Annual report of Siri Guru Singh Sabha, Crawley. (Regd. Charity No:1063786) for the year 2024-2025

Siri Guru Singh Sabha, Crawley is an unincorporated registered charity. It is established for religious and charitable purpose and for meeting the wider needs of the community.

Part 1 Summary of general update

Ever since the move in 2015 from its previous premises known as Spencer Road, the charity has suffered both financially and on a practical level and been forced to litigate to obtain its asset. Finally, having been forced into 3 rounds of litigation, the litigation ended in September 2024 and we were able to recover our property at Spencer's Road. The Charity was also successful in recovering 86% of its legal cost expenditure. There has been an enormous sense of relief amongst the Sabha members and the Holding and Management Trustees of the Charity. The Charity is thriving once again and has paid off all its loans and borrowed money. The Charity now has a positive balance. The Charity is currently looking at seeking planning permission for a development project to enhance the value of the site at Spencer's Road. The intention is to maximise the value of this site in order to fund the development of the Gurdwara at Ifield Green. The Charity has appointed an architect to look at developing both sites and an application will be submitted in the very near future. The Sabha has waited a long time and we are hopeful that our long-awaited plans to extend the site at Ifield Green will go ahead in the foreseeable future. Our congregation continues to grow and the Charity is considering temporary measures to meet the needs of our congregation. In the interim period the Charity is looking to extend the Porch to accommodate a safe area for the removal of shoes and upgrade the veranda to ensure it is both safe and meets the needs of the Charity on a temporary basis.

Part 2: Meeting our charity's objectives

The Trustees and the Management Committee have had due regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit. In particular the charity has provided public benefit in relation to the advancement of religion and of community development particularly through its education and youth activities which involve all members of the local community.

We have continued to educate and raise awareness of the Sikh faith through introductory talks on Sikhism to local schools, scout groups, councillors, Interfaith Crawley and other interested individuals and organisations. There has been a huge increase in the number of requests from schools wanting to visit our Gurdwara. We have willingly accommodated all of these schools/scout visits. Some schools struggle with organising trips to the Gurdwara and in these situations we have arranged our volunteers to go out to these schools. Our relations have gone from strength to strength with the Local Council, West Sussex Police and the National Crime Agency and we continue our educational program on an ongoing basis to these organisation. At our yearly Vaisakhi Celebration in April of this year were honoured and privileged to have the Lord Lieutenant of West Sussex and the Sherriff of West Sussex, and representatives from various local charities and local Councillors visit our Gurdwara. We continue to network and support other local charities and this year raised funds to support a local Hospice, St Catherine's Hospice. Very recently, we have also raised funds to support the 'Sikh Games'

which aims to encourage Sikhs to play and participate in sport and games. We hope one day, to be able to host these games at our site.

Our work in the local community has gone from strength to strength and we have maintained good relations with a number of local voluntary organisations and other charitable organisations. In particular, we encourage and collaborate on a lot of health/wellbeing issues with the Crawley Well Being Team, Carers Support, and Alzheimer's Society. We work closely with the Police and Crawley Borough Council and representatives from the Management Committee attend the Crawley Ambassadors Meetings and the Positive Engagement meeting hosted by the Crawley Police. In addition the Charity has committed to providing 30 – 60 meals per week to the homeless in Crawley and our own vulnerable and elderly.

The Charity continues its efforts to promote healthy living through educating our congregation through visiting speakers. The Charity has promoted care in the community through raising awareness of Dementia, Diabetes, Alternative therapies and Hypertension and Heart Disease. We encourage and promote Carers Support West Sussex and the Alzheimer's Society as well as the NHS to come and give educational presentations and provide information and support to our community.

The Charity is proud to report that we are going from strength to strength showing a positive increase in membership and visitors. Classes for learning Punjabi language and music continues, along with other initiatives to encourage and educate our younger members to learn and participate. We held a 'Hola Mohalla' event in March of this year and this was well attended by locals and visiting organisations and stall holders.

The concept of equality is a fundamental value of our faith right from its inception in the 15th Century and remains embedded in our practices in the running of our Gurdwara/Charity.

The Sikh faith encourages sport and the Gurdwara has sporting facilities which are open to the local community. Our fields have been used by a local team, Three Bridges Football Club for over 3 years and this was very successful. Unfortunately, the Charity has been unable to bring the football pitches or the tennis courts to the required standards for larger clubs to use. However, we have encouraged local teams, our children/members to participate in regular football matches, and invited the community to use our grounds and tennis courts. The Gurdwara prides itself in having an open policy for all members of all communities, religions and races.

