ANNUAL REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 JULY 2022

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 July 2022. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2016).

The Pre-School is governed by its Constitution, adopted 1 May 1997 and as amended on 10 December 2018, and the service agreement with the Social Services of Kent County Council, and is a registered charity, no 1067072. The Pre-School is based at "The Mobile", Eythorne and Elvington CP School, Adelaide Road, Eythorne, Dover, Kent.

Executive Committee

The Committee (trustees) have general powers of management over the affairs of the Pre-School and are responsible for ensuring the charity complies with its aims. The Committee is elected at the Annual General Meeting and consists of three officers and between two and nine members.

The objects of the Pre-School are to enhance the development and education of children primarily under statutory school age by encouraging parents to understand and provide for the needs of their children through community groups and by:

1. Offering appropriate play facilities and training courses, together with the right of parents to take responsibility for, and to become involved in the activities of such groups and ensuring that such groups offer opportunities for all children, regardless of race, culture, religion or means;
2. Encouraging the study of the needs of such children and their families and promoting public interest in, and recognition of, such needs in the local areas.

For the furtherance of these objects, the Pre-School shall:

1. Provide accommodation and equipment and engage staff.
2. Buy, lease, or take in exchange any property necessary for the achievement of the objects and maintain it and equip it for use.
3. Raise money to pay for the Pre-School's activities.
4. Make such payments as shall be necessary.
5. Fix and collect the fees payable in respect of children attending groups run by the pre-school.
6. Control the admission of children to the groups run by the Pre-School and if appropriate, require parents or guardians to withdraw them.
7. Take such other action as may benefit the Pre-School.
