Structure, governance and management

Kingsway Christian Fellowship was registered as a Charity with the Charities Commissioners on 26 June 1980 and its registration number is 1065048.

The Fellowship is domiciled at Kingsway Christian Centre, Church Road, Waterloo, Liverpool L22 5NA, which is the registered address. The Fellowship is a charitable trust - the governing document being the Trust Deed dated 26 June 1980, as amended by subsequent deeds. The current Trustees are Mrs. Rosemary Anne Ferns and Mr Peter Bentley who were appointed by the Elders.

The Trustees play an active and supportive role in ensuring the Church's expressed aims and objectives are advanced and properly resourced. Effective monitoring safeguards are in place to ensure the church finances are protected from fraudulent misuse and inappropriate allocation. A Safeguarding Policy is also in place and regularly reviewed in accordance with appropriate legislation. Procedures are in place to assist with safer recruitment; appropriate persons are appointed to deal with issues arising relating to allegations or concerns about behaviour toward children, young people or vulnerable adults. Appropriate and up to date safeguarding training is provided for those involved in ministry.

Objectives and activities

Advancement of Christian belief and knowledge, to make Jesus Christ known to every man, woman and child in the community, to build the Kingdom of God. All the Church's activities and effort are developed towards those ends and to provide a general benefit to the community by reaching out in love and generous giving.

Children's and Youth Ministries

Due to Covid-19 all of the groups were suspended in March 2020 as the number of people physically meeting in the centre was restricted, when further Government lock downs took place, our volunteers began to post weekly Children's Bible story videos on Kingsway's Facebook site every Sunday morning for the children to watch. We have also posted a weekly activity or challenge for the children to participate in. Twice weekly zoom calls were also arranged for the children to have a place and a time to interact with each other and group leaders, this was reduced to a Saturday morning Zoom call due to parents struggling with schoolwork at home and experiencing time pressures.

The older young people were advised to follow Government Covid-19 advice and remain in household and support bubble groups. A WhatsApp group was set up so that we can keep in regular contact with the members of the group. Periodic Zoom calls were also arranged and general discussions took place on the issues that young people face. This continued until September 2021 when the Government Covid restrictions were eased and Sunday morning classes were resumed. At this time the Saturday morning Zoom calls ended.

Kindlers (Pre-School children)

The Kindlers ministry operates each Sunday and provides a safe environment for pre-school children to learn about God through play, drama, craft, music and interactive storytelling. Parents are heavily involved in this group and enjoy fellowship with one another and develop friendships and wider support networks for their young families. We have had several new youngsters join in and some moving up to Kids church this year.

Kids Church (Reception to year 3)

Kids church is a ministry that operates each Sunday providing children of primary school age with a safe environment to play, create and learn about God. The sessions engage the children with craft, music, digital media, storytelling and high-energy games. The children develop strong social bonds with each other and really look forward to taking part in this group each week. We have had some new volunteers join the Kids church team this year.

Kids Church 2 (Year 4 to year 6)

Kids Church 2 operates each Sunday providing children with opportunities to learn about God. The sessions engage the children with craft, music, digital media, storytelling and high-energy games, which encourage them to develop friendships.

Adventurers Kids Club (Reception to year 6) - Term Time Kids Club

We took the difficult decision not to restart Adventurers following the Covid restrictions but are planning to recruit additional leaders and re-launch it in September 2022 when the intention is to run in the same manner as before. Adventure's will, as before, continue to draw in children from church and the community, helping them to engage with faith through Bible stories, group discussions and high-energy games, crafts, songs and dance. We are now into our fifth year of running a 'parents lounge' serving tea, coffee and refreshments and hold occasional craft evenings for the parents of the youngsters. Each week parents stay to catch up with each other and with staff whilst the club takes place.

Youth Church (Secondary school age children)

Youth church is held each Sunday for secondary school age young people. It helps them to develop both socially and spiritually. The topics taught and discussed are aimed specifically at issues that young people in the modern world face. The young people have also purchased Christmas gifts to give to single pensioners at Christmas and develop their own ministry to the younger children in Kids Church. Dave Courtney

Ministry to Marriage

The Ministry to Marriage supports married couples and families in the church and our community, together with those preparing for marriage.

The 'Marriage Sessions' course is for Couples who have been married for years or newlyweds. The course provides the opportunity to invest in and enrich their marriage relationship. The course provides a concise and comprehensive approach to four key factors in marriage:

Cherish- keeping love alive: Connect - all about communication: Collaborate - dealing with conflict: Commit - choosing to love when things get tough.

