Para 1.17 and 1.19	The Cherry Kids Club provides after school care for three of the local primary schools: Bewick Bridge, the spinney and Cherry Hinton CoE primary school. A walking bus is provided to safely transport the children to the main premises at Bewick Bridge. Our aim is to always ensure the care is of the highest standard possible with the lowest session cost to ensure that there is the broadest use of the club. At its heart, the club is a place for children to play, make friendships, have fun and to learn over and above the care required by parents and carers. Clubs are also provided at half-term for children who attend breakfast or after school care. These are structured around a theme and allow the children to attend one or multiple days.

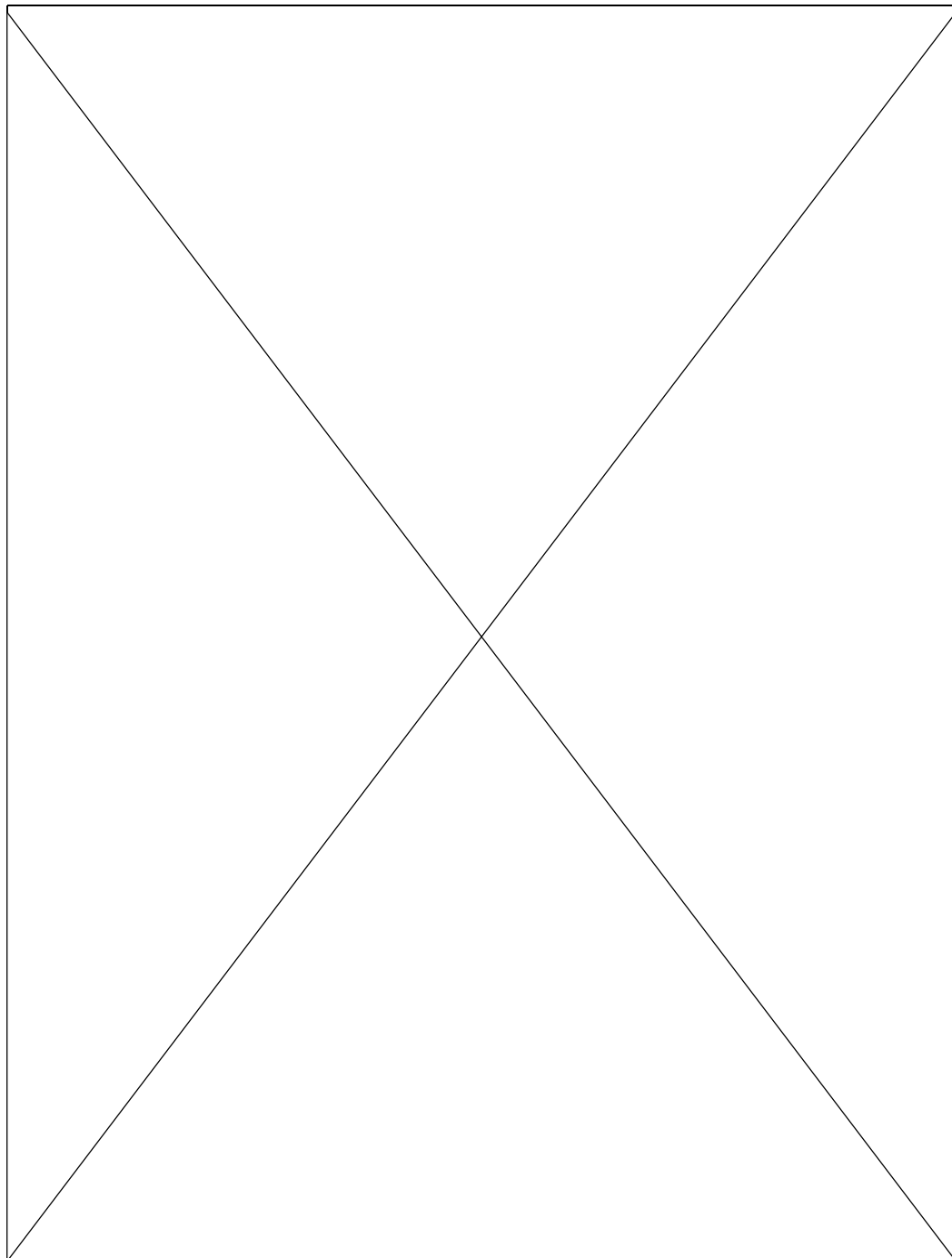