We continue to practise zero tolerance of the use of alcohol, tobacco and drugs and consumption of all non-veg foods such as meat and meat products, poultry, eggs and fish on our charity premises. We also promote healthy eating.

Development of our library is in steady progress and we have now doubled the number of books available to our members/congregation to use. We continue to inspire our members to read historical literature and provide translated versions of stories and the Guru Granth Sahib Ji, to develop a better understanding of the teachings.

Annual report of Siri Guru Singh Sabha, Crawley. (Regd. Charity No: 1063786) for the year 2023-24

Siri Guru Singh Sabha, Crawley is an unincorporated registered charity. It is established for religious and charitable purpose and for meeting the wider needs of the community.

Part 1 Summary of general update

Ever since the move in 2015 from its previous premises known as Spencer Road, the charity has suffered both financially and on a practical level and been forced to litigate to obtain its asset. In spite of High Court Judge ruling in our favour, the defendants of that case left the property occupied. The Charity has been forced to spend further funds on gaining an Eviction order which is ongoing. This continued unauthorised occupation of our charity's assets has caused freezing of our potential land sale funds in excess of £2 million. The current defendants are claiming they have a right to the property based on the fact that they have contributed to the upkeep of the property since 1983. We are awaiting the decision from a London Court in the very near future.

Our intentions to develop our Ifield Green site as it was conceived way back in January 2012 and meet our charity objectives with sustained vigour have yet to materialise. The Charity has consulted with 3 architects who were very hopeful of our intentions to develop/extend our site to accommodate our increase in both members and the congregation. In spite, of the expenditure on litigation, the Charity is going from strength to strength and we have had to make temporary arrangements in the form of a lean to Veranda to accommodate the increase in numbers.

Part 2: Meeting our charity's objectives

We have continued to educate and raise awareness of the Sikh faith through introductory talks on Sikhism to local schools, scout groups, councillors, Interfaith Crawley and other interested individuals and organisations. We have opened our doors to all the requests from schools in Sussex and Surrey and there has been an increase in demand since Covid. To make it easier for those schools who cannot visit, we go out to the schools to accommodate their needs. We have built good relations with the West Sussex Police and the National Crime Agency and continue our educational program on an ongoing basis. Recently we have hosted the Sherriff of West Sussex, Crawley Mayor along with other Councillors. We were privileged to have a visit from the Lord Lieutenant Lady Emma Barnard last year.

Our work in the local community has gone from strength to strength and we have maintained good relations with a number of local voluntary organisations and other charitable organisations. In particular, we encourage and collaborate on a lot of health/well-being issues with the Carers Support, Crawley Community Action Group and Alzheimer's Society. We endeavour to continue to build on these and continue to send out prepacked cooked meals to the Homeless in Crawley and our own vulnerable and elderly.

Siri Guru Singh Sabha, Crawley is an unincorporated registered charity. It is established for religious and charitable purpose and for meeting the wider needs of the community.

Part 1 Summary of general update

Ever since the move in 2015 from its previous premises known as Spencers Road, the charity has suffered both financially and on a practical level and been forced to litigate in order to obtain its asset. In spite of an agreement to vacate, the property at Spencers Road in February 2022, it was still left occupied by the previous claimants and the Charity has been forced to spend further funds on gaining an Eviction order which is ongoing. This continued unauthorised occupation of our charity has caused freezing of our potential land sale funds in excess of £2 million. The main matters contested in the court were: the validity of our current constitution as the governing document of the charity and the legal standing of our trustees (Executive Committee) to run the registered charity 1063786 and a High Court Judge ruled in our favour on both counts.

Our intentions to develop our Ifield Green site as it was conceived way back in January 2012 and meet our charity objectives with sustained vigour have yet to materialise as we still have an ongoing legal battle to evict the current occupants. The Charity has consulted with 3 architects who were very hopeful of our intentions to develop/extend our site to accommodate our increase in both members and the congregation. In spite, of the expenditure on litigation, the Charity is going from strength to strength and we have had to make temporary arrangements in the form of a lean to Veranda to accommodate the increase in numbers.