For those preparing for marriage we continue to use "The Marriage Preparation Course" produced by Alpha International which covers 7 key areas including:

- Building Strong Foundations
- The Art of Communication
- Resolving Conflict
- The Power of Forgiveness
- The Impact of Family - Past and Present
- Good Sex
- Love in Action

The course helps give the best possible start as couples begin married life together and can be delivered online using zoom and other platforms. We were therefore able to deliver the marriage preparation course whilst complying with covid restrictions that were in force.

Age Well

The Age Well Group, under normal circumstances, meets every Friday and was developed to enhance the well-being of its members through Fellowship, fun & mutual support...Spirit, Soul & Body.

The group consists of mature members from Kingsway who have a well of experience and wisdom which we tap into in order to look to the future with a positive and purposeful outlook.

We all face challenges, at every season of life, and hope to help and support each other on the journey - whether through bereavement, isolation, caring responsibilities, or chronic physical/mental health issues.

The Group has elements of a typical small group (with added extras!) We come together, with a cuppa, and as family, we move on to Bible study, worship, prayer, quizzes and games before ending each session with lunch. Due to the nature and format of the group; maintaining intimacy and trust; creating a Dementia Friendly environment.

"Even to your old age and grey hairs I am He who will sustain you. I have made you and I will carry you; I will sustain you and I will rescue you." Isaiah 46:4

Our aim is to continue to grow in the knowledge and love of God through sharing our lives and from a vital connection with Jesus and each other. Over the past year or so some of the members have

experienced health difficulties and bereavement that have been challenges to themselves and their families. We have supported each other with prayer and on-going 'connection'. The group continues to develop in our relationship with Jesus and each other and there is a growing confidence in our love for each other and our vital position in the Body of Christ. Covid-19 restrictions meant the group was unable to meet for much of the year. Group members have however kept in contact and were connected through care groups throughout the year.

Christians Against Poverty (CAP) Debt Services

Kingsway Christian Fellowship partnered with CAP and Northfield Church in Bootle to deliver free debt counselling services in the L21, L22, L23 postcode areas of Liverpool and further afield if required. The CAP Debt Centre was based at Northfield Church and we had a debt coach that is based at this church. Regrettably the debt centre closed in October 2021.

Normally clients would be seen in their own homes but due to the ongoing pandemic this was not possible which meant that debt coaches continued working from home providing a telephone-based debt counselling service. The decline in clients approaching CAP to ask for debt help continued throughout 2021 until the centre was closed.

In 2021 the debt coach had been in the current post for 8 years and had 1 client clearing their debts through a long-term repayment programme and 1 client who was being assisted through the insolvency process. There was also a client who was finding it difficult to get all the relevant paperwork together so that he could be advised of his best route out of debt. The debt coach stayed in post until January 2022 to assist with this.

When the debt centre closed the existing cases were passed over to CAP Head Office in Bradford to support the clients on their journey to becoming debt free.

Little Angels Toddler Group

The toddler group is a community group for any parent/carer regardless of their ethnicity or religion and their children aged 0 to 4 years. The group is staffed by volunteers both from the church and from the community.

At each session we have children attending with their parents, grandparents, or carers which provides for a good mix of ages and experience.

The children are able to play with a large range of toys and equipment and take part in a craft activity which they can then take home with them. During the session the children are provided with a snack and a drink which they have either sitting at the tables or in the highchairs. Sitting together and sharing helps with their social development. Towards the end of each session there is a song time with a mix of both secular and Christian children's action songs.

Once the pandemic restrictions eased, we were able to reopen in September 2021. We are open two mornings a week during term time only and average about 50 adults and 70 children each week. Since reopening we very quickly became oversubscribed and by the end of September 2021 it was necessary to put a waiting list in place.

Pastoral Visiting Team

The pastoral team visits those who are elderly, sick, isolated, or housebound ensuring they are included in the life of the Fellowship. The pastoral team continues to offer friendship, help with practical needs as well as mutual encouragement and spiritual growth.

The team has had to adapt to current circumstances and contact has been mainly by phone contact for much of the year.

The 65+ Group

The 65+ Group meetings were suspended in March 2020 due to the Covid pandemic but we were thrilled to be able to restart our meetings in September 2021. Approximately 18 to 25 of us meet on a monthly basis and every meeting is such a blessing. The main point of our gathering is to meet with God. We share what He is doing in our lives, pray for each other, praise and worship and listen to what the Lord would say to us. There is lots of laughter and needs are met in many different ways. Waterloo Station Team

On 24th November 2010 Kingsway adopted Waterloo Station, providing flower displays and maintaining these throughout the year. A team of volunteers continues to maintain the displays and pray for the safety and wellbeing of travellers who pass through this gateway and for station staff. From time to time there is opportunity to engage in conversation with travelling commuters as they comment on the displays. Volunteers have continued their tasks this year as when Covid Restrictions have allowed and have always done so in compliance with the regulations at the time. Wendy Wilcox

Make Lunch

Make Lunch was launched in the summer of 2021 and brings hope to struggling children from families in food poverty, providing a free hot and healthy meal along with friendship, fun and community during school holidays.

