees, which includes the chief executive and the secretary of Barnabas (Outreach) Trust. All members of the committee are from a variety of professional backgrounds relevant to the work of the charity. Other people are invited to attend meetings as and when relevant.

The Board of Reference brings credibility of the work of the charity to the public. 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year end date are noted as a commitment but not accrued as expenditure.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

The aim of Barnabas (Outreach) Trust is to encourage churches and individuals to support and facilitate the spread of the Christian Gospel message locally and worldwide. Barnabas (Outreach) Trust has developed a ministry for equipping and releasing individuals for evangelism and mission.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

Clive & Ann McIntyre travelled to Romania in March 2023 to meet with Pastors in the areas of Rosiori and Alexandria to discuss mission opportunities. As a result, a mission was planned for June 2023.

A small team, which included Clive & Ann plus 2 others, travelled in June 2023 for the Mission to Romania and visited Rosiori, Turnu, Alexandria and surrounding villages. The team shared the Gospel message and ministered to those in need.

Clive & Ann hoped to travel to Tanzania & Kenya in April 2023 as David Kereto, head of the Maasai Evangelical Association and who encourages the growth of Maasai churches in Kenya and Tanzania, had invited them to join him there to provide teaching at a leadership conference with the Maasai Pastors and leaders. Sadly, they were unable to travel in April 2023 and partake in the conference due to lack of available funds.

Clive & Ann travelled later in the year to Kenya, in October 2023, and spent a week in Maasailand plus a week in Mombasa. They worked with David Kereto in Maasailand. In addition to overseeing Maasai churches, David is also involved with projects to protect young girls at risk of FGM and early forced marriage and to support widows in the Maasai community. Clive & Ann stayed at the Ereto Guest House which is part of a development in the Maasai Mara area being run as a non-profit business to generate income to support the Maasai projects. In 2022, Barnabas Outreach Trust helped David instigate the "Widows and Orphans" project and as part of their 2023 programme, Clive & Ann met with the widows to share a word of encouragement and to hand out gifts of maize flour to help during the current water shortage and famine. This year, they started the "Goat" project which is an initiative to help the widows become self-supportive. The challenge for the widows is to fatten the goat purchased for them, sell it and then buy two more goats to fatten and sell, and so on. The aim is for them to generate funds to support the needs of the widows in the group, including their families. Whilst in Maasailand, Clive & Ann also brought teaching and training for church leaders and Pastors, taught at church meetings and made visits to two local schools.

The charity has continued to support and facilitate the ongoing work of the Barnabas church plant in Mombasa, now known as Barnabas East Africa. Clive & Ann spent time with Pastors Mac & Faith Kioko and were pleased to observe further expansion and growth, both structurally and spiritually, since their visit the previous year. They joined members of the church family and local community for church meetings and home visits. With covid restrictions now lifted for overseas travel, missions in 2022 could be organised. Clive & Ann McIntyre travelled to Romania in April 2022 to meet with Pastors in the areas of Rosiori and Alexandria to discuss mission opportunities. As a result, a mission was planned for June 2022.

During the pre-mission trip in April, Clive & Ann were able to distribute funds to help support contacts in Romania who are caring and providing for Ukrainian refugees. They also assessed needs for further assistance.

Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 March 2022

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2022. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The objects of the charity are

- To advance the Christian Religion
- To relieve poverty, sickness and distress

The charity has continued to pursue the activities detailed in its deed of trust and in accordance with the above objects.

Barnabas (Outreach) Trust is a mission organisation that gives people of all ages and backgrounds an opportunity to experience preaching, teaching and ministry in a different cultural setting. The aim of Barnabas (Outreach) Trust is to encourage churches and individuals to support and facilitate the spread of the Christian Gospel message locally and worldwide. Barnabas (Outreach) Trust has developed a ministry for equipping and releasing individuals for evangelism and mission.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, it was not feasible to organize a mission to Romania in June 2021. Clive & Ann McIntyre were, however, able to visit Romania in September 2021, adhering to covid-19 regulations in place for overseas travel.