Part 2: Meeting our charity's objectives

We have continued to educate and raise awareness of the Sikh faith through introductory talks on Sikhism to local schools, scout groups, councillor, Interfaith Crawley and other interested individuals and organisations. We hosted the Crawley Interfaith Group and this was one of the most interesting and enlightening experiences for all concerned. We have built good relations with the West Sussex Police and the National Crime Agency and continue our educational programme on an ongoing basis.

Our work in the local community has gone from strength to strength and we have maintained good relations with a number of local voluntary organisations and other charitable organisations. We endeavour to continue to build on these and continue to send out prepacked cooked meals to the Homeless in Crawley and our own vulnerable and elderly. We continue our work with the Gatwick Detention Centre and now have a member of our Sikh community volunteering his services on the Internal Monitoring Board for the Centre. We have also continued to provide clothing through the Gatwick Detention Centre Welfare Group.

The Charity continues its efforts to promote healthy living and regularly invites visiting speakers from the local Well-being Team, the NHS and the Gurdwara encourage active living. Our ladies have actively taken part in aqua aerobics, swimming and exercise classes. The Charity has promoted care in the community through raising awareness of Dementia, Diabetes, Alternative therapies and Hypertension and Heart Disease. We encourage and promote Carers Support

West Sussex and the Alzheimer's Society and NHS to come and give educational presentations and provide information and support to our community.

The Gurdwara is proud to report that we are going from strength to strength showing a positive increase in membership and visitors. Classes for learning Punjabi language and music continues, along with other initiatives to encourage and educate our younger members to learn and participate.

The concept of equality is a fundamental value of our faith right from its inception in the 15th Century and remains embedded in our practices in the running of our Gurdwara/Charity. To this end, the Charity promotes and welcomes members of all faiths into the Gurdwara.

The Sikh faith encourages sport and the Gurdwara has sporting facilities which are open to the local community. They are regularly using our facilities for their training. We continue to inspire our members to read historical literature and have providing translated versions of stories and the Guru Granth Sahib Ji, to develop a better understanding of the teachings.

Siri Guru Singh Sabha, Crawley is an unincorporated registered charity. It is established for religious and charitable purpose and for meeting the wider needs of the community.

Part 1 Summary of general update

The Charity underwent a 3.5 day trial to establish ownership of both charity assets, including that of the Charity's previous premises (Spencers Road) in March 2021. Having undergone 2 further appeals, the decision made by the Judge in March was upheld and those in occupation agreed to leave in January 2022. In spite of an agreement to vacate, the property at Spencers Road was still left in occupation by the previous claimants and the Charity has been forced to spend further funds on gaining an Eviction order which is ongoing. This continued unauthorised occupation of our charity's has caused freezing of our potential land sale funds in excess of £2.million. The main matters contested in the court were: the validity of our current constitution as the governing document of the charity and the legal standing of our trustees (Executive Committee) to run the registered charity 1063786 and a High Court Judge ruled in our favour on both counts.

Our intentions to develop our Ifield Green site as it was conceived way back in January 2012 and meet our charity objectives with sustained vigour have yet to materialise as we still have an ongoing legal battle to evict the current occupants. The Charity has consulted with 3 architects who were very hopeful of our intentions to develop/extend our site to accommodate our increase in both members and the congregation. We

Protective security of our more than 7-acre Ifield Green site has been on our mind ever since we bought it. Fortunately, we were successful in application for a Home Office Grant Scheme for protective security for Places of Worship. With this funding we have been able to install Intruder Alarm System, Automatic metal double swing gate and Video Intercom system for entry to the site. We would like to express our deep gratitude to the Home Office for this Scheme and approving our grant application.

Unfortunately, the impact of Covid still remains and this in turn heavily impacted on our finances. It also constrained our development initiatives. The Charity has barely recovered from Covid and is now faced with a rise in living costs and higher utility bills.

Part 2: Meeting our charity's objectives

We have continued to educate and raise awareness of the Sikh faith through introductory talks on Sikhism to local schools, scout groups, councillors and other interested individuals and organisations. Since normal opening of our Gurdwara, we have been very pro-active in providing training to the West Sussex Police and the National Crime Agency. We continue to send out prepacked langar to the Homeless in Crawley and our vulnerable and elderly. We have invited our MP, councillors, police, people of other faiths and schools and shared our values and how we worship. The Charity continues its efforts to promote healthy living through educating our congregation through visiting speakers from the local Well Being Team. Our congregation have participated in virtual yoga classes, regular walking and are currently looking to go swimming/aqua aerobics. In addition, the Charity has promoted care in the community through raising awareness of Dementia. We have had Carers Support West Sussex and the Alzheimers Society come and give educational presentations and provide information and support to our community.