The Make Lunch team demonstrates God's love to all the children and families which come along.

A local supermarket donates the produce that's needed to make the meals and there are good links with schools and families services which provide referrals for families to come along.

The make lunch team meets and communicates regularly to plan, pray together and encourage one another, keeping in contact with families to show loving support, providing a much-needed lifeline and a demonstration of God's love.

Wider Involvement

Prayer

Prayer is at the heart of all that we do as a church. Regular prayer meetings take place on Sunday mornings and an evening meeting on the First Sunday in the month along with seasons of prayer and prayer times during small group meetings and various other activities during the week. Prayer powerfully impacts the life of the church and its mission.

Prayer focus has been on significant events over the year, including the Covid Pandemic, our Government and leaders, those working in front line services, those who are vulnerable or unwell as well as events worldwide and our local communities. We have continued to pray into the church vision to Reach our community with the 'Good News' of Jesus Christ, to see Broken lives restored and to see the body of Christ built up and Refreshed. We also pray for God to breakthrough in many ways such as in healings, relationships, family, employment, ministry and in many other areas.

For much of the year, prayer gatherings have taken place remotely. This has made it possible to have additional prayer meetings and involve some who, due to personal circumstances, would not have otherwise been able to attend. It has also made it possible to join national and international prayer initiatives such as the ICEJ "Rosh Chodesh" prayer initiative.

The WhatsApp prayer initiative now called the "Prayerforce" has continued to grow and the group has supported, in prayer, those in the church and many others known by church members as they recover from sickness, undergo medical treatment or have other prayer needs.

Together for the Harvest (TFH)

TFH is an association of churches working together to present the good news of Jesus Christ to every man, woman, and child in the Merseyside region. As an active member of TFH Kingsway shares its aim that by working together and mobilising Christians to action, a positive difference can be made in our communities bringing both spiritual and social transformation to our region. This aim is achieved through unity amongst leaders and churches in the region by prayer and mobilising Christians to express the love of God in both words and action. Kingsway continues to draw local leaders in the North Mersey Region together for Regional TFH prayer meetings as well as involvement in the wider initiatives across Merseyside.

Achievements and performance

Our vision for Kingsway continues to develop with a growing determination to model the love of Christ in and through the church. We long for every man, woman, and child to both hear and see in action the good news message of God's great love and mercy.

Our Small Groups are about a thriving community of Christians who love God, love one another and who reach out to others with the love of God. The groups help people to grow in the Christian faith as disciples of Jesus Christ. They are not run as a programme, therefore groups differ, however what is common to the groups is that they gather to share a bond of love for God and people.

The groups meet with purpose; to pray, to study the Bible and apply it to daily life, to develop friendship, to support one another in the ups and downs of life, eat together, provide opportunities for spiritual growth and for serving others both inside and outside the group. In Small Group people feel welcome and engaged in church, encouraging one another to be wholehearted disciples of Jesus.

The groups enabled the church to stay connected through the year despite the Covid-19 restrictions, and they began to gather in person again once lockdown restrictions were eased.

The church as a whole stepped up to the challenges of the last year with many acts of love and kindness being expressed. People provided spiritual and practical help to those who have needed it. Help with shopping, cooking, collecting medical prescriptions, lifts to hospital appointments as well as cards, phone calls and the like to help people through some difficult times.

The move from providing mainly digital content at the height of the pandemic moved to a hybrid of online and in person gatherings to enable as many people as possible to be involved, keeping people connected and supported.

The year saw the loss of some much-loved members of our church family, who will be greatly missed. Efforts have been made to express our love and truly honour their memory despite the restrictions. Books of memories have been compiled to help the bereaved celebrate the memory of their loved ones and where possible funerals have been live streamed to those unable to attend in person. We have been able to celebrate some weddings that were postponed from the previous year and have baptisms once again. Despite many disappointments, the church has pulled together to support and encourage one another and faith is high for what God is doing and will do in the future.