Their trip enabled them to reconnect with Pastors in the areas of Rosiori and Alexandria and discuss mission opportunities for 2022. As a result, a pre-mission trip was planned for April 2022, to be followed up with a mission in June 2022.

Reports were received in February/March 2022 that Pastors in Romania were adapting space in their church buildings to accommodate refugees fleeing from Ukraine as a result of attacks from Russia. Clive & Ann therefore plan to take donations when they travel in April to help support the refugees, and those helping them. They will assess their needs and consider where further assistance can be offered to support the work with Ukrainian refugees further.

The charity has continued to support and facilitate the ongoing work of the Barnabas church plant in Mombasa, registered as Barnabas East Africa.

Sean & Joyce McIntyre and Clive & Ann McIntyre travelled to Kenya in December 2021. Sean & Joyce have relinquished their leadership responsibility for New Life Church, Mombasa, having established and developed it over the last 20 years. The future of the church is now the responsibility of the new leaders, Pastors Macmillan and Faith Kioko, who have made great progress with the church both structurally and spiritually, over the last year.

After a period of very hot weather, the original bore hole on the grounds of the church was unable to produce enough water for the community, as the water levels got too low. A new bore hole has been dug and water is being provided again for the local community using the solar powered pump. The fence around the church grounds has been completed, with just the gates now waiting to be installed at three entry points. A digital security system has been installed, protecting the church building and a strong room has been built to store the PA equipment, with a sound cage at the back. New Life Church is also enjoying increased activities which include dedicated times of worship and a seminar for children.

Barnabas Outreach Trust looks forward to a mission partnership with Pastors Mac & Faith in the future and plan to travel to Kenya to visit them in the autumn of 2022.

Clive & Ann have also maintained contact with David Kereto, Director of the Maasai Evangelical Association. Barnabas Outreach Trust continues to support David's work with local Maasai churches and with young Maasai girls, providing education and protection from FGM.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Fundraising activities and public benefit

Fundraising efforts are being made to support Ukrainian refugees in Romania. Fundraising efforts continue to achieve development on the plot of land in Mombasa purchased by Barnabas East Africa in 2008, which includes the provision of free water to the local community. A child sponsorship scheme continues to help support children from playgroup to primary and secondary school.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Principal funding sources

Principal funding sources for the charity are currently through donations received from supporters and gift-aid claims as appropriate.

Investment policy and objectives

Aside from retaining any accumulated surpluses as reserves each year, most of the charity's funds are to be spent in the short term so there are no funds considered available for long term investment. Having considered the options, available the Management Committee has decided to hold any surplus amount available in a high interest deposit account.

Reserves policy

It is difficult to accumulate sufficient unrestricted funds to achieve a desirable reserves policy due to the nature of the charity which receives the majority of its funding as restricted funds for designated projects. In order to avoid financial commitments over and above available funds, the activities of the trusts are approved by the Management Committee subject of funds being available.

FUTURE PLANS

Kenya - the trust will maintain its contacts in Kenya, and a future visit is planned for 2022/23.

Romania - the trust will maintain its contacts in Romania and a pre-mission trip is planned for April 2022, to prepare for a proposed mission in June 2022.

Training - The trust will continue to provide training for mission, covering a variety of topics that prepare individuals for mission, as and when required. This will be available to those going on mission or contemplating mission work.

New Contacts - Barnabas (Outreach) Trust still hopes and works towards acquiring new contacts.

Trustees - Barnabas (Outreach) Trust is actively seeking suitable candidates to increase the number of Trustees.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust and constitutes an unincorporated charity.

The charity is currently governed by a Deed of Declaration of Trust dated 2nd March 1997, as amended by the Deed of Amendment dated 8th May 1997.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

New Trustees are appointed by existing Trustees. The original Trustees were appointed by the original Declaration of Trust. In certain circumstances, individuals are approached to offer themselves for election as a Trustee but not accepted unless nominated and elected by the current board of Trustees. The management committee seeks to ensure that the needs of the charity are appropriately reflected through the diversity of its Trustees.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year end date are noted as a commitment but not accrued as expenditure.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