Siri Guru Singh Sabha, Crawley is an unincorporated registered charity. It is established for religious and charitable purpose and for meeting the wider needs of the community.

Part 1 Summary of general update

Continued unauthorised occupation of our charity's previous premises (Spencers Road) had caused freezing of our potential land sale funds in excess of £1.5 million. Despite being time consuming, tiresome and financially draining, it became evident that we do need to fulfil our legal obligation to safeguard charity assets and hence seek assistance of the court. The main matters contested in the court were: the validity of our current constitution as the governing document of our registered charity and the legal standing of our trustees (Executive Committee) to run our registered charity No. 1063786.

It was fundamentally important to establish the ownership of the site. It is gratifying to record that by the grace Waheguru ji, we as the claimants, won on both the above issues in a 3.5-day trial that took place in March 2020. We can now move on, develop our Ifield Green site as it was conceived way back in January 2012 and meet our charity objectives with sustained vigour. We gratefully acknowledge the Charity Commission's support in allowing us to proceed with Part 8 claim in the court. We also acknowledge the unfading backing of our registered members. We were fairly confident that the democratic decisions that we made would prove to be RIGHT. In the end, it was a victory of RIGHTEOUSNESS and TRUTH. The permanent home of the charity at Ifield Green is now legally confirmed.

Protective security of our more than 7-acre Ifield Green site has been on our mind ever since we bought it. Fortunately, we have been able to benefit from the Home Office Scheme for protective security for Places of Worship. Under this scheme, our first ever such funding last year (2019-20), enabled us to install security fencing that covered almost the entire perimeter of our site. During this reported year (2020-21), we were able to secure further funding of £55,391.60 of which, like the previous year's grant, we were required to contribute 20% of the total funding. With this funding we have been able install Intruder Alarm System, Automatic metal double swing gate and Video Intercom system for entry to the site. We would like to express our deep gratitude to the Home Office for this Scheme and approving our grant application.

At this point, it is imperative to mention the impact of Covid-19 Pandemic on our charity. It forced us to hold back on several major functions. These in turn heavily impacted on our finances. It also constrained our development

initiatives. However, our congregations, when we were allowed to open our Gurdwara showed mature understanding and responsibility with regard to Covid-19 rules for places of worship. For example, practicing the requirements of individual prayer, hand washing, sanitising hands, wearing face covering, and maintaining social distancing. Our trustees marked specific sitting places and displayed various posters that gave unambiguous direction for entry and exit. All these were very helpful in keeping our people safe from Covid-19 illness in our Gurdwara.

Part 2: Meeting our charity's objectives within the constraints of Covid-19 Pandemic

We have given introductory talks on Sikhism and served prepacked langar, when possible, to be eaten in extensive grounds of our site. We have delivered cooked food to the elderly and homeless people. We have invited our MP, councillors, police, and people of other faiths and shared our values and how we worship. Music is integral part of Sikhism. Listening to kirtan/hymns is always soothing and for those who understand Punjabi, provide uplifting spirituality.

We have been able to celebrate a very limited number of major celebrations.

Commemoration period (December 20th to December 27th) of sacrifices made by our 10th Guru, Guru Gobind Singh Ji and his family including his 4 sons (*age 18,14,9,7 years, the first two in the battle and youngest two being buried alive in a wall for refusing to accept Islam*) for human rights, equality and respect for fellow human beings and against tyranny and injustice, provide moments for deep reflection on what Sikhs stand for. The aforesaid are among the eminent values that define Sikhs.

Classes for learning Punjabi language and religious music could not be continued due to covid-19

The Gurdwara facilitated last rites for a few non-Covid-19 related deaths as per covid-19 rules applicable at that time. We miss the departed souls who contributed so much to our organisation.

The concept of equality is a fundamental value of our faith right from its inception in the 15th Century and remains embedded in our practices in the running of our Gurdwara/Charity.

We continue to practise zero tolerance of the use of alcohol, tobacco and drugs and consumption of all non-veg foods such as meat and meat products, poultry, eggs and fish on our charity premises. We also promote healthy eating.

Development of library is in steady progress.