As a church we are blessed with people who have and continue to give generously of their time, demonstrate their love through acts of kindness, send cards, messages, gifts and keep in contact. We continue to value the need for a personal walk with God that bears fruit in family, workplaces, neighbourhoods, and the wider world. We have seen at Kingsway a community that cares for one another demonstrating God's love in word and deed and we see this continuing to grow in the coming year as we demonstrate the love of God in the wider community. We expect to have a greater impact in our community and in reaching out to those in most need. We will demonstrate and proclaim the love of God, seek to strengthen families, pray for renewed hearts and that we might be salt and light bringing positive transformation. We see that this can happen as people continue to pray and humble themselves before God, offering our lives to him in total surrender and using our given gifts and talents for the purpose God intended.

We will explore new ministry opportunities and develop existing ministries where appropriate, to help with the spiritual, practical, and emotional needs of those in our community.

Public benefit


Kingsway continues to provide voluntary services that make a considerable contribution to the community and a significant public benefit.

Notes to the Financial Statements

Year ended 31 December 2021

1. General information

The charity is a public benefit entity and a registered charity in England and Wales and is unincorporated. The address of the principal office is Kingsway Christian Centre, Church Road, Waterloo, Liverpool, L22 5NA.

2. Statement of compliance

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS 102, 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland', the Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (Charities SORP (FRS 102)) and the Charities Act 2011.

3. Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis, as modified by the revaluation of certain financial assets and liabilities and investment properties measured at fair value through income or expenditure.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the entity.

Going concern

There are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue.

Judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported. These estimates and judgements are continually reviewed and are based on experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees to further any of the charity's purposes.

Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the trustees for particular future project or commitment.

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure declared by the donor or through the terms of an appeal, and fall into one of two sub-classes: restricted income funds or endowment funds.

3. Accounting policies *(continued)*

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when entitlement has passed to the charity; it is probable that the economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the charity and the amount can be reliably measured. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

- income from donations or grants is recognised when there is evidence of entitlement to the gift, receipt is probable and its amount can be measured reliably.
- legacy income is recognised when receipt is probable and entitlement is established.
- income from donated goods is measured at the fair value of the goods unless this is impractical to measure reliably, in which case the value is derived from the cost to the donor or the estimated resale value. Donated facilities and services are recognised in the accounts when received if the value can be reliably measured. No amounts are included for the contribution of general volunteers.
- income from contracts for the supply of services is recognised with the delivery of the contracted service. This is classified as unrestricted funds unless there is a contractual requirement for it to be spent on a particular purpose and returned if unspent, in which case it may be regarded as restricted.

Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is classified under headings of the statement of financial activities to which it relates:

- expenditure on raising funds includes the costs of all fundraising activities, events, non-charitable trading activities, and the sale of donated goods.
- expenditure on charitable activities includes all costs incurred by a charity in undertaking activities that further its charitable aims for the benefit of its beneficiaries, including those support costs and costs relating to the governance of the charity apportioned to charitable activities.
- other expenditure includes all expenditure that is neither related to raising funds for the charity nor part of its expenditure on charitable activities.

All costs are allocated to expenditure categories reflecting the use of the resource. Direct costs attributable to a single activity are allocated directly to that activity. Shared costs are apportioned between the activities they contribute to on a reasonable, justifiable and consistent basis.

Tangible assets

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost or valuation of an asset, less its residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Property	- 2% reducing balance
Fixtures & Fittings	- 25% reducing balance
Equipment	- 25% reducing balance

Investments

Listed investments are measured at fair value with changes in fair value being recognised in profit or loss.

Impairment of fixed assets

A review for indicators of impairment is carried out at each reporting date, with the recoverable amount being estimated where such indicators exist. Where the carrying value exceeds the recoverable amount, the asset is impaired accordingly. Prior impairments are also reviewed for possible reversal at each reporting date.

Financial instruments

A financial asset or a financial liability is recognised only when the entity becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at the amount receivable or payable including any related transaction costs, unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where it is recognised at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest for a similar debt instrument.

Current assets and current liabilities are subsequently measured at the cash or other consideration expected to be paid or received and not discounted.

Where investments in shares or preference shares are publicly traded or their fair value can otherwise be measured reliably, the investment is subsequently measured at fair value with changes in fair value recognised in income and expenditure. All other such investments are subsequently measured at cost less impairment.

Defined contribution plans

Contributions to defined contribution plans are recognised as an expense in the period in which the related service is provided. Prepaid contributions are recognised as an asset to the extent that the prepayment will lead to a reduction in future payments or a cash refund.

When contributions are not expected to be settled wholly within 12 months of the end of the reporting date in which the employees render the related service, the liability is measured on a discounted present value basis. The unwinding of the discount is recognised as an expense in the period in which it arises.
