Al-Noor Food Drive was successfully implemented in November 2020 and works with the council, CVA, other charities and FareShare. The Food Drive provides hot meals and food packs to the needy, including refugees, the homeless, the elderly, vulnerable, sick and less able-bodied people. The Food drive has been serving regularly every Thursday via its Food Drive Stall at the Norbury Park entrance and throughout the week to the needy by delivering food to temporary accommodations for the homeless and rough sleepers, refugees centres and elderly and disabled homes. As of March 2021 (in four months), The Food Drive has provided 1745 hot meals plus around 1725 meals in food packs to the needy.</b></p>
