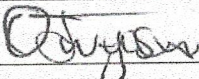

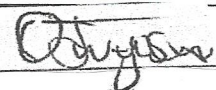

# INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF

## PEREZ CHAPLE INTERNATIONAL

I report on the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 December ,2021.

### **Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner**
